Senator Middleton Files Bills to Hold Drunk Drivers Accountable

The Galveston community has been devastated multiple times in the last year by drivers under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

We have come together as a community, but we need more accountability and stricter laws that will hold repeated drunk drivers accountable for their actions. We owe that to Sam Mixon and Mason Nelson, who were tragically killed in front of Ball High, and all other victims of drunk driving and families who have suffered injury and loss. I have filed three bills to bring accountability to repeated DUI offenders and to help ensure these tragedies do not re-occur.

Senate Bill 324 would require that, after a 2nd DUI offense, a repeated DUI driver must serve at least half of their jail sentence or a minimum of 2 years.

Senate Bill 1067 would require enhanced parole board oversight when considering parole for an offender. This includes increased notice requirements in the community for parole hearings, mandating they review social media when making decisions on parole, and also requiring the parole board to consider public school disciplinary records of the potential parolee.

Senate Bill 1310 would enhance the criminal penalty for defeating an interlock device and then causing a death from driving under the influence to a 1st degree felony without parole.

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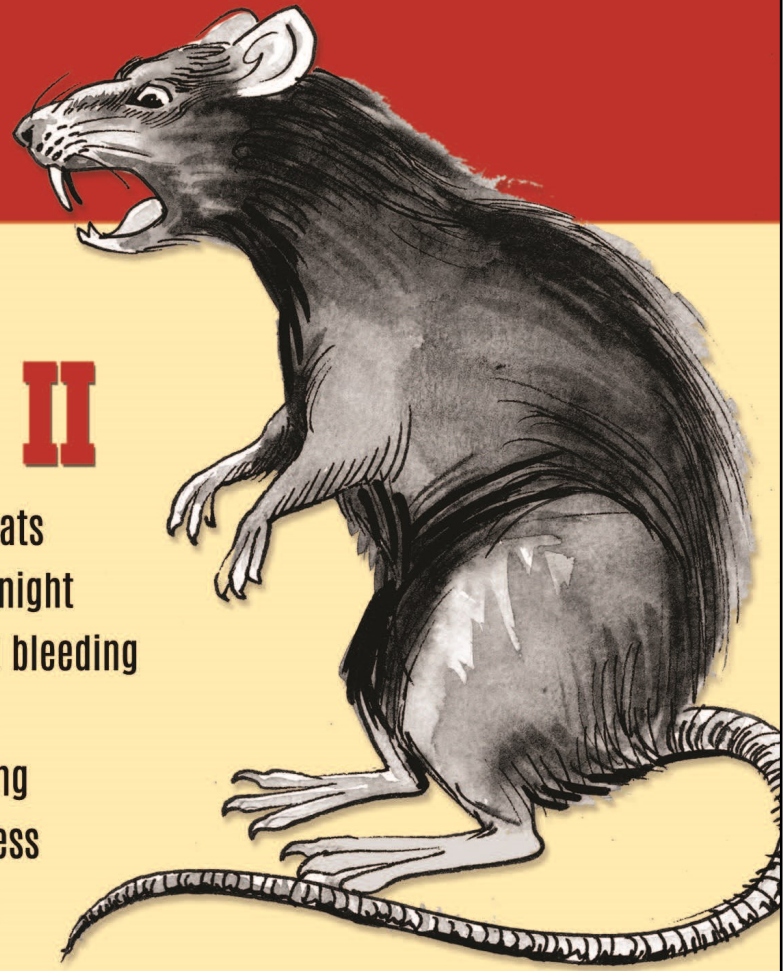

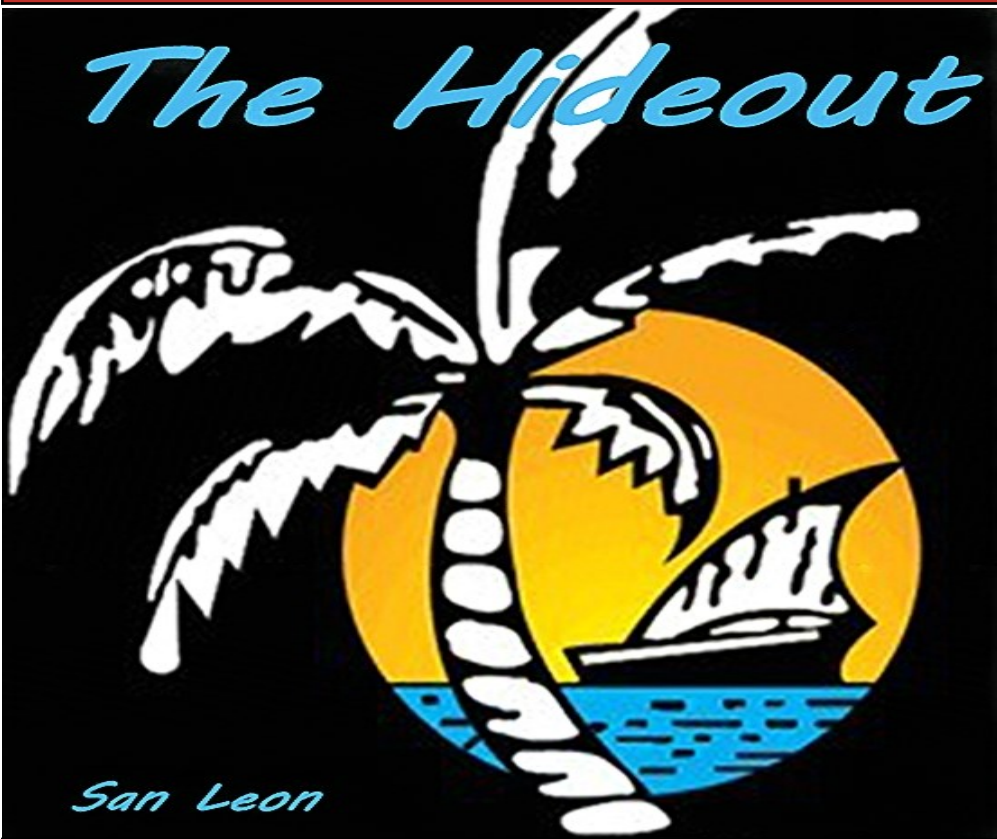

That was the last thing she remembered until waking up on a side street on Grand Ave. She saw Lou's and walked there and made her call to me. We found her car and all belongings at the restaurant around 10 pm. She made it home safe, but now the question is how and to who you report this to? The Galveston SO Dept. They will send a deputy out to make a report and then what? By then it's too late for the victim. My observation is to warn women that they are targets. DO NOT set yourself up as a target. Don't go out alone, don't sit at a bar by yourself unless waiting for a friend, don't accept an unsolicited drink from a stranger. I can't make out a report to GCSO, and she's still traumatized by it and having being victimized, don't be in her position. Be aware this is happening in this area.

FEMA IS A JOKE

He just purchased these items in June with his back SSI. He cannot get any more money to replace these items. FEMA has a stupid rule if there is two dwellings at one address, then two different claims must be done. That is what happened with the last person and the family of 4, which was really a family of 5. Since the older son lived outside the family dwelling, but at the same address, he could not be on their claim and had to file his own. Now he has been denied. The family cannot help him with their FEMA money, if they had enough to help him. The money FEMA gives can only be used for what they tell you to use it for and if there is any left over, like there probably will be for person number one, it has to be returned to FEMA, or they can be imprisoned or fined.

I understand why you could get into trouble for spending it for the wrong reasons, but if they can't do the math correctly, that should be their fault. If other people have too much money, they should be allowed to help others who did not get any money or not enough money. As long as the money is replacing items lost in the storm, what difference does it make?

While not all homes have a house shut off valve, it's a very important valve if you do have one: if closed, this valve will turn off all water service to the home! While this is handy to take care of any repairs you may need to address inside the home, during the summertime many people accidentally turn the house shut off valve when trying to turn off hoses or sprinklers. If you're experiencing a loss of service, always be sure to check your house shut off valve because it might be the culprit!

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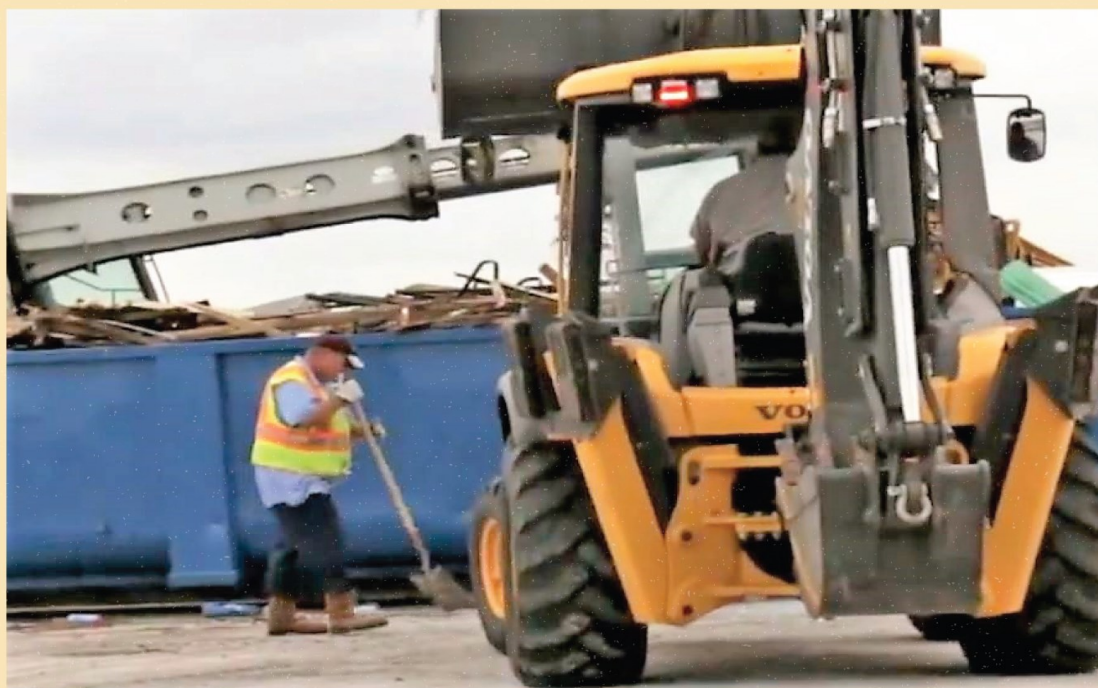

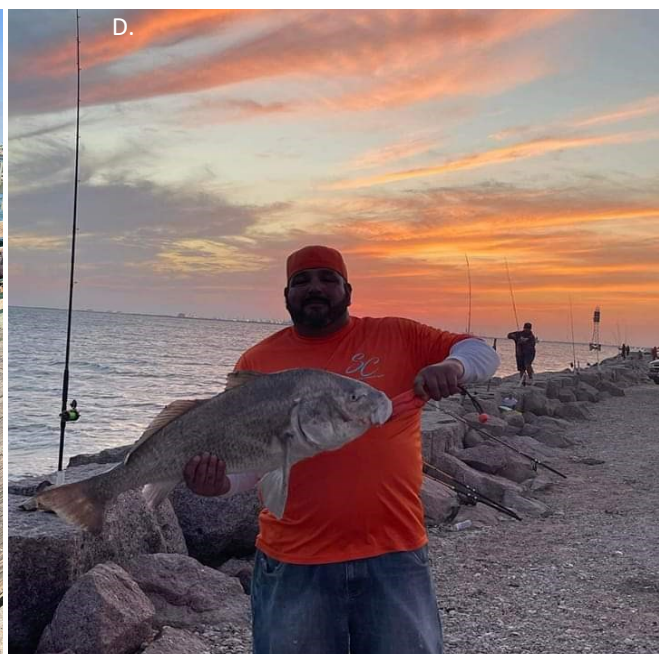

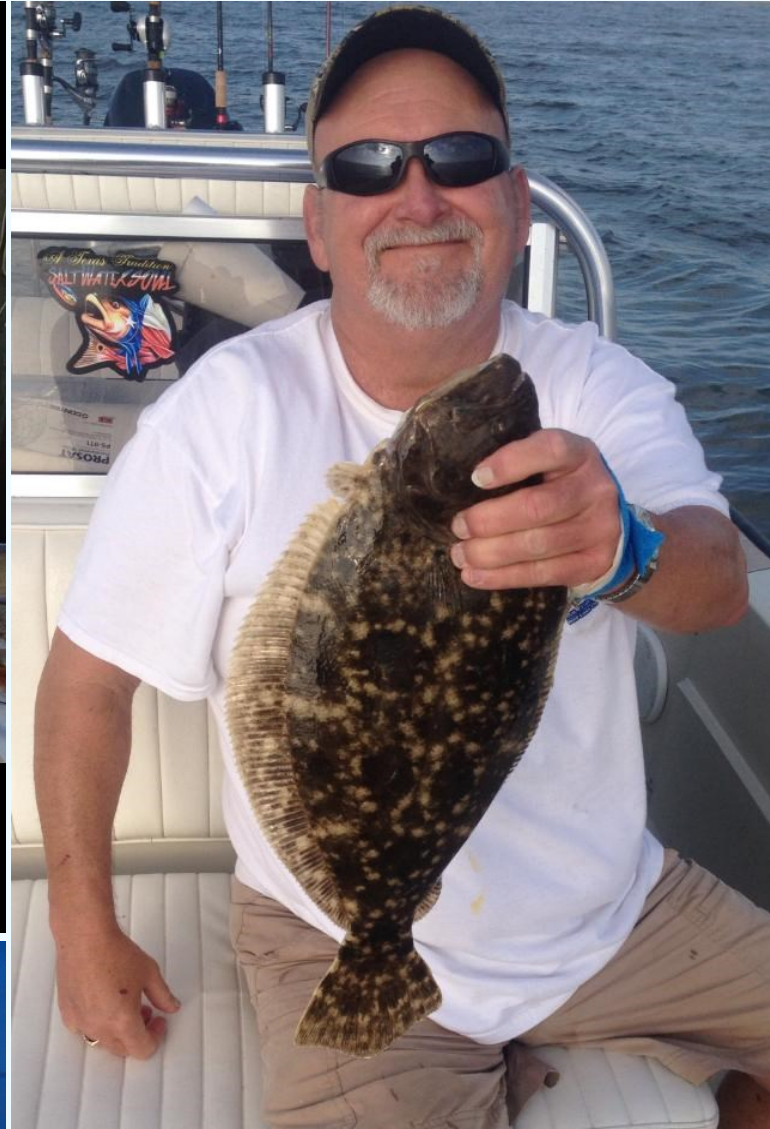
Growing Up in a Fishing Family

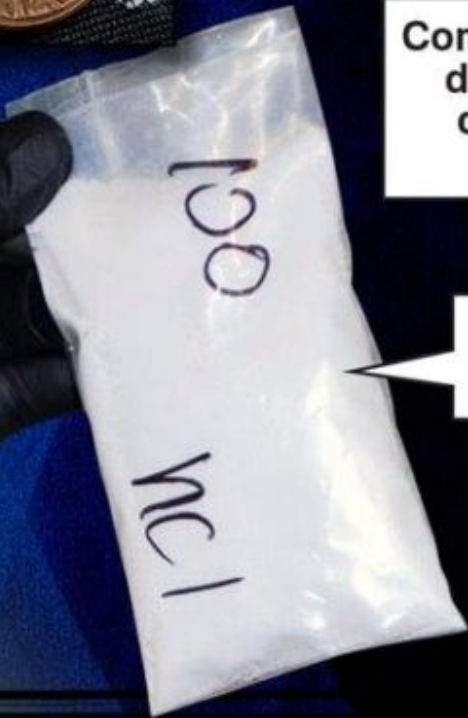
