After retiring to Arizona, Dickson was active in the Tucson Harley Owners Group, where he was a safety officer, a road captain, and recently the historian. Dickson was also an enthusiastic tennis player. In 2005, he represented the GV Tennis Club at the USTA National Mens' 3.5 Doubles Tournament after winning the National Sections in El Paso.
