ONCE AGAIN, BOLIVAR GOES WITHOUT POWER!

In February 2021, basically the whole Great State of Texas lost power due to the wonderful power grid that we have. When the whole state has no power, a person says well... it is what it is. The power went off in The Bolivar Flats on Thursday, December 22nd at 9:45 pm and stayed off until Christmas day at noon, with the exception of three hours on Christmas Eve. It is rare for Southeast Texas to have a freeze that lasts for days, but the last two years we did and The Bolivar Peninsula lost power for days. The Peninsula has lost power for days at a time at least four times in the last four years. No power means no heat. There was an elderly that went to the hospital by ambulance twice in within a two-day period (probably to warm up).

The Seabreeze News reached out to Senator-Elect Mayes Middleton and he provided the following statement:

“It was unacceptable what happened. Entergy has agreed to increase load capacity on Bolivar including an already installed temporary transformer and has designed permanent improvements — a looped system for the peninsula to increase system and substation load capacity, and allow power to be restored much more quickly. They just installed pad mount transformer to handle more load for Bolivar.”

As we slide into 2023, The Seabreeze News hopes all our readers have a prosperous year

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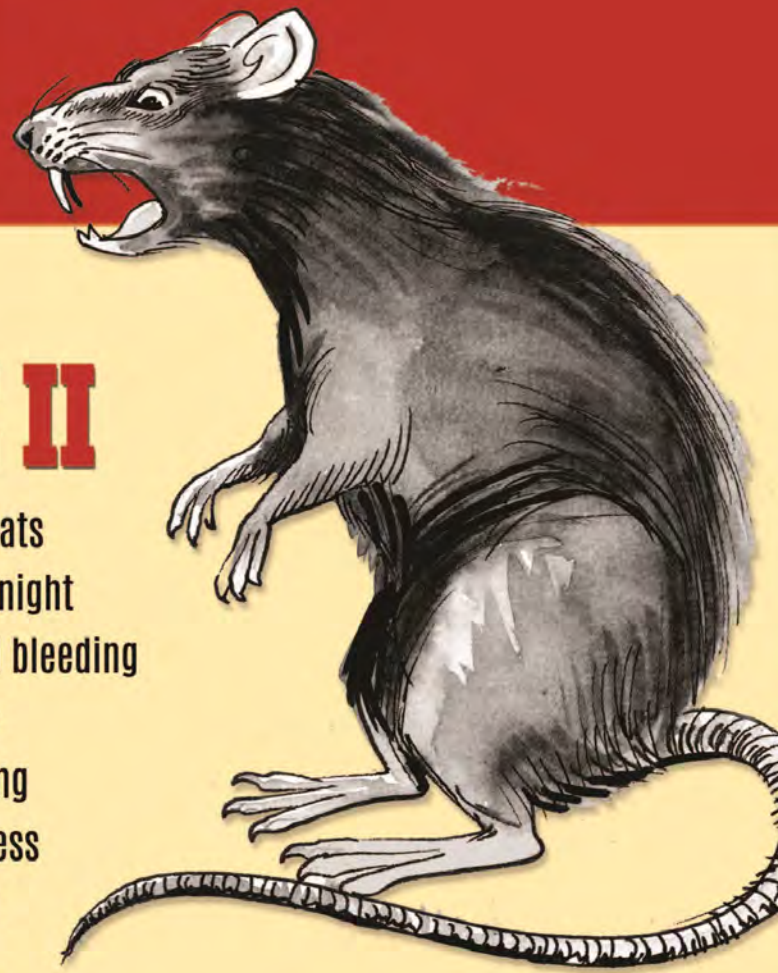

What is a sewer cleanout?

A sewer cleanout is a PVC pipe and cap, typically 4" in diameter, that intersects with the sewer line that runs from your home to the District's main lines. It provides an access point for plumbers to diagnose and repair backups in the line that connects to the District's main line. It should be kept closed to function properly, as being left open will result in rain water getting into the District's collection system and inundating the wastewater treatment plant with unnecessary flow. If you have any questions about the location of your cleanout or how to replace a damaged cap, just call the office!
