

### From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in vour medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc

## Run To The Guns 10th Anniversary

It's been 10 years since all the effort that went into the creation of Arizona's World War II Memorial culminated at the dedication ceremony held at Wesley Bolin Plaza on December 7, 2013.

The 2023 gathering was 18 months in the making. Revisiting the Run to the Guns and organizing its 10-year anniversary was undertaken by many of the same players who were involved from the beginning. It was a Salute to our Nation's Fallen of all wars and an opportunity to Honor America's Veterans, Sailors, Soldiers & Airmen of all wars.

The ride, which took place on Saturday December 9, 2023, was organized & hosted by the American Legion Riders of Post 138 and Post 2. Some 158 Riders gathered at American Legion Post 2, located at 2125 S Industrial Park Ave. in Tempe to stage for the parade. It was a beautiful & clear day for the ride. There was no escort. Riders departed in groups or 'battalions'; staggering departure with about 2 minutes between waves. The parade of about 6 battalions went smoothly, with no mishaps and perfect arrival time for the ceremony's commencement.

WW2 war planes did a flyover at the beginning of the memorial service; generating loud cheers from the spectators. There were more than 500 additional visitors to the Remembrance. Mary Millben sang the National Anthem. Numerous organizations placed wreaths at the WWII Memorial.

A Young Marines Color Guard led the way through the Korean Memorial to the rear of the USS Arizona Gun for the Filthy 13 Riders of Post 138 Rose Ceremony. They laid 13 Red Roses at the base of the U.S.S. Arizona Gun Barrel in 2023 just as the original Filthy 13 Riders did in 2013. This was also done to honor the 13 Service members that lost their lives to Taliban attacks while trying to defend the Afghanistan Airport. Their names were

read aloud as part of this moving tribute. The "Filthy 13 Riders" and the \*Young Marines\* will not let their memory for their service be forgotten! Red Roses are a tradition started by Jim 'Boomer' Bourassa, leader of the Filthy 13 Riders, to commemorate the blood lost, the WW2 Screaming Eagles of the 101st Army Airborne Division, and the 13 American service members killed in Afghanistan.

The Honored Guest in attendance was WWII Survivor Ed Miklavcic Sr.; a Veteran of the US Army Air Forces. This 102-year old gentleman is one of the last living survivors of the 'Day That Will Live in Infamy'.

Among the organizers and attendees was Jim Baginski, Founding Commander of American Legion Post 138.

Among the speakers were Arizona's Secretary of State Adrian Fontes ~ a Marine Corp Veteran, KTAR Radio Talk Show Host Mike Broomhead, Brian Ismael - President of the HAV - Honoring American Veterans organization; Lt. Col. Dana Allmond of AZ Dept. of Veterans' Services, and Keynote Speaker Army Veteran Ian Parkinson.

State Senator Ken Bennett was there and spoke as well. He was a key player, a driving force, in the creation of the WWII Memorial that was installed at Wesley Bolin Plaza 10 years ago. He was Boomer's wingman for the 2013 Run to the Guns parade. Unfortunately, this time obligations of his office prevented him from participating in the ride. The American Legion Riders of Post 138 made him an Honorary Member and had a cut made especially for him. Boomer presented it to him on stage. He was completely surprised and honored to be made a part of ALR Post 138.

Boomer sent along acknowledgement and thanks to the sponsors & supporters of this day. "The Sponsors helped a great deal as well as volunteers. 'Sponsors were D&D Discount Motorcycles, Netta Chetta's On

Mill, U.S. Egg Breakfast & Lunch, Honoring America's Veterans Organization, Guardian Production Services, <u>A.B.A.T.E.</u>, Bass Pro Shops, Continental West, LP Sounds, Scott Media, Pinstripe Photography, Casey's Woodshed Bar, American Legion Post 2, American Legion District 12, plus American Legion Posts 26 and Post 91.

"Some key sponsoring Friends & Family include Jim & Mary Bourassa, Sue Landgraf, and Laura Turnage. Matt Roberts was my key wingman and liaison to our sister group with Paula Padine of HAV.org. Not to mention our Post 138 Commander John Boyle who filled in the voids as well as emceed the event at Post 2. Also, a big shout out goes to our long supporters Rembrandt, Nytro, Brooklyn, Cookie, and Ol'Skool of B.A.C.A. They were instrumental in their volunteering with security and assistance in many of the functions to help make it successful. And there are still too many more volunteers to mention." You are all appreciated.

This was a moving day for all who participated and a heartfelt tribute to all whose lives were taken in World War II. There are opportunities to learn more about Arizona's WWII Memorial; including a WW2 Museum at the Capitol Dome that has an information pamphlet; offering more details.

Thank you to Jim "Boomer" Bourassa of American Legion Post 138 for your help with this article.

PS: Boomer added that there will be an "RTTG Music Video" with everyone that was in the ride, as well as some shots of the volunteers that were at the "End Of The Run After Party". All the material is currently being organized and choreographed; with finalization anticipated this summer. Announcement of a date to show it is intended for some time in May or June 2024.

## 'Run to the Guns' Pearl Harbor Day Remembrance Ride

December 7... a date to always remember and to honor the many lives cut short and the others changed forever.

For many years there have been efforts to build a WWII Memorial at AriZona's Capitol in Phoenix. The 2013 Pearl Harbor Day commemoration, held on Saturday December 7, would see the dedication of that WWII Memorial.

The project itself, once approved, took three years to complete. Through the efforts of AZ's Secretary of State Ken Bennett, Arizona was able to acquire from the US Navy the only remaining 14-inch Big Deck Gun off the USS Arizona. It had been in storage in a New Jersey shipyard. He also secured a 16-inch Deck Gun off the "Mighty Mo".

Motorcyclists organized a tribute parade to pay respect to this important landmark in Arizona history ~ both the historic ties to the tragedy at Pearl Harbor and the overdue tribute to our few remaining WWII Veterans.

Sign-in for the Run to the Guns ~ Pearl Harbor Day Remembrance Ride took place at EagleRider Motorcycle Sales, at 1000 N McClintock Dr in Tempe. This was a fully escorted ride, structured with military precision. Kick Stands Up was at 7:48am, the time that the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor commenced.

According to organizer Jim "Boomer" Bourassa, participants represented the American Legion Riders, VFW, a list of some 30 other MCs and RCs, plus independent riders. Boomer led the procession with Ken Bennett as his wing-man. They were followed by 1,916 bikes; as reported by the DPS escort. He shared some interesting coincidences pertaining to that number, which caused him goose



bumps. 1916 was the year that the USS Arizona was first launched. He had invited the priest from the Trinity Cathedral in Phoenix to offer the ride a Prayer at the Road Captains meeting. The priest shared that his same church christened the USS Arizona back in 1916.

Upon arrival at Wesley Bolin Plaza at the Arizona State Capitol in Phoenix the parade rolled past the Memorial itself. The Saluting Marine ~ SSgt Tim Chambers was also in attendance; presenting his Salute to honor the Veterans, their Families, and his fellow Patriots.

Many Arizonans participated in this dedication. It is estimated that some 25,000 were in attendance. Boomer noted that based upon so many people coming out, that they had just enough room to park all the bikes. More bikes may have been a problem for parking.

The ceremonial activities included an opening prayer, the National Anthem, a release of doves, a B-17 'Flying Fortress' flyover, and a lot of speakers. Three dozen roses were laid atop the guns, plus wreath layers from 87 different organizations made their presentations.

There was a dedication to the Filthy 13. Boomer described these men as the GI Joes of their time; predecessors to the Navy SEALS. He wanted to remind

everyone that WW2 was about more than just Pearl Harbor. That was just the beginning of the US involvement. From there, four hard-fought years ensued.

A lot of planning and imagery went into the WW2 Memorial... With the two deck guns serving as 'bookends', the design of AZ's WWII Memorial reflects the beginning of the US involvement in WW2 when Japan attacked Pearl Harbor and sank the USS Arizona and the end of WW2 when Japan

surrendered on the deck of the USS Missouri. The nine I-beams of the Memorial, which hold the names of the sailors, depict the keel of the ship and commemorate the 9 minutes it took for the USS Arizona to sink. Wesley Bolin Plaza was already home to the USS Arizona's Signal Mast and Anchor; and these artifacts blend well with the new Memorial.

A brick program provides people with an opportunity to help support this Memorial and its upkeep. For a donation of \$125, a brick can be inscribed with a message, such as the name of your family's WW2 Veteran[s], and it will be placed within the Memorial's grounds.

There is much more than space allows here that can be said about this Memorial. When you go to visit the site, be sure and stop in at the WW2 Museum, under the Capitol Dome. There you can get an informational pamphlet that describes the Memorial in great detail.

Thank you to Jim "Boomer" Bourassa of American Legion Post 138 for his dedication to this project and for his help with this article.






