

Each May we honor the memory of our dear friend, Steve Hoyland Sr. who was the founder of the Seabreeze News over 30 years ago. We remember his humor, jokes and his great big heart. Love him or hate him, he keep the tides rolling in San Leon. We hope you enjoy this edition with reprints of some of Steve's past stories to keep you amused and see the good he did for San Leon.





"Dear" Steve Hoyland Sr. was a legend in San Leon and for the most part Galveston County. He and a friend founded the Seabreeze News over 30 years ago. Although his humor could be seen as misogynistic by some, he loved to laugh and was a true friend to many.

Steve took on so much for the San Leon community. If there was something that needed to be done Dear Steve would take care of it. If one of his friends needed anything, he made sure they had it. He would often ask his friends or grandchildren, "Is there something I can do for you?" and he meant it with all his heart.

His "Dear Steve" monthly column could be a very tongue-in-cheek read, loved by many and hated by some. He was also creator of "The Black Ninja Dog" who was blamed for havoc all over San Leon.

His "Wife Training School" not only stirred the pot in San Leon, it got the attention of ABC 13 Eyewitness News in Houston, who interviewed him. His sign for a "Wife Training School Coming Soon" was seen on the side of the road and made international news as well as Facebook, Reddit, TikTok and YouTube just to name

Sanctuary City in Texas City??

On April 15, 2015 the Seabreeze News was invited to sit in on a meeting with five local businessmen at a restaurant in League City. There was a building contractor, a dirt, gravel and concrete company, an electrical contractor, a plumbing contractor and a representative from a law firm. The discussion was working with our government to build a facility to house 3,500 illegal immigrants.

The group came across some land that would be a good place to build the facility. They want to use 450 acres of the Attwater Prairie Chicken Reserve between Texas City and Dickinson Bayou on Highway 146. One of the builders said, "If they don't have those prairie chickens coming back by now they never will."

One of the first topics was how to house 3,500 illegals. The proposal from the builder at the table was to build two and three bedroom apartments and four- two story, one bedroom dormitory style buildings for single people. It was decided that they would need a big building with several classrooms in it to teach our illegal friends the English language. The classroom will have computers available with instructors to teach them how to use them. After one year of this classroom the children would attend school in the Texas City, La Marque and Dickinson school districts. Each school district will supply buses to transport these children back and forth to school. This will require that all the citizens of Texas City, La Marque and Dickinson pay an 18% increase in school taxes to accommodate our new friends.


On the property will also be a 20 acre park with four soccer fields, tennis courts, basketball courts, two softball fields, a three screen movie theater, a swimming pool and a pavilion so our new friends can have a place to relax and recreate. Exercise is very important so there will also be a gym and a walking/ running track.

Every illegal, 15 years and older, will receive a new smart phone with unlimited usage. There will be a free dental clinic at the facility for all illegals. There will be a nursery where the illegal mother can drop their small children off from 7am to 5pm with free care nurses paid for by the government.

Each adult will receive \$2,000. in social security each month for five years until they get on their feet. Each illegal adult will receive \$600.00 in food stamps plus \$150.00 in food stamps per child.


Each illegal, 17 years or above, will be taught how to drive and will receive a Texas State Drivers License. The government will then issue, to everyone who passes their driving test, an interest free loan

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

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These new illegal brothers and sisters of ours will need free medical care. Since it is fairly close to the VA clinic in Texas City we will now have the VA clinic give two days a week, Monday and Tuesday, to the care and welfare of our illegal friends. Each week there will be a shuttle bus going every hour on the hour to the VA clinic on Monday and Tuesday from 7:30am to 5:30pm. The veterans will no longer be able to use the clinic on Mondays and Tuesdays. They will have to schedule their clinic visitations on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. For more serious medical attention requiring hospitalization or surgery the illegal will have free hospitalization at the La Marque hospital on HWY 3. All of our Texas guests will be issued a medical card with guaranteed free medical care for our new friends.

Now friends and neighbors this is not going to be free. It is proposed that these facilities are to be paid for by our federal government but, to maintain these facilities, it will cost the Galveston County residents an increase in taxes across the board of 8%. These five gentlemen will be working out all the details to propose to our Texas State Governor, Gregg Abbott, and our Texas Senators and Congressmen. They want to have this completed and ready to present in June of next

It did not take me long to figure out that these five gentlemen were not just doing this to help our illegal friends. They are wanting to and planning on, getting all the contracts for these housing facilities.

for a new or used car so our illegal friends can get I told them that there were millions and millions of dollars on the table to build this housing community and in building it you should all become millionaires. The plumbing contractor told me that somebody is going to get this money why not us. I don't think these fellows are going to vote for Bernie Sanders. Remember folks, this has not happened or been approved. It is in the early stages of development. According to these five conducting the meeting they said it would be very important that Galveston County welcome these illegal people with open arms. At this time these five wish to be anonymous.

RESPONSE:

The administrators representing the Bureau of the Federal Wildlife Reserve Department in Washington made a statement saying they have denied giving up any of its land to this private project period. This land will remain the Attwater Prairie Chicken Reserve from now on. The owner of the private property on the same block of land has said that his land is not for sale and will not be sold. The veterans of Galveston County wrote letters and emails to State Representatives, State Congressmen and State Senators. All of our politicians have said no to this private project. The Governor said that no one is going to use or in any way interfere with the VA clinic in Texas City. At this time, those five businessmen from League City received so much opposition that they currently have abandoned this Sanctuary City idea. Thanks to all of you many hundreds of people who wrote and complained, this project has been canceled.

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

A FISHING TALE RETOLD BY STEVE HOYLAND

I stopped in Gilhooley's three weeks ago with my buddy, Lonnie to grab a sandwich. About one o'clock that afternoon two of my buddies came in after their morning fishing trip. They had a story to tell me. They ordered a beer and started talking. Now before I start telling this story I want y'all to know that they are telling me this story after ordering their first beer, not their tenth.

They had pulled their boat through the south jetty boat cut and got out and started wading the Bolivar Pocket. While they were slowly working the guts in the pocket they noticed two young men, around 18-19 years old wading from the beach toward them throwing topwater baits. My two buddies had caught four trout and they noticed these young men getting closer to them



had each picked up a trout. Both sets of fishermen were also catching small sharks. One of the two young men caught a shark close to three feet long and his fishing partner went over to help him with it.

These two young men were about fifty yards away when one of them just went down. Then the other one went down in the water and my buddies could tell there was a problem. They reeled up and headed over to the young men.

What had happened was while the man was getting the shark off of his lure, the other young man helping him accidentally hooked him in the back of the neck with his top water bait and it was buried pretty deep. When the young man realized he was hooked in the neck he passed out and went down like a ton of bricks. His buddy jumped down into the water to hold his head up. When my buddies got there he was back semi conscious but couldn't seem to stand on his own. They helped him get back up and were looking at the damage from that number 4 treble hook. They offered to help them cut it out. When they said "cut it out" the man who was hooked passed out again and down in the water he went. His buddy went down in the water to hold

his head up again and that is when they noticed that the line had not been cut from the topwater bait in his neck and it was stretched tight digging that bait in deeper.

One of my buddies took his knife and cut the line off breaking the tension on the lure. They messed around with that young man several minutes while he was coming to and they helped him stand up again. They told him he had two

choices, they could try to get it out or he could wade in to the beach and ride the ferry across to the hospital. He ask "How deep is it?" then he reached up to feel how deep it was in his neck. When he felt the lure in his neck he passed out again this time hanging his left index finger into another hook. Now he's hooked in the neck and the hand.

While he was unconscious his buddy said he just didn't know what to do. My buddy said he looked at the finger and said it wasn't that bad. He told the young man to stop trying to wake his buddy up and just hold his head there. While he

was still mostly unconscious my buddy made a small cut and got the hook out of his finger but it was bleeding pretty good. Then he then took his pliers and cut the lure off of the buried hook. They kind of revived the young man and got him stood up. They walked along with him the three hundred yards or so to get him back to the beach. My buddies said that he kept wanting to wobble out and go down but they held on to him and got him to the sand. The two young men took off to get to their truck and take the ferry ride over to a doctor. By then the tide had quit and my padners climbed back into their boat and headed back to San Leon.

They both said that they did not want their names used in the paper in case that young man's finger got infected or something. They didn't want him to come back on them since they hadn't asked him if they could cut his finger, they just did it. They said they had never seen anything like that in their life. They said he kept going down like a deer shot in the head. One of them old codger's said "I guess sometimes fishing can be a dangerous sport."

What is a house shut off valve?

A house shut off valve (pictured below) is a valve that's typically found on the side of your home where the water line comes in. While not all homes have a house shut off valve, it's a very important valve if you do have one: if closed, this valve will turn off all water service to the home! While this is handy to take care of any repairs you may need to address inside the home, during the summertime many people accidentally turn the house shut off valve when trying to turn off hoses or sprinklers. If you're experiencing a loss of service, always be sure to check your house shut off valve because it might be the culprit!

The Sisters Helping Sisters fishing tournament can attest to that. The rest of the fund raiser was carried out with great success. **Great job Jaton!**


When the wind allows, the fishing out of San Leon has been very good. It's spring and we have some high tides that muddy the water, it gets better as we move into summer.



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

"Dear Steve's" War on Drugs

The War on Drugs kickoff meeting was a good start. On During our War on Drugs meeting Galveston Tuesday, May 22, 2018, the community of San Leon held a meeting declaring a War on Drugs. Meeting attendance was counted at 208. A big thank you to those of you who came out! Both the community and our elected officials are ready to get to work. There is strength in numbers folks. Standing together this community will win the war. Don't fret if you missed the meeting there

During this meeting we discussed all of the drug problems in our the area including: increased traffic at night in certain neighborhoods, drug houses, abandoned houses serving as shelters for drug heads, and mainly theft, theft, and more theft.

Residents volunteered to form the "San Leon War on Drugs" action committee. Once I have the Seabreeze News published this week, during the week of June 11th, I will be contacting the volunteers to schedule the first meeting. When a chair person is appointed and committee membership is finalized they will hit the ground running. The committee will schedule an appointment to meet with the Galveston County District Attorney, Jack Roady, and the magistrates to continue the discussion I had with the D.A. recently about raising the bail on repeat offenders to keep these meth head thieves in jail longer.

The Galveston County Sheriff's Office (GCSO) is arresting these people and putting them in jail on a regular basis. They are part of the solution. It is the process after the arrest that poses the problem. The county needs to change the way it conducts its business after the offender is arrested. Hopefully, with our meeting with the district attorney and magistrates, we can make some small changes that will put these people in jail for 30 days or so.

If I was a cop it would be extremely disheartened to arrest someone for drugs, haul his ass down to Galveston, spend hours on paperwork, then go to work the next day and see that meth head back walking down the street. Most times they are already out before the ink on their paperwork is dry.

The San Leon War on Drugs committee will maintain a private Facebook page that will show a mugshot and arrest record of every person in San Leon arrested for drugs or theft. This will be in alphabetical order according to their last name. This page will be available to all of the trailer park managers and other rental property landlords to use to see if the person wanting to rent the property has recently been arrested. If so, they can deny the rental application.

By eliminating these criminals a place to rent, hopefully, they will move on to other areas. We will also be coming up with a way to centrally report illegal activity so we can get this criminal behavior reported to the GCSO.

County Sheriff, Henry Trochesset, mentioned that the jail is full and an increase over capacity would be frowned upon by the American Civil Liberty Union (ACLU). I say it can hold a lot more by putting in cots or air mattresses for the inmates to sleep on. That's better than where they sleep now, most times with no electricity and/or water. I say "to hell with the ACLU". Our county judicial system needs to fight them.

If the ACLU brings a law suit against the county it would take several years for it to play out in court, if we fight it. In those several years, while that court battle goes on, we could take our community back from these druggies and thieves. Listen friends and neighbors, all we have to do is work

There are people in this country that have stood up to the ACLU. Sherriff Joe Arpaio of Maricopa County in Arizona didn't have a big enough jail. So he started a tent city jail. Arpaio fought the civil rights activists and the ACLU for years; sometimes having to give in a little, sometimes not.

I'm sure you've heard Arpaio's story. By reducing inmates meals to two meals a day and having his inmates work 7 hours a day on a chain gang he got their attention. Later, he had women and juveniles on chain gangs dressed in pink underwear and coveralls. Every inmate that was interviewed they all said the same thing," We ain't coming back to this place again and we sure ain't hanging around this county no more".

Now, we aren't asking the sheriffs office or our political leaders to go anywhere near this far. But, to have a few extra prisoners lay on an air mattress is not asking too much. We just need the people that are being arrested over and over again to have a higher bond to get out of jail. If the bond is high enough they will have to sit it out for several weeks. Then maybe when they completely sober up they might decide to do something completely different with their lives. You simply cannot make a rational decision if you are continually high on

We will need the help of the district attorney, the magistrates, the judges, the GCSO and residents to make all this work. Please continue to stand with us.

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
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
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
