FROM SENATOR MAYES MIDDLETON

Senate Bill 763

The bill to allow chaplains in our public schools is headed to the Governor's desk to be signed into law. I'm proud to have authored this legislation to expand religious liberties in our schools. Chaplains represent God in government and are already extremely successful in helping our first responders, military, providing support in hospitals, and counseling in our prison systems. I believe that chaplains will greatly benefit our school students, teachers, and other school district staff.



Senate Bill 435

I passed Senate Bill 435 to allow the victims' families of the tragic May 18, 2018 mass murder at Santa Fe High School to view certain evidence about their loved ones. This evidence has been withheld from the families for the last 5 years, and they have had to live not knowing what happened to their loved ones. This bill will hopefully provide a small amount of relief and help the families grieve the loss they've experienced.

IT'S HURRICANE SEASON: ARE YOU READY??

We have entered the hurricane season. Every day till December 1st, you'll turn on the TV to see a weather person pointing to some radar blob out in the Gulf of Mexico and making two basic meteorological points:

- (1) There is no need to panic;
- (2) We could all be killed.

Yes, hurricane season is an exciting time to be in Texas. If you're new to the area, you're probably wondering what you need to do to be prepared for the possibility that we'll get hit by 'the big one.' Based upon our experience, we recommend that you follow this simple 3-step hurricane preparedness plan:

STEP 1: Buy enough food and bottled water to last your family for at least 3 days.

STEP 2: Put these supplies into your car.

STEP 3: Drive to Nebraska and remain there until Halloween.



Unfortunately, the statistics show that most people will not follow this sensible plan. Most people will foolishly stay here in Texas. We'll start with one of the most important hurricane preparedness items:

HOMEOWNERS' INSURANCE: If you own a home, you must have hurricane insurance. Fortunately, this insurance is cheap and easy to get, as long as your home meets 2 basic requirements:

- (1) It is reasonably well-built, and
- (2) It is located in Nebraska.

Unfortunately, if your home is located in, or any other area that might actually be hit by a hurricane, most insurance companies would prefer not to sell you hurricane insurance because then they might be required to pay YOU money, and that is certainly not why they got into the insurance business in the first place. So you'll have to scrounge around for an insurance company that will charge you an annual premium roughly equal to the replacement value of your house. At any moment, this company can drop you like used dental floss. Since Hurricane Ike, most Texans have had an estimated 27 different home-insurance companies. This week I'm covered by the Bob and Big Stan Insurance Company under a policy which states that, in addition to my premium, Bob and Big Stan are entitled, on demand, to my kidneys.

SHUTTERS: Your house should have hurricane shutters on all the windows, all the doors and, if it's a major hurricane, all the toilets. There are several types of shutters, with advantages and disadvantages: Plywood shutters: The advantage is that, because you make them yourself, they're cheap. The disadvantage is that, because you make them yourself, they will fall off.

Sheet-metal shutters: The advantage is that these work well once you get them all up. The disadvantage is that once you get them all up, your hands will be useless bleeding stumps ... and it will be December.

Roll-down shutters: The advantages are that they're very easy to use and will definitely protect your house. The disadvantage is that you will have to sell your house to pay for them.

Hurricane-proof windows: These are the newest wrinkle in hurricane protection: They look like ordinary windows, but they can withstand hurricane winds. You can be sure of this, because the salesman says so. He lives in Nebraska.

EVACUATION ROUTE:

If you live in a low-lying area, you should have an evacuation route planned out. To determine whether you live in a low-lying area, look at your driver license. If it reads 'Texas,' you live in a low-lying area. The purpose of having an evacuation route is to avoid being trapped in your home when a major storm hits. Instead, you will be trapped in a gigantic traffic jam several miles from your home, along with 200,000 other evacuees. So, as a bonus, you will not be lonely.

HURRICANE SUPPLIES: If you don't evacuate, you will need a mess of supplies. Do not buy them now! Good luck! And remember ... It's great living in Paradise. Hurricane season will be over December 1st.

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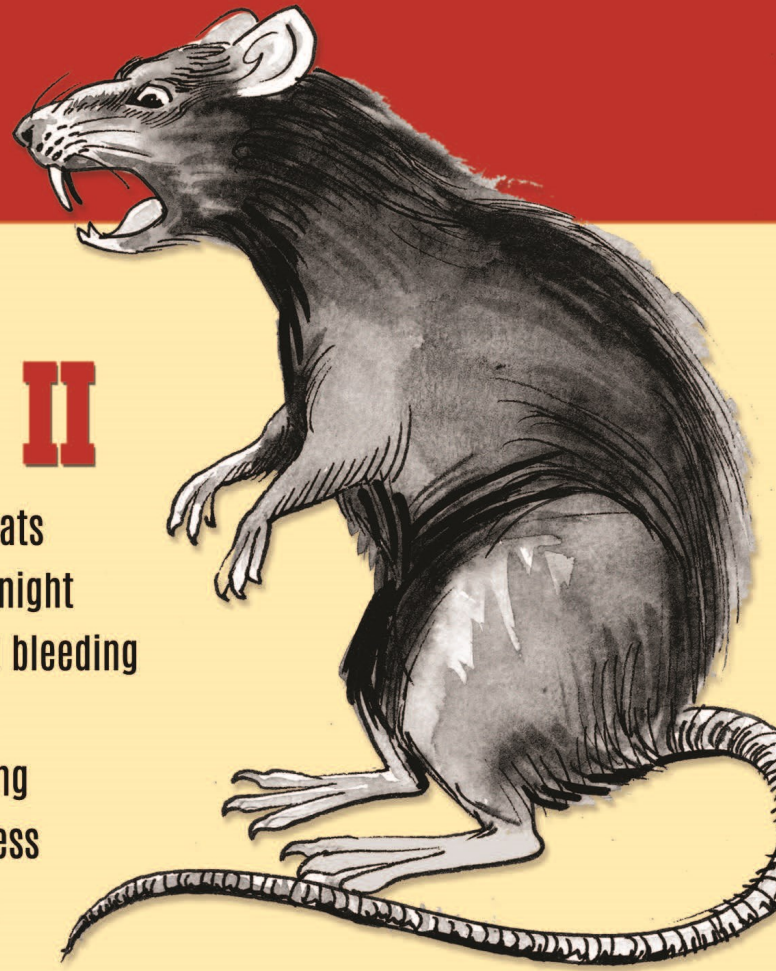

This is June and summer fishing season is here. The weather has been good lately. The reports I've been getting says fishing is really good around San Leon and East Bay in shallow water and the Gulf of Mexico with top water lures like She dog lures. Mostly trout are being caught with some sheep head, drum and a few gafftop catfish.

I like the jetties in June for speckled trout especially through the boat cut on the left. Be careful as it's shallow and a good place to wade fish. It's going to be hot so stay hydrated. Drink plenty of water or sports drinks. It's flesh eating bacteria season, known as vibrio in our area. It's wise to have bleach and water should you get a cut that needs flushing out. Keep all of your fishing gear in good condition and take a kid fishing with you next time you go.

Hurricane Season

Brush Bundling & Debris Removal

With hurricane season here, be sure to clean up your property, removing any debris that may block drainage or become projectiles in the event of high winds. While Galveston County is not responsible for picking up brush or debris, Texas Pride will pick up brush that's placed in clear, individual piles measuring no larger than 3' x 3' x 3' or tied and bundled and under 50 pounds.

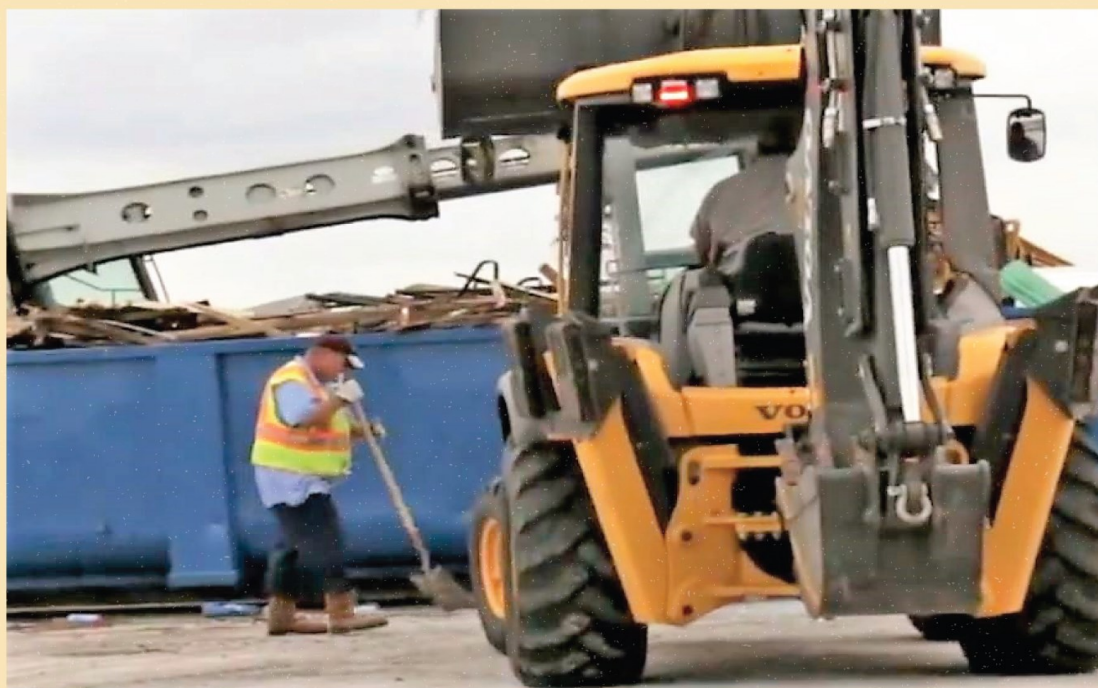

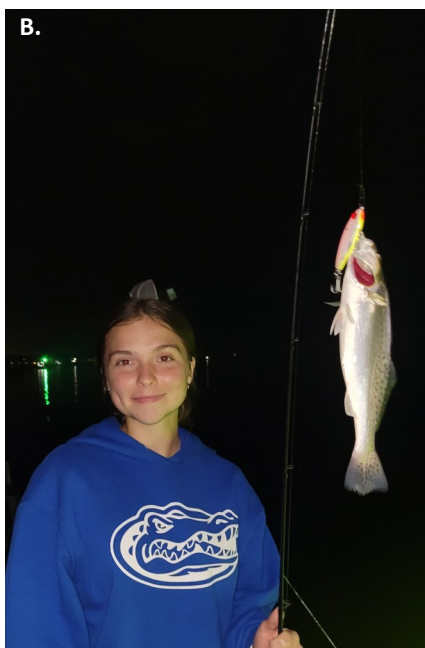

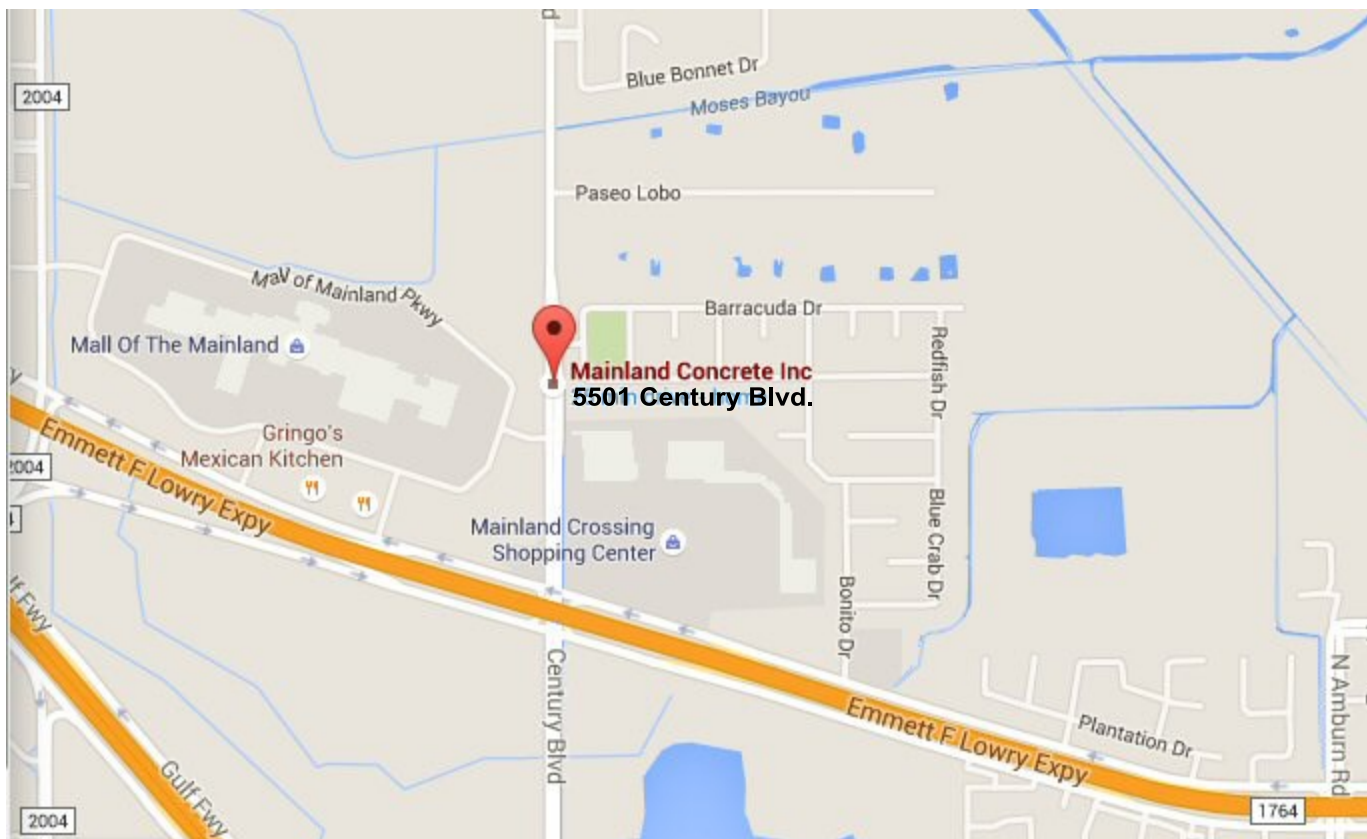

5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT HURRICANE HAZARD RISKS



- 1** Storm surge is water pushed onshore by the tropical system. It causes the most damage of any of the hurricane hazards. 
- 2** Wind from a hurricane can top 200 mph and cause massive damage to buildings in its path. 
- 3** Inland flooding caused by heavy rain damages homes and can wash out roadways well away from the coast. 
- 4** Tornadoes are common as a hurricane moves ashore. They are not typically long-lived, but they can cause plenty of damage. 
- 5** Rip currents and rough seas are common both before and after a hurricane, making swimming or surfing very dangerous.

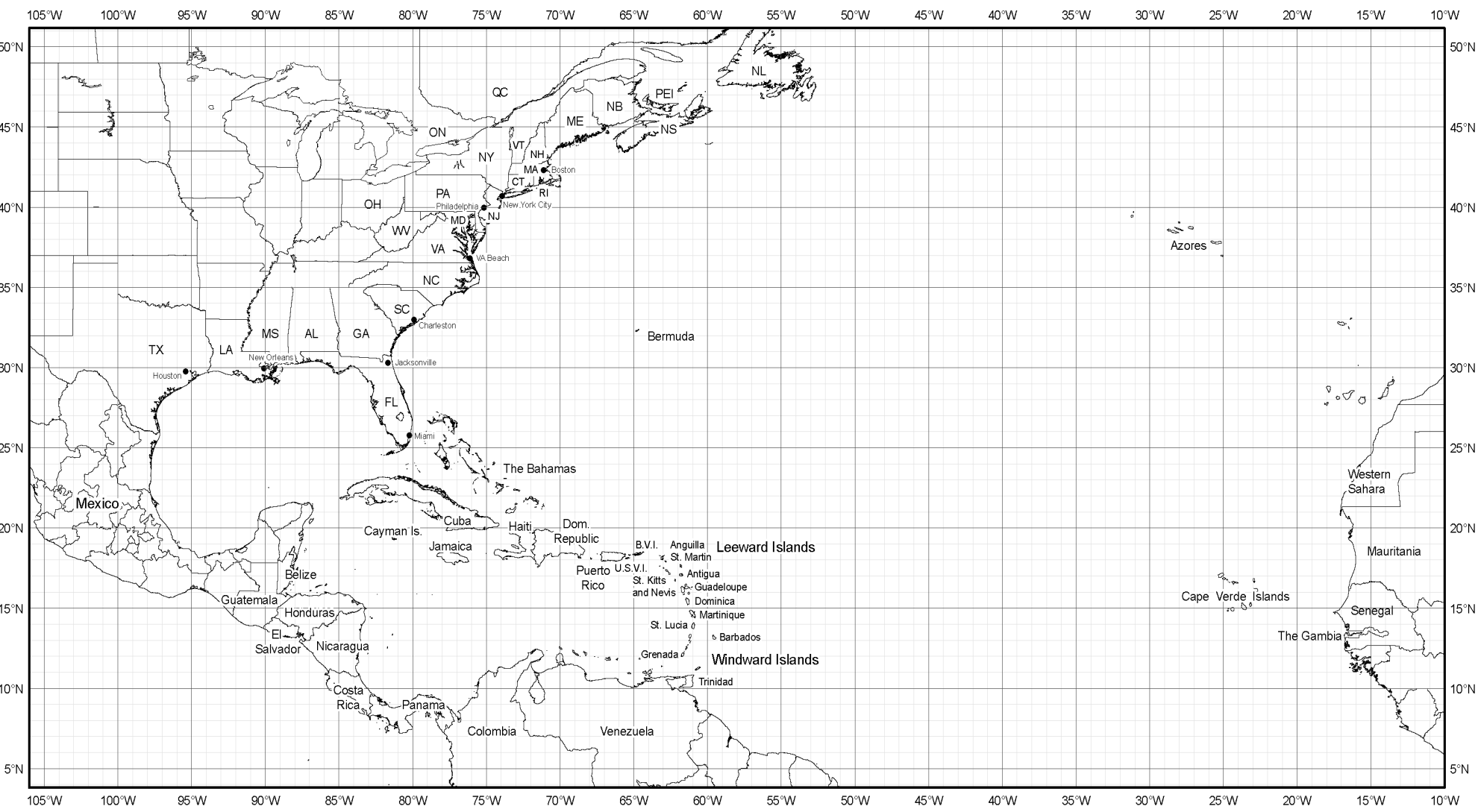
- 1** Find out if you would need to evacuate. Don't travel hundreds of miles, only far enough away from the evacuation area.
