





Book Review - The Meaning of Life According to Bikers

The Biker Book For Charity

Edited & Introduced by Louise Lewis

"What is the Meaning of Life?" As I first sat with this book in front of me I was moved to consider.... Do I just dive in and start reading? Do I contemplate the question first, then read to see how my answers match up? Agree? Disagree? Conform? Ahhh... but there IS no wrong answer © Right?

I'm unsure that The Meaning of Life can be quantified or defined in any black & white concrete manner. Although I'm certain that there would be some out there who disagree on that.

For me at least, "What gives meaning to your Life?" is a more manageable consideration. But this piece isn't about me. It's about the book.

When our copy arrived in the mail, the very first impression while unwrapping it was how striking it was. The look, quality, and feel of it gave off a positivity that was surprising; and that was before ever cracking the binding.

The photography is outstanding; a combination of candids and portraits intended to capture the essence of the people who are speaking. Some comments Louise collected seem similar to what you'd read on a Facebook-style inspiration page. Others are more thoughtful, obviously personal to the individual who is sharing. The book is well organized. With hundreds of responses, representing the famous and the regular riders, Louise created Chapters to group them in terms of similarity. Themes include Spirituality & God, Riding, No Idea, Service to Others, Family & Friends, and so forth. The responses are well expressed, presented beautifully, and can serve as a touchstone for each reader's personal exploration of the subject.

Some might say that because of the inherent risk that motorcyclists accept as part of riding that a biker's perspective on the meaning of life has been more closely examined. I would counter that we each reflect at our own pace, based on triggers, inspirations, and life events ... riders and non-riders alike. Bikers may just face those triggers and such more frequently.

It isn't necessarily one of those books that you'd sit down & read cover-to-cover in one sitting. There's an initial desire to flip through to check out the photos, see who participated, and catch a few comments. From there evolves a desire to take more time, study the images, and contemplate the entries at greater length.

Chances are you'll recognize people in your lives in these pages. In our decades in this community Bruce & I have met scooter folk who reflect the different philosophies expressed in the book; sometimes bringing a nod, a smile of remembrance, or a bemused shake of the head ©

As much as it seems like this might be a book only riders could understand, it may actually have a secondary value... as a means of explaining to non-riding friends or loved ones what we 'see' about this lifestyle that they don't 'get'.

So now that we have established that the book, *The Meaning of Life According to Bikers* is a good find ... let's talk about how Louise is presenting it, as its subtitle says *The Biker Book for Charity*. Its goal is to be of benefit to our motorcycling community as a whole. She provides numerous opportunities to support charitable organizations, everywhere and anywhere.

Asked what charity is benefited by this book, she replied, "Hopefully thousands!"

Okay then, let's go into that. There are multiple ways for this book to raise money. An organization can purchase books in bulk from the publisher at a discount, then sell them at retail... donating the difference to their charity of choice.

OR you might get the opportunity to meet the lady herself who put this all together and purchase it directly... at a personal appearance on her book tour. This includes a stop in Sturgis on August 5, 2019.

During one of her interviews she commented that when she started she wasn't sure how the bikers would respond to her. She is a self-described geek, definitely and obviously NOT part of the riding community. She shared a story about walking up to a rider to ask him her "What is the Meaning of Life?" question; explaining why she wanted to know. As the conversation progressed this fellow told her, "You are the perfect person to do this" rather than a rider. Actually, I get that. If someone within the biker community had offered up a book such as this, it could have been written off as self-serving, a vehicle to whitewash bad acts, or similar crap that's been shoveled over the decades. Louise, being an 'outsider' so to speak, offers an independent perspective.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

What you need to know about the new 'texting while driving' law

A baker's dozen of things you need to know about the new texting law.

What will be forbidden?

The new law will make it illegal to "physically hold" or "support with any part of the body" any cell phone or other portable wireless communication device while operating a motor vehicle. There was some debate — and no clear answer — on what constitutes "support" of a phone, and whether that means in the lap, in the pocket or elsewhere. But from a practical standpoint, if it's in a lap, it is unlikely that a police officer would see it and pull someone over. The law bans not only chatting on the phone but writing, sending and reading text messages, emails, instant messages or internet data.

What are the key exceptions?

Drivers can make calls if they use earpieces, headphones or any type of device worn on a wrist to conduct voice communications. Vehicles with built-in interfaces with cell phones also are exempt as long as they can be operated with minimal interactions, meaning simply to press a button to activate or deactivate. People also can "read" texts if these are translated into voice. And they also can send texts if done through voice commands. A phone's map and GPS are permitted if in a hands-free mode.

What about other types of devices?

The same restrictions on holding a cell phone also apply to any "stand-alone electronic device." That means anything with stored audio or video - so, no hanging on to the phone while listening to previously recorded podcasts or watching tapes of Game of Thrones.

What about watching live TV?

That already is illegal. But the new law clarifies that the statute does not apply to mapping services, which update images, as well as to cars and trucks with built-in video screens that provide information about the vehicle. The legislation also adds a provision designed to protect people who have dash cams and similar devices that continuously record what's going on, either in the vehicle or on the road.

Are there other types of operations that are not subject to the law?

Motorists can use a cell phone to "report illegal activity or summon emergency help." Also not subject to new restrictions are licensed amateur radio operators and fleet drivers with commercial licenses communicating with a dispatcher. And for those who are still attached to their citizen band radios, you can keep yakking away, good buddy.

What about when I'm stopped?

It depends on where. Motorists who are parked are exempt and can call and text at will. Ditto if you're at a stop light or waiting for a train to clear a railroad crossing. But a stop sign doesn't count. Nor does being stopped for a school bus.

What are the fines?

A first offense carries a minimum fine of \$75 and up to \$149. Subsequent violations result in fines of at least \$150 and no more than \$250. But the offenses accumulate no points on a motorist's license. There is an exception: Licenses can be suspended if someone is violating the new law and causes a serious injury or death.

Do I have to give my cell phone to a police officer when stopped?

No. There is an exception for "when authorized by law," but there is no definition.

When does all this take effect?

January 1, 2021. That doesn't preclude an offending motorist from being stopped between now and then, though police could issue only warnings for violating the new law.

But what about all those existing local laws?

Those remain in effect and can still be enforced, including provisions that are stricter than what's in this new law. So, if a local ordinance has no exception for stop lights, motorists can still be cited. But as of Jan. 1, 2021, any provision that does not mirror the state law will disappear.

If there's a delayed effective date, why the emergency clause?

One provision that takes effect immediately requires the Motor Vehicle Division to now start testing would-be drivers on the effects of using cell phones and similar devices. Another new section allows MVD to suspend the commercial driver's license of someone who violates the law.

What about the "distracted driving" law?

That is a separate bill that went to Gov. Doug Ducey on Monday that allows police to stop and cite someone if he or she is doing something other than driving, whether texting or eating a ham sandwich, and it creates an immediate hazard or the motorist does not exercise reasonable control of the vehicle. That measure, if approved, would take effect later this summer. Ducey said he is still reviewing that measure.

Do these bills conflict?

Not necessarily. The texting and cell phone use ban is stricter in the sense that a motorist can be cited solely for holding and using the device, even with no indication that it's affecting the person's driving. But the distracted driving bill, while requiring some indication of affecting the operation of the motor vehicle, can be applied to just about anything unrelated to actually controlling the car or truck.

From Military To Civilian – A Seamless Transition

When members of the Armed Forces of the United States finish at least one year of their tour of deployment they need to enroll in the Veterans Administration (VA) program to obtain any VA Health Benefits they may be entitled to receive. Enroll PROMPTLY by following these steps:

- Obtain a copy of your service medical records prior to discharge.
- A veteran has 2 years, after separation, to apply for service-related medical conditions After two years the process becomes more difficult.
- If you require medical assistance from the VA after separation/discharge, bring with you a copy of your medical records, a copy of your DD-214, and two forms of picture identification.
- Any injury or illness incurred while serving on active duty as a regular, reservist, or Federalized member of the National Guard needs to be noted in your medical records.
- Enroll in the VA IMMEDIATELY. Do Not Procrastinate!!
- Join a veterans service organization American Legion, VFW, DAV, AMVETS, Marine Corps League, Rolling Thunder®, etc



Motorcycle Awareness Program going strong twenty years and counting

ABATE of Arizona has a program that reaches out to student drivers in five East Valley high schools, encouraging them to Look Out For Motorcycles. The Motorcycle Awareness Program (M.A.P.) is an educational program aimed at the target audience of high school students in driver's education classes. It was originally started up by Sporty Jim and later fine-tuned by Jean Cooper to a PowerPoint and video presentation. East Valley Chapter members Joe Silk and Jim Silk have been showing students how to 'Share The Road' twice a year. Their PowerPoint show helps students to see what a motorcycle is doing in today's traffic and alerts students to another form of transportation vehicle.

Photos of who, what, and where motorcycles can be found are in their presentation, as well as a video put out by the MRF {Motorcycle Riders Foundation} of sharing the road. The students then take a short quiz on what was shown. Presenters verbally go through the 10 question quiz with them, giving examples of real life experiences that relate to each question throughout.

{ed: From the way Jim explained it to me, it seems like portions of the presentation are intended to 'personalize' the motorcyclists to the students... talking about different riders & their experiences [who], [what] their reasons are for riding, and the numerous situations [where] they might, as drivers, interact with bikes on the roadways. Now, thanks to this class, rather than seeing a motorcycle as just another vehicle on the road these young drivers are more likely to see a motorcyclist – a person, going about his or her day.}

bys' and having the students guess its speed. This helps demonstrate how hard it is to judge the speed of a motorcycle. The 'narrow profile' of a motorcycle coming at you is discussed, including how easily it can be hidden by small objects or possibly even ignored due to larger vehicles around it.

The lecture ends with a brief demonstration on how a rider operates the bike.

Many motorcycle riders have assisted over the years in helping do this presentation and a big thank you goes out to Richard Dalton, Nolan Steed, Tim Zemnick, Dawn Parker, Mary K and Smiley, Greg "Troll" Hughes, "Pops" from the Huns MC, Ron Carroll from Gold Wing Riders, and Joe Hoodak for his help, among many others. Without a motorcycle rider doing these demonstration rides, the class would not be a success. It is a small part, but a huge difference to make the student drivers of Arizona aware of bikers.

The goal is to expand this MAP program statewide, ideally with at least one volunteer instructor in each ABATE Chapter. There are currently 'certified presenters' teaching in Tucson, Kingman, Lake Havasu, Phoenix/Metro, and soon to be Payson. The purpose is to spread the word about safe motorcycling and promote a positive image of motorcyclists. What better way than to speak to the future drivers of our state? The students will hopefully be better equipped car and truck drivers and also be more aware and watch out for us.

Although most of these classes are for High School students, the MAP has also been presented to Senior Groups and even an engineering company to help them meet their safety education requirements. {The man in charge was a rider and had heard of the program from his teenage son. Cool.}



We attended the 5th annual Riding For the Long Haul, presented by AMSAF - Arizona Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Foundation, on Sunday March 3, 2019. This year's venue was once again the El Zaribah Shriners Auditorium in Phoenix.

When we arrived, there was a rider skills demonstration under way by the AZ Precision Motorcycle Drill Team that was impressive to watch. These pilots were riding their full-size baggers in slow, close-quarter maneuvers that included tight turns and quick stops. Experienced bikers watching from the sidelines were heard to say that these riders make what are definitely difficult maneuvers look easy. In addition to the Arizona PM Drill Team, rider skills demonstrations were presented throughout the day by Chandler PD, Mesa PD, Phoenix PD, ProRider Drill Team, and Team AZ. It was a very popular attraction.

Anybody who thinks they have 'mad skills' on a motorcycle needs to stand at the barricade and watch these pilots go through their paces. It gives you a whole different appreciation. They are always amazing to watch. We've heard riders who we know have been riding for years emphasis the importance of keeping skills sharp, rather than relying strictly on experience, history, or habit. It is important to continuously practice. Mick Degn, AMSAF Executive Director commented, "It is so easy to get into bad habits riding or not know what to do in a situation where all of a sudden something is in front of you."

They did a presentation on how to pick up a fallen motorcycle. I must say though, as helpful as the demo can be, each bike used had highway crash bars... Meaning that the bike 'fell' or was 'dropped' to no more than about a 45 degree angle. No disrespect intended... But that's not exactly 'on the ground'. For that they'd need to select a different style bike. For folks who own less 'dressed' bikes, there's more to learn about picking it up. I'm also pretty certain there are not too many folks who would be willing to volunteer their ride for the demonstration!

There was quite an array of vendors, some indoors and others out.

Outdoors were <u>ABATE-AZ</u>, <u>AZ Motorcycle Towing</u>, Discount Biker Supply, Team AZ, Bad MF apparel, ProRider, GWRRA {Gold Wing Road Riders Association}, RideNow PowerSports, AZ Coyotes, Desert Wind HD, Keene Auto Glass, MMA-AZ, Combat Dolls, Lightning Strike Motorcycle Lights, Shriners Int'l, Biker Down, kettle corn, Blades & Shade, and the Clip Man.

Indoor vendors & other booths included <u>Law</u> <u>Tigers</u>, <u>AMSAF</u>, Breyer Law, Encompass Health Rehab Hospital, The Helmet Center, Pure Romance, Six Gun Entertainment, and Young Living Essential Oils. At the Dignity Health booth they had goggles to simulate driving while impaired. The Governor's Office of Highway Safety, along with other information, had a list of <u>statewide rider training schools</u>.

Fifteen people participated in the blood drive, managed Vitalant Blood Services.

Music was provided by The Visitors.

There was a LOT of valuable information available. Sadly, some of it was somewhat disturbing as well. We as riders want to be able to place blame on the drivers for the wrecks that occur. So, learning that more than 40% of motorcycle crashes and fatalities are the fault of the rider was hard to hear. Causes include: Speed too fast for Conditions, Unsafe lane changes, Following too closely, impairment by Alcohol & Drugs {prescribed or otherwise}, and even Left turns... what we traditionally blame on the cagers. These statistics CAN be turned around - with rider education. Mick emphasized, "We're having a lot of conversation on how best to help reduce crashes and fatalities. It's really a tough question." Training classes for beginners as well as continuing education for experienced riders are available statewide.

There were more than 100 raffle prizes to be won, including apparel, gift baskets, gift cards from restaurants & bars, and more. Businesses were very generous in their donations.

During the presentations ceremony, Mick Degn recognized numerous organizations and individuals who have supported the AMSAF mission over the years.

There were 2 big drawings scheduled for the day. The Grand Prize trip to Laughlin was won by David Thomas. That package, which was donated by Law Tigers and The Husband & Wife Law Team, includes a 3-night stay at Laughlin River Run, concert tickets, plus \$1000 cash. Nice!

The criteria for the 2nd drawing unfortunately was not fulfilled. It seemed like a simple incentive... If 500 people pre-registered for the event [for FREE] then there would be a drawing for a \$500 cash prize. With attendances at 1000+ in years past, this seemed like an easy goal to achieve; but it fell short. It was disheartening to see the reduction in attendance that we observed. As Mick noted, "Safety is hard to sell." It's been said before ... rider safety & all that goes with it can be pretty dry stuff. It's hard to make a safety-themed event 'sexy', attractive, and fun. That being said, it is being observed, by us and others, that

attendance overall is dropping at numerous events... not just at this one.

As they do after each event, these AMSAF and Riding For the Long Haul VOLUNTEERS take what they learn and do what they can to adjust and improve the delivery of their safety messages regarding crash prevention and the importance of injury reduction, new rider training, AND continuing education for more experienced riders.

In following up with Mick afterwards, he sent along this message ... "Our goal is to promote motorcycle safety and awareness and help reduce crashes and fatalities and anytime we can put on an event to help in this area it's worth all the time and effort put into it. We've done this event for 5 years... This year we had Channels 3, 5, 10 and 15 there for coverage on TV." He added, "This event couldn't be done without the Community and our Riding for the Long Haul Committee which is made up of: Howard Gelman, Merlo Pile, Terry Cooper, Steve Hauck, Rosi Khazoom, Mick Degn, and Ari Levenbaum."

When asked if there were event supporters & donors he'd like to thank he replied, "Most definitely; starting with our Title Sponsors - Dignity Health-Chandler Regional Hospital, Arizona Trauma Association, Governor's Office of Highway Safety, and Law Tigers. These folks really stepped up as Sponsors and Partners to help promote motorcycle safety. In addition, Ride Now, Indian Motorcycle, Team Arizona, Breyer Law, Nash Motorsports, and Thomas Baldrick, {owner of video production company 'AZ Strong'} who helped us put together our Title Sponsor video."

AMSAF Scholarships are amazing opportunities to new riders ~ giving them the best possible start to their motorcycling lives. The classes give them a foundation of safe riding skills that they will build on through the years and across the miles.

Since the beginning, AMSAF has provided more than 3500 rider training scholarships to beginning and basic-level riders. AMSAF is continuously seeking grants & donations to help provide more scholarships to our riding community. They hope to get another grant in June or July for more scholarships. Motorist Awareness Please Read If You Do Not Ride A Motorcycle

As we all know or should know, our roads are not safe for Motorcycles or anyone else for that matter. With all the distractions we have with Cell Phones. New Technologies, GPS, Etc. in our cars; let's face it, not all drivers out there are FOCUSED ON DRIVING.

The below listed article was taken from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation's website for the purpose of helping non-motorcycling drivers to understand motorcycles and to help them think about the motorcycle rider as a Person with a Family.

According to NHTSA, "Distracted driv-

ing killed 3,477 people on America's roads in 2015." Now, April has become National Distracted Driving Awareness Month. The MSF has put together a list of 10 things cagers* need to know about driving around motorcycles. I hope you're not reading this on your iPhone from the driver's seat.

- 1. There are many more cars and trucks than motorcycles on the road and some drivers don't "recognize" motorcyclists. They ignore them, usually unintentionally. Look for motorcycles, especially when checking traffic at an intersection.
- 2. A motorcyclist may look farther away than he or she is in actuality. It may also be difficult to judge a motorcycle's speed. When checking traffic to turn at an intersection or into (or out of) a driveway, estimate that a motorcycle is closer than it looks.
- 3. A motorcycle can be easily hidden in a car's blind spots or masked by objects or backgrounds outside the car. Thoroughly check traffic, whether you're changing lanes or turning at intersections.
- 4. A motorcycle may seem to be moving faster than it really is. Again, don't immediately rely on your perceptions.
- 5. Motorcyclists sometimes slow down by downshifting or merely rolling off the throttle, thus not activating the brake light. Don't tailgate motorcyclists. At intersections, anticipate that motorcyclists may slow down without any visual warning.
- 6. Turn signals on a motorcycle are often not automatically self-canceling. Some riders, (especially beginners) sometimes forget to turn them off. Try to determine whether a motorcycle's turn signal is for real. And if you're driving a car, remember to use your turn signals too. They're a great communication tool for riders and drivers when used properly.

7. Motorcyclists often adjust position within a lane to be seen more easily, to avoid road debris, and deal with passing vehicles and wind.

Understand that motorcyclists often adjust lane position for a purpose, and it's not an invitation for a car to share the lane with them.

8. Maneuverability can be one advantage for a motorcycle, but don't expect that motorcyclist can always steer or swerve out of harm's way. Please leave motorcyclists room on the road, wherever they are around you.

9. Stopping distance for motorcycles can be nearly the same or better than that of cars. But wet or slippery pavement can put motorcyclists at a disadvantage. Don't violate a motorcyclist's right of way, especially in bad conditions.

10. Don't think of it as a motorcycle, a machine. Think

of the rider; the person on board, as someone's son, daughter, spouse or parent. Unlike other motorists, who are protected by doors, roofs and airbags, motorcyclists have only their safety gear and are at greater risk from distracted drivers.

The Motorist Awareness Program of GWRRA

Through a "Share the Road" campaign we will pursue three aspects of motorist awareness. Each of these three are supportive of each other:

- Awareness Education Providing motorists with First Class, professional education through our certified seminar presentations. Our presentations will be developed for a multitude of audiences, educating them to a better understanding of motorcyclists, the risks involved, a heightened awareness of motorcycle presence and what they as motorists can do in the prevention of crashes.
- Awareness Advertisement Serves as a reminder to motorists that they share the road with motorcycles. Reinforced reminder to the education aspect.
- Public Relations Interaction with the motoring public has the ability to reflect highly on GWRRA and to mold public opinion on how they view motorcyclists.

Our goal in this area is to build a rapport with motorists and leave them with a feeling that motorcyclists are real people who could be their friend, neighbor, or even a relative.

* Cagers is a term used by motorcyclists to describe some one driving a vehicle who is enclosed within a steel frame and is protected from crashes.


