

From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc



The second T-shirt was \$10. The Post Auxiliary provided breakfast burritos for donation, and sloppy joes for lunch. Big thank yous to the ladies. The food was great.

This year's route was to the General Kearney Inn, in Kearney; then the Ore House in Oracle; and the Cadillac Chapparal Steak House on Hwy #79, before heading back to Florence. The first and last dice roll was held at Post #9.

National and Regional News

San Francisco — Waymo's application to expand its robotaxi service in Los Angeles and San Mateo counties has been suspended for 120 days by the California Public Utilities Commission's Consumer Protection and Enforcement Division. The decision doesn't change Waymo's ability to commercially operate driverless vehicles in San Francisco. However, it does put an abrupt halt to the company's goals to expand where it can operate — at least until June 2024.

The Commission said on its website that the application has been suspended for further staff review. According to Waymo, the "suspension" is a procedural part of the CPUC's standard and robust review process. However, San Mateo County Board of Supervisors vice president David J. Canepa took a different position. He stated that Waymo has hindered meaningful discussions regarding planned expansion into Silicon Valley and that this delay will provide the opportunity to fully engage the autonomous vehicle maker on their public safety concerns.

Waymo noted that it has reached out to two dozen government and business organizations as part of its out-

reach effort, including officials in cities throughout San Mateo County such as Burlingame, Daly City and Foster City, the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office and local chambers of commerce.

Waymo operates a commercial service 24 hours a day, seven days a week throughout San Francisco. Waymo is also allowed to give people free driverless rides in parts of Los Angeles. The company kicked off robotaxi ride testing with employees in Santa Monica around March 2023 and has since opened it up to some members of the public, but is still not able to charge for those rides.

Live With Courage

The 'Live With Courage' Camp Courage Fundraising Event took place on February 4, 2024. It was sponsored by Law Tigers Arizona and held at the Main Stage music venue & bar in Cottonwood, AZ

Rex the CEO of Arizona Burn Foundation came in today and I was able to hand over a check for \$18,098 from the money that was raised here at Main Stage on Feb 4th at the Camp Courage Fundraising Event sponsored by Law Tigers Arizona.

This money will send 12 children burn survivors to Camp Courage this year, to spend a life-changing week at a camp which will serve as an integral milestone in their burn journey. This is full circle for me, as this is a camp that I personally went to as a child after suffering 3rd degree burns to 17% of my body. Camp Courage is a camp that changed my life in the most positive way after some of the toughest times for me and my family. This camp helped give me the courage to endure the year of bandages and treatments and painful healing that I needed.

It's a camp that showed me that I wasn't alone in what I had endured and that I could still be a kid despite any trauma we endured. But my love for the Arizona Burn Foundation doesn't stem just from my own experience. It stems from the stories of the children I met, of how they came to be burn survivors, and the trauma they had experienced. It's the little boy Mikey that was in the hospital room next to me for months at the burn unit who, at 5 years old, reached for a french fry from a boiling pot when his babysitter wasn't looking and now had 80% of his body in 3rd degree burns. Mikey would spend months in the hospital and years of treatments and surgeries and navigate a life of people looking at him differently from his visible scars. It's watching Mikey later at camp, smiling and laughing and just being able to be a kid again for a week without anyone looking at him because he looked different from any other kid.

It's the kids that have endured more than we can imagine and their inspiration and courage to embrace their scars and heal from it. Their stories, their courage and their strength is something I have carried with me throughout my life. So this is for all those kids, to give hope back to them when they need it the most. Thank you

to everyone in the community who came together and rallied together for good; to make a lifelong impact for these children and their families. You really are making such a difference and I'm humbled and proud to be a part of it all.

Thank you to EVERYONE that helped make this happen, to everyone that donated, contributed, volunteered and showed up in support! You all did a whole lot of good.
