#### Library Corner - Phase 3 - Library Capacity Increase Project - Completed.....:

As reported in our last issue, we have been working to increase our Music Library capacity in the Band Room to accommodate a further 400+ pieces and at the same time creating space elsewhere to consolidate the majority of our unsorted music. Thanks to help from Karen and Victoria back on 15<sup>th</sup> October, as part of a broader sort out of storage at MCC, this has now been completed and over the course of the coming weeks we will be moving more of our unsorted music to the upstairs store room; as pictured on shelving above the Scout & Guide Band drums, some is already in place. This gives us 12 to 18 months band room library capacity as our librarian Sue continues to catalogue unsorted scores.
