They stayed in Tombstone, traveling to Bisbee on Sunday. Their outing for breakfast took them to Erie Street in Historic Lowell. Lowell is a lesser-known spot at the southern end of Bisbee. It is within sight of the Copper Queen Mine. Once another mining town, it was incorporated into Bisbee in the early 1900's. Destruction of the town came with the excavating of the Lavender Pit Mine.

Lowell is an ideal side trip for photographers, whether Professional or Hobbyist. Although no longer much of an active community, local volunteers have created a vintage museum of sorts. The street has a lot of older buildings that are now setup to give the street a nostalgic look, circa 1950s. You can see from the photos that there are older cars parked on the street, old gas pumps, a movie theater, & other memorabilia of an era long-gone. There is a Harley Davidson 'dealership'. It's more or less just a storefront with bikes in the windows and all the usual signage. While there is an operating breakfast stop in Lowell, called the Bisbee Breakfast Club, this group was disappointed and so

cannot recommend it.

For their next trip down that way they plan to stay in Bisbee and will go when it is cooler.
