From Military To Civilian - A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions. After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization - American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc

Modock's Ride for Caring House

14 Years of Love & Respect

This year's Modock's Ride took place on Saturday December 16, 2023. It is co-hosted by the Rez Riders IMC Arizona Chapter and Reztoration Ministries. This ride brings Christmas Cheer to the Gila River Tribe's Elders who live at Caring House. From the organizers, "The Rez Riders Indigenous Motorcycle Club has hosted The Caring House Run aka MODOCK'S RIDE for 14 years now. It is one of the highlights of our year and truly one of the more emotional experiences we have as a club. So many of the elders and residents at Caring House do not receive any visitors or gifts throughout the whole year - so this makes it especially important that we go back every holiday. A few years back we added the name MODOCK'S RIDE in memory of our past President who really championed this ride and made it what it is today."

The meet up location was Vee Quiva Casino in Laveen, making it a run of about 35 miles.

More than 60 riders/bikes participated, along with nearly a dozen vehicles that followed. Some rides AND riders were all decked out for Christmas. It was

a beautiful day and many residents were out to see and hear the bikes arrive.

The bikes did a "rolling thunder" as they rolled in, handed out stocking stuffers, gift bags, lap blankets, beanies, & goodies to every resident. The gift of TIME was also shared, as the bikers spent time visiting with the Elders. They visited residents in their rooms, blessing each person with a prayer and smudge/eagle fan blessing.

Caring House is a long-term care facility in Sacaton. There are nearly 90 residents currently. The facility is a combination of hospice care, long term elder care, and short/er term rehabilitation care.

RRIMC AZ Chapter President, WHEELZ says "We are blown away at how many biker friends and riders showed up for our event and donated to this cause. The biker community is truly generous - we want to thank Bikers Against Child Abuse, Bling Devas MC,

the Medicine Wheel Ride, Carnales MC of Arizona, Motero Life, and others."

Partner organizer Bill Gowey of Reztoration Ministries commented, "The support and all the donations are so much appreciated. Because of the generosity of this group, not only are we able to help the Caring House, but we have an extra 100 care packages to send to other elder facilities in Navajo and Hopi land. God Bless you all."

In addition to Modock's Ride, this Season the RRIMC teamed up with Title 1 Hope to assemble more than 250 food boxes for native families in need in Gila River.

From the Rez Riders IMC, "The purpose of the Rez Riders IMC is to foster a family environment of Native people through charitable acts. That's who we are. That's what we do."

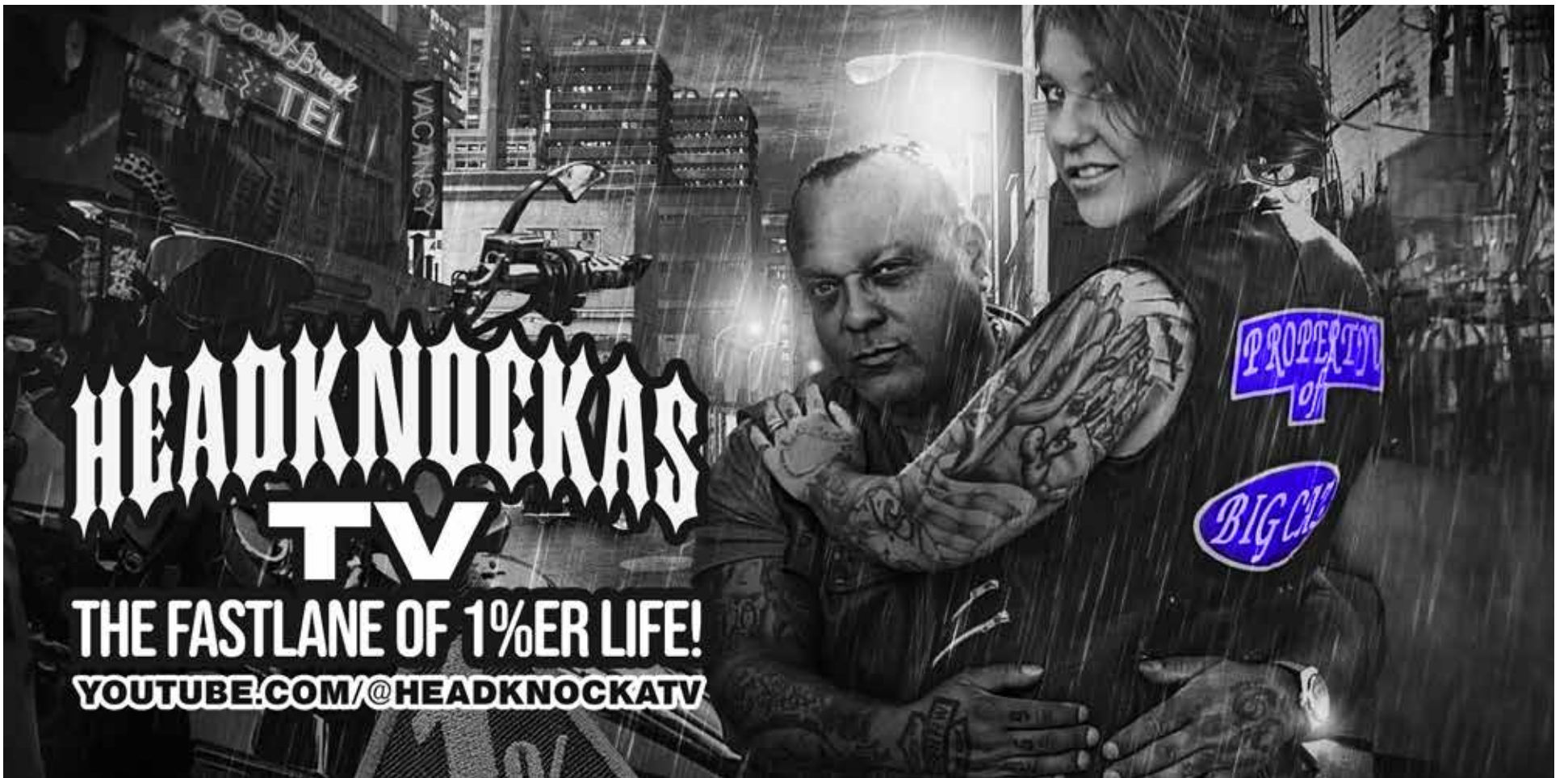

December 14, 2023

Wednesday morning, Tesla announced a recall of more than two million vehicles over concerns its "Autopilot" system can be misused by drivers. This announcement comes as part of a two-year investigation by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) into crashes by Tesla vehicles. As you may remember over the last few years, there have been high-profile incidents where Teslas, believed to be in Autopilot mode, collided with motorcycles, killing the motorcyclist.

In the recall notice NHTSA said, the investigation found Autopilot's method of making sure that drivers are paying attention can be inadequate and can lead to "foreseeable misuse of the system." The stated objective of the recall is to "Incorporate additional controls and alerts to those already existing on affected vehicles to further encourage the driver to adhere to their continuous driving responsibility whenever Autosteer is engaged, which includes keeping their hands on the steering wheel and paying attention to the roadway."

Major Tesla Recall Announced

This recent recall announcement is a good time to remind ourselves what former NHTSA Senior Safety Advisor Missy Cummings said this summer, "It's very dangerous for motorcycles to be around Teslas."

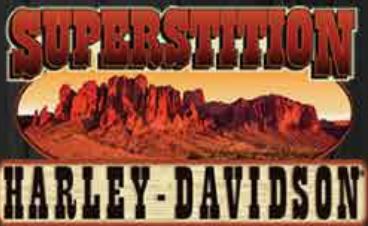
The MRF will continue fighting to ensure the safety of bikers is not ignored in the push to deploy this recent technology on our nation's roadways.
