Stitch from Custom Cycle Seats spoke about riders' concerns & discomforts such as pressure points and sciatica ~ and how a custom-built seat can help to alleviate some of those issues to help you stay in the saddle longer & be more comfortable.

Nick from Drag Specialties gave an overview of items from a recent trade show; highlighting LED lighting products to improve your motorcycle's visibility.

Rick with SP Connect demonstrated smartphone mounts for your motorcycle.

Glenn from Muc-Off had a detailing tent in the parking lot to demonstrate their different products.

It was very interesting to learn from Rodney's More Shade presentation that their SPF50 fabric shades can reduce your motorcycle seat's temperature 50+ degrees as compared to parking your bike without a cover.

Drag racer Patty Bluett of M&P Racing shared her love of racing; describing her entry into the sport at the 'grassroots' level and explaining that that is how many racers get their start.

After all the presentations concluded, there were more than a dozen opportunities to win some pretty cool raffle prizes. Prizes included a helmet, SP Connect phone mount kit, Muc-Off cleaning supplies, turn signals, tank bag, battery tender, apparel, & more. 

### From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc



### Superstition Treasure Hunt with (

The Inaugural Superstition Treasure Hunt, hosted by the Combat Vets Motorcycle Association (CVMA) Chapter 32-8, took place on October 14, 2023. The event started & ended at Superstition Harley-Davidson, located at 2910 W Apache Trail in Apache Junction. This was a unique spin on a fundraising ride, offering a creative alternative to a dice or poker run.

From CVMA Chapter 32-8 Chaplain George 'Comrade' Ruble, "We took the concept of a 'Scavenger Hunt' ride and gave it a 'Treasure Hunt' theme; given the local area's history and folklore regarding the Lost Dutchman's Treasure and our proximity to the Superstition Mountains.

"We partnered with several local veteran-owned or veteran-friendly businesses, local museums, veteran monuments, and similar locations of interest. We had 19 total locations for the Treasure Hunters to visit. This was not only a 'self-paced' ride but it was, as one participant described it, a 'Choose your own adventure' ride! Upon Registration, the Treasure Hunters received passport books and a list of all the participating locations. They decided which locations they wanted to visit, the order they visited them in, and how much time they would spend at any particular location. The number and distance of locations meant that it would be impossible, and illegal, for them to visit all 19 locations. Each location had a point value associated with it.

"The idea was that the participating businesses would not experience any significant disruption to their daily operations aside from stamping the passports of the Treasure Hunters upon their arrival. Redeemable Treasure Tokens were provided to the locations to distribute, however they wanted, to the Treasure Hunters. One location, VFW Post 7968 in Apache Junction, was asking military-themed trivia questions in exchange for the tokens!"

All told, there were 58 bikes & 72 total participants for this inaugural event. All were required to be back to Superstition HD by 3pm. There were food trucks and music along with many raffle prizes. Once everyone returned

Comrade explained, "Upon returning to Superstition Harley-Davidson, the passports were scored based on the stamps collected. It was stamped 'CLEARED' and returned to the Treasure Hunter as a souvenir. Riders could also exchange any Treasure Tokens they received with an actual 'Treasure Coin'. The Treasure Coins are a limited number, exclusive item which could only be obtained through 'finding' it on the ride or winning it as an award. They are not available for sale."

There were 5 Awards presented, with engraved tumblers and one trophy distributed. The Treasure Hunter, for visiting the most locations, was won by Shane Olsen and his nephew. The Prospector Award, for accumulating the most points, was won by Pam & David Salerno. There were also the Saltiest Road Dog Award for being the oldest Treasure Hunter and the Road Hazard Award for being the Youngest Treasure Hunter. Comrade explained, "In line with many of our military's traditions, we presented the Saltiest Road Dog Award first and then asked him to present the Road Hazard Award to the youngest rider. This symbolizes the passing of knowledge, wisdom and esprit de corps from one generation to the next." Unfortunately, these names were unavailable at the time of this writing. The Lost Dutchman Trophy, awarded to the Combat Veterans Motorcycle Association Chapter who showed the event the most support, went to CVMA Chapter 32-1 which is based in Phoenix. Congratulations to all of the winners!

Comrade sent along this message on behalf of the organizers, "When we initially started reaching out to potential businesses and organizations to float our Treasure Hunt concept by them, we were completely blown away at the amount of enthusiasm and support we received from literally everyone we spoke to about the event.

"During and after the Treasure Hunt, the

feedback we received from nearly all of the participants was just as enthusiastic and supportive of the event. Everyone had a great time and is excited for the next one!

"Outside of the Treasure Hunt Ride concept itself, the aspect we received the most comments about was our incorporation of technology from start to finish. Everything from registering, signing waivers, passport scoring, and more was done using QR Codes and web-based form submissions.

"We would not have been able to pull off this event with the success we had without the support from many people, organizations and businesses! Primarily, Superstition Harley-Davidson and their amazing Event Coordinator, Brina Brown! American Legion Post #39 and their Legion Riders, Black Metal Firearms, Hawg Haven Leathers II, Lucky Strike Cycles, and too many more to name!

"Of course, none of this would have been possible without the K9s For Warriors and the amazing work they do to pair veterans with service dogs AT NO COST to the veteran. It's much easier to organize and participate in an event like this when it's being done for a great cause!"

The beneficiary of this event, K9s For Warriors provides highly-trained Service Dogs to military veterans suffering from PTSD, traumatic brain injury, and/or military sexual trauma. Comrade shared, "We wrote a \$5,786.84 check to K9s For Warriors. This was enough to fully cover the lodging, food and other related expenses for 1 Warrior to attend the 21-day handler training class at one of K9FW's facilities." Congratulations to CVMA Chapter 32-8 for this successful outcome! They are already getting started on planning the 2nd Annual Superstition Treasure Hunt for some time in Fall 2024.

### Ride For the Salt River Wild Horses

The 9th annual Ride For the Salt River Wild Horses took place on Saturday January 27, 2024. Sign-in was hosted by American Legion Post #58 in Fountain Hills. It is a fundraiser for the Salt River Wild Horses Management Group {SRWHMG}.

My thanks to event founder & organizer Skeeter Peak, for her help with this article.

There were over 750 sign-ins for this self-paced ride. The route is a scenic run though the Lower Salt River area. Each year, photographers await the riders along the route; including at mile marker 36 on Bush Highway and at the 4-way stop at Bush Highway & Usery Pass Road. They captured some great pictures, which can be seen on the Ride for the Salt River Wild Horses facebook page.

While the ride has no required check points, as for a dice or card game; riders had the option to stop at Goldfield Recreational site - located off of Usery Pass Road. Skeeter shared, "that is a good area to see the wild horses."

The ride's destination was Superstition Harley-Davidson, located at 2910 W Apache Trail in Apache Junction. Here, there were food trucks, vendor booths ~ including sponsor <u>Law Tigers</u>, and music by Poppy Harpman and The Storm. Additional vendors included More Shade, Twisted Treasures jewelry, Blades & Shades, and SRWHMG merchandise.

Raffle tables held a variety of items to win. There were collectibles, a helmet, adult beverages, artwork, home décor, specialty coffees & teas, a big gift basket

from Superstition HD, & more.

There was a special auction this year. An artist, Nicole Luttrell, repainted a couple of Breyer miniature horses in memory of two wild foals, Mirabelle and Coriander, that were killed by a mountain lion in late 2023. She donated these Breyer re-paints to the event to raise funds for the Salt River Wild Horses of the Tonto National Forest. The auction raised \$500 toward the support of the Salties.

An additional fundraiser took place for the Salties that day as well. On The Green Sports Grill in Mesa was holding their 5th anniversary party and called it "The Ride After Party". They had a 50/50 and raised \$323 that was donated to SR-WHMG, plus donated an additional \$250 for a total of \$573.

This event takes a lot of people to make it work. Skeeter sent along a Thank You message, "to American Legion Post 58 in Fountain Hills; Simone Netherlands founder of the SRWHMG, for her continuous dedication to support the humane management for the Salt River wild horses; the SRWHMG mascot Salty; the AZ Rangers of the East Valley; Poppy Harpman and The Storm band; all the SR-WHMG volunteers; the merchandise and food vendors; our sponsors Superstition HD, Law Tigers, and Len Novin from The Bull/The Rattler radio; All the American Legion Riders representing Posts 2,

5, 27, 35, 39, 58, 117, 138; and ALL the Riders who came out to support the wild horses."

SRWHMG programs are noteworthy in their ability to efficiently manage this herd of horses which has, thanks to 'progress', had their territory completely hemmed in.

Natural resources to support the herd are limited. That is why one of the critical SRWHMG programs is population management. Monies raised go toward humane birth control, plus habitat improvement such as removal of barbed wire & other man-made safety hazards, fence maintenance to keep the horses off the roadways, emergency feed programs for during extreme drought, tracking & data collection regarding the health & wellbeing of the herd, public education, & much more. This organization is proving that it is possible to humanely manage these representatives of living history; whereas, in other areas of our state and nationwide, wild horses are rounded up and sold to slaughter auctions in hope of exterminating them from public lands.

SRWHMG operates solely on donations, with no government grants. Donations are tax deductible & can be made via their website at https://saltriverwildhorsemanagementgroup.org/ You can make a donation, purchase support merchandise, sponsor a specific horse, & read about other options.

This day raised \$16,488, which Skeeter says is this event's best year ever. Congratulations on such a successful day and Thank You to all who helped make it happen!
