The 25th anniversary AZ Bike Week took place Wednesday April 6th through Sunday April 10, 2022 at West-World in Scottsdale. An estimated 76,000 people attended throughout the event. Area hotels reported a record number of room nights from visiting attendees and each year there is increased demand for camping spaces.

New this year, you could purchase a ticket strictly for the PowerYard.... vendor village, local music, stunt shows, etc ... everything but the headliner concerts ... for just \$12 ... for all five days. The RockYard ticket to see all three nights headliners was \$102... or you could buy a single night ticket to see your favorite. {I heard someone talking about pricing out a ticket for Lynyrd Skynyrd at a TX concert at \$126... So the AZ Bike Week concert series was a pretty cool deal!}

Rather than having all the bike shows grouped up together on one day as in the past, the 'Cycle Source / Torque Magazines Bike Show was held on Friday, with the Paul Yaffe Baddest Bagger Show on Saturday.

Wednesday visitors to the Handlebar Saloon in the PowerYard were treated to a lineup of young talent from Alice Cooper's Solid Rock Foundation... 15 different bands! The evening wrapped with a performance by Co-Op – fronted by Dash Cooper.

The Valley of the Sun is blessed with some seriously talented musicians. Throughout the weekend there was music in the HandleBar Saloon by about 28 local bands. Performances included the Arizona Highwaymen, Bench Warrant,

Black Horse, Christopher Shayne Band, I Don't Know ~ an Ozzy Osborne Tribute, Jaded Jukebox, Ripple Affect, Skarlett Fever, Soundnamkillz, Southbound Rider Band, Stereo Rex, The Rev, and the Whiskey Dogz.

The RockYard was set up inside the North Hall, rather than the open-air arrangement of the past. The new, indoor, RockYard venue provided more technical options to the headliners' light & sound techs; plus some bleacher & other seating options to the fans.

Rob Zombie coming to the Rock-Yard was noted as being a big deal. Apparently he doesn't do as many shows as in past. He was DEFINITELY appreciated by his fans!!
