YOU READY TO RUMBLE?



here is a lot of planning when it comes to evacuating. Where will you go? What do you need to take? Where will you sleep? Will they allow pets? When can you go home?

Watch your local news. When you see a hurricane completely covering the Gulf of Mexico, that is your cue....you need to leave and leave early. I promise you, if the hurricane covers the Gulf of Mexico it will not dissipate.

Have a full tank of gas. Make sure you keep a full tank of gas at all times during hurricane season, you never know when something will blow up in the gulf.

Where will you go? Know where you are going. If you have a family member who is out of the hurricanes path that is your best bet. If you think that that quaint little hotel just north of Livingston would be a great place, well think again! If the hurricane travels up I-45 you will still be in the path, and the hotel rooms were probably booked days ago. Whatever you do, don't go east! Hurricanes are very unpredictable. It might be heading to Galveston and at the last minute turn and go toward Lousianna.

What will you need to pack? You will need to take all your important papers: Birth Certificates, insurance papers (health and home,) you will also need food and plenty of water for you, your family and pets. Take plenty of Pet food, because there probably won't be any stores open. If you have kids, take some games like Checkers and Connect Four, because you may not have a way to charge the electronic games they will be dead before no time.

Where will you sleep? There is a good chance you might sleep in your car for a few hours. So pack your patience and your pillows. There was an evacuation years ago and it took people 18 hours to get from San Leon to Livingston.

If you get lucky and find a motel, pretend like you won the lotto, remember there are thousands of people doing the exact same thing you are. Be Kind! If you are staying with family or friends, don't go there and sit around saying "poor me", there is

nothing you can do about your situation at the moment. What you can do is offer to go grocery shopping and by all means, help around the house. Do the dishes, sweep, cook and just help.

What about the fur babies? You have already packed plenty of food and water for them so they should be good in that area. Remember your pets are also displaced and they have no idea what is going on. Be patient with them. Don't take your stress out on them, they are just along for the ride in unfamiliar settings. If you go to the family or friends house and they have pets, remember that is those other pets territory. Separate the pets so yours can calm down and the other pets can smell that they have visitors.

When can you go home? Watch the news, and call neighbors. If your area was not hit hard, you may be able to get on the road that day. If your area took a direct hit you need to get in touch with your County to see if they are allowing people back in the area. It may take a few more days to be able to get to your house.

What will you find at home? If you did take a direct hit, see if you can leave your pets with those other pets if they get along fine, until you find out the status of your house. (Because, if you did get off your ass and cook, clean and help your hosts out around the house, they shouldn't have a problem with it.)

Make sure you have a fully charged cell phone and a car charger, because you will be on hold for hours with your insurance company. If you can go in your home be very vigilant, some critters may have taken up residency there while you were gone.

Take Photos -take plenty of photos of the structure, inside contents, the waterline, roof, trees, and all damage. This will come in handy for insurance.

Remember folks, watch the news. They will probably make it seem worse than what it is, but we have grown to expect that.







PRESS RELEASE

On December 27, 1999, Jo Ann Sendejas - 40, was reported as a missing person by her sister to the Galveston County Sheriff's Office. She was reportedly last seen on December 24, 1999, at approximately 3:30 AM.

In the early evening of Christmas Eve, Jo Ann Sendejas and other individuals were at the residence of her brother, where she was involved in a family dispute. At approximately 3:00 AM, her brother and a teenager took Jo Ann Sendejas to her residence located in San Leon, where her boyfriend was present.

The following day on Christmas, her family members attempted to locate her to no avail. The boyfriend indicated that he and Jo Ann Sendejas had also gotten into a domestic argument, and she allegedly left the residence walking.

During the initial investigation, Deputies received information from several individuals stating on Christmas morning; they saw a person on a bicycle pulling a wagon with what appeared to have a body wrapped in carpet or a blanket. The sighting was in the area of the victim's residence. Deputies checked the site but could not locate a person on a bicycle pulling a wagon. Investigators later confirmed this information and developed a possible identification of the person.

Additional information developed in the investigation led investigators to a gravesite at a cemetery in San Leon. It was alleged that Jo Ann Sendejas was buried in a fresh gravesite dug in November 1999. In 2019 a search of this gravesite via a Court Order revealed that the grave was believed to have been disturbed. However, the remains of Sendejas were not found.

This case is currently a very active investigation, and investigators believe that someone in the area may have vital information that could greatly assist investigators in this case. The case is being handled as a homicide until proven otherwise.

Anyone with information is urged to call and provide anonymous tips through Galveston County Crime Stoppers at www.galvestoncrimestoppers.com or their hotline 409-763-8477. A crime stoppers reward of up to \$5,000 is offered for tips leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) involved. 

Those that can handle the heat are catching fish, some specs, sheephead and legal drum. You need to be on the water early as it gets hot later in the day and the bite seems to stop.


Most of the fish are caught out around the channel and some around the old oil wells, such as the Exxon A oil field.

with your pets in mind:

Make a Plan

If you have a plan in place for you and your pets, you will likely encounter less difficulty, stress and worry when you need to make a decision during an emergency. If local officials ask you to evacuate, that means your pet should evacuate too. If you leave your pets behind, they may end up lost, injured or worse.

Things to include in your plan:

Have an evacuation plan for your pet. Many public shelters and hotels do not allow pets. Know a safe place where you can take your pets before disasters and emergencies happen.

Develop a buddy system: Plan with neighbors, friends or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are unable.

Have your pet micro chipped. Make sure to keep your address and phone number up-to-date on their chip and include contact information for an emergency contact outside of your immediate area.

Contact your local emergency management office, animal shelter or animal control office to get additional advice and information if you're unsure how to care for your pet in case of an emergency.

Build a Kit for Your Pet

Just as you do with your family's emergency supply kit, think first about the basics for survival, such as food and water. Have two kits, one larger kit if you are sheltering in place and one lightweight version for if you need to evacuate. Review your kits regularly to ensure that their contents especially medicines.



Animal Emergency Kit:

Food: Keep several days' supply of food in an airtight, waterproof container.

Water: Store a water bowl and several days' supply of water.

Medicine: Keep an extra supply of the medicine your pet takes on a regular basis in a waterproof container.

First aid kit: Talk to your veterinarian about most appropriate items for your pet's emergency medical needs.

Collar with ID tag and a harness or leash: Include a backup leash, collar and ID tag. Have copies of your pet's registration information and other relevant documents in a waterproof container and available electronically.

Traveling: bag, crate or sturdy carrier, ideally one for each pet.

Grooming items: Pet shampoo, conditioner and other items, in case your pet needs cleaning up.

Sanitation needs: Pet litter and litter box if needed, newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and

household chlorine bleach to provide for your pet's sanitation needs.

A picture of you and your pet together: If you become separated, a photo of you and your pet together will help to document ownership and allow others to help find your pet.

Familiar items: Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit. Familiar items can help reduce stress for your pet.

Tips for Large Animals


If you have pets such as horses, goats or pigs on your property, be sure to prepare before a disaster.

Ensure all animals have some form of identification. Evacuate animals earlier, whenever possible. Map out primary and secondary routes in advance.

Make available vehicles and trailers needed for transporting and supporting each type of animal. Also make available experienced handlers and drivers.

Ensure destinations have food, water, veterinary care and handling equipment.


If evacuation is not possible, animal owners must decide whether to move large animals to a barn or turn them loose outside.
