#### Back to Rehearsals - A Post Pandemic attendance record as we returned to 2 hour rehearsals:



Our 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday Year began with a move back to 2 hour rehearsals on 11<sup>th</sup> January that attracted a post pandemic record turnout. A survey of your favourite pieces took place between 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> January (with some stragglers allowed) and big thanks to Sue and Stuart for getting the library list together to help jog memories. Thanks to the vast majority of members who took part and based largely on the results, we have been able to inform Maren of the selected pieces so they can plan rehearsals accordingly. #### Library Corner - Out with the Old and In with the New (old) as our pads get a retro makeover:



Not since well before the pandemic have our pads been subject to such an overhaul which began in earnest at our first rehearsal back after the festive break, on 11<sup>th</sup> January. An incredible 31 pieces were handed back and around 17, largely comprising favourites you have chosen from our three decades, have gone out so far to form the nucleus of programmes that will feature throughout this celebratory year. Such a turnaround has posed a significant challenge for our Librarian Sue who is to be congratulated on progress so far; cataloguing all 31 returning pieces whilst, with good support from Stuart, distributing parts for our 2023 pads.

Attention all members: In sorting out the returned pieces there are some that are missing parts and Sue will compile a list that will be posted on Facebook, circulated with the registration email and added to our notice board at MCC giving everyone a chance to have

a root through their collections and return any missing parts to the Library via Sue as soon as possible.

<u>In addition:</u> other than our percussionist, no rehearsal pads are to be taken home and that includes pieces from within the pads. It may be possible to arrange copies or you can take photos of parts and print for personal use but no actual pieces to be taken home. Thanks

As mentioned previously, to support longer term growth and sustainability of our band, provide opportunities in music for all ages from relative beginners to returners who have had a break from playing and opportunities for current members to contribute to the Training set up too, we are ready to begin creating this valuable legacy in this, our 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday Year.

The **'Junior Comets'** were formed on 14<sup>th</sup> January 1998 originally under the Baton of **Avril Duncan** but sadly, this section of our band ceased to exist around 2007. But, with an added adult dynamic, a training / development band is something we are aiming to resurrect this year.

The first stage is to look at all the logistical and legal matters that need to be addressed including, making changes to our constitution, safeguarding, first aid considerations and much more.

To help achieve this, myself and Ruthanna from the main Exec Committee, will be establishing a sub – Committee to report back and oversee the creation of our training and development band. Former Principal Conductor, Alan Cottrill and his wife Jane (Trombone and flute) have kindly agreed to contribute advice and guidance based on their experience in running Werneth Youth Concert Band for many years. In addition, from within our current ranks, so far Joe Greenway and Stuart Fieldhouse have offered support to the discussion too. #### A tribute to one of our own - Amy Dorothy Farnell 7th August 1937 - 29th January 2023

Amy had struggled with various ailments these past few weeks in particular and was admitted to NMGH on 21<sup>st</sup> January passing away peacefully in her sleep in the early hours of Sunday 29th. Following her sad passing, on behalf of the Band's Executive Committee, the wider membership and supporter base, we extend our sincere condolences, thoughts and prayers to her Husband (and our founder) Derek, daughter Wendy, son Nigel, her sister Barbara and all their family and friends, at this sad and difficult time.

Although Amy's support for Derek and our band (and indeed before 1993, with the Scout & Guide Band) was largely in the background, nevertheless it was crucial to the smooth running, in particular of our band, for many years. Back in late 1992, when Derek let me know that he intended to retire his position of Bandmaster of the Scout and Guide Band at the end of the 92/93 season (after a decade of growth and huge success locally, regionally and nationally), he confided that he wanted to set up an independent marching / concert band in Crumpsall. Discreetly, word of this was passed amongst fellow senior instructors and at the end of 1992 Amy and Derek hosted a confidential meeting at their house, to begin looking at future banding options for Crumpsall. Amy was ever the perfect hostess keeping us plied with tea and cakes and contributed her valued opinions to the conversation as an alternative future moved from concept to a real possibility following several such meetings at 82 Crumpsall Lane, in the early months of 1993.

Like all involved in the creation of our band, Amy was keen to ensure we honoured all commitments to the Scout and Guide Band right up to Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1993 (the end of the season) ahead of our official formation the following day. Ahead of this, and in particular at an inaugural meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> July 1993 to launch a constitution and framework for the new band (to be known then as Crumpsall Marching Band), Amy was elected onto the Committee as our first Treasurer. Amy was the natural choice as she ran her own business and was the serving Treasurer at Methodist Church Crumpsall. Amy held the Treasurer position on the band Executive Committee for almost 20 years up to her retirement in the summer of 2012.

In addition, Amy served refreshments at band rehearsals from 1993 (20p a brew) being succeeded by Les and Norman from 2012 and also helped Derek in a librarian capacity to manage the music donated from his personal collection and that he'd acquired from countless sources over many years. Amy was also a fine seamstress and hastily made green bow ties to finish off our first uniform for

our first performance when we were just 1 week old. She made a whole batch of red waistcoats for the band too and these were part of uniform for many years from around the turn of the century. Without all this selfless service and support it's hard to imagine how we would have managed, particularly financially, especially in those crucial early years. It goes without saying that we owe Amy a huge debt of gratitude and her enduring legacy of contributing to a firm foundation, will see us long into the future, I'm sure. Thanks Amy and may you rest in peace, Rob

Our tribute to Amy, continues in words and pictures; the latter being hard to find as Amy was our photographer for many years therefore not often found in shot. However, we found a few which can be seen below with band member memories interspersed too, but first, we go right back to the beginning leading to a marriage lasting over 64 years:


Amy Dorothy Graham was born on 7<sup>th</sup> August 1937 spending her early years living on Walney Island, near Barrow, with her parents Sidney and Greta. Her younger sister Barbara was born into war time Britain in August 1944 and during the winter of 1947 the family moved to No3 Linn Street, Crumpsall, Manchester.



The family attended Crumpsall Park Methodist Church where Amy joined the 7<sup>th</sup> Crumpsall Guides and she transferred her schooling from Walney to Crumpsall Lane Primary for the final months of her Junior education. Amy as a Girl Guide, is pictured right, aged 13 holding the flag, stood alongside Guider Margaret Hargreaves (now Phair), in the grounds of the Methodist Church on a sunny June day in 1951.



Her future husband Derek, being almost 3 years older, was, a Rover Scout in the 209<sup>th</sup> Group at the Church and by this stage was already in the Scout Band with good friend Cliff Bevan. Some time later a budding romance between Derek and Amy flourished and following Derek's National Service in Iserlohn, Germany, the

The following day, Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> October 1994, **Amy had arranged a surprise 60th birthday party for Derek** at the Methodist Church to be attended by 90 guests with a **fanfare team** from the band comprising **lan Burke** *Bass*, **Dave Lynch** *Trombone* and *Trumpets*, **Mandy Burke**, **Julie Lynch** and **Rob Fullen** announcing Derek's arrival into the main hall followed by applause and a large shout of "SURPRISE" from all the guests. How Amy kept that quiet I'll never know; especially at the Jumble Sale fundraiser the day before when most if not all of us helping out (except the main man of course) were in on our sneaky treasurer's big secret. **The following article featured in Volume 2 Issue 2 of the orginal 'Herald' Newsletter of our Band:** 







**VE/VJ Day Anniversary Celebrations – MCC - 10<sup>th</sup> July 2005** that featured an afternoon of music accompanying the MCC garden party. The main **Concert Band** was conducted by Derek in a combination of his old Scout & Guide Band Uniform topped with his hat from the 3<sup>rd</sup> Kings Hussars Band that he retained after being demobbed from National Service in 1958. **Amy is pictured alongside Derek, fully embracing the historic celebrations.** 

**Doug Graham** conducted our **Junior Comets** during the afternoon too and the **Crumpsall Scout** & **Guide Band** played ahead and after the morning's thanks giving service.

On a smaller scale, Derek gets his own back on Amy following her surprise for his 60th in 1994 by organising a band line up to **serenade Amy** with a rendition of Happy Birthday on her 60th in August 1997 on the front drive of their home on Crumpsall Lane. This made the front page of our October 1997 issue of the band's newsletter, renamed 'Dun Blowin', and the band line up that morning from Left to Right was Barbara Shaw, Cymbals, **Trumpeters** Dumville and Rob Fullen with Jonathan and Andrew Shaw on Trombone. Amy enjoyed her surprise 😊

Circa 2009 Amy, in her beautiful garden, captured the moment on film of Derek hanging music from our library to air and dry on their washing line following a flood in the basement of the Parish Hall where our library and stock instruments were once stored. Derek is pictured salvaging the score for 'When the Stars Began to Fall' (a piece that in 2020 would become one of our lockdown recordings and is in our current pads by popular demand) and on the washing line are a set of books called 'First Blow' previously used by our Junior Band. Les, Shirley, Julie and Hilary recall Amy labouring away in the dank, dim, damp basement conditions in the Parish Hall, sometimes aided by Les and Norman, cataloguing music onto handwritten lists whilst the band rehearsed in the relative comfort of the main hall upstairs. During rehearsal breaks,

**Shirley** remembers checking if **Amy** needed a hand. Later, those handwritten lists were transferred to spreadsheets by **Julie** and remained a valuable record of our library that our current librarian **Sue** has developed still further since taking on the role in 2016.

I referred earlier to Amy's lovely garden, their small plots front and back of their home on Crumpsall Lane were year after a year a riotous display of spring and summer colour; various varieties of fuchsia, Japanese Anemones and the full range of summer bedding in pots, tubs and baskets as you can see beneath the fluttering sheets of music. A colourful haven that both Derek and Amy enjoyed relaxing in, when time allowed.

band ahead of retiring from their respective positions a year later.

Amy, on cake cutting duty at the Band's summer concert in July 2012 marking their retirement from

formal positions as **Treasurer** and **Band Leader** respectively, after almost 20 years. **Derek** handed the baton onto **Kathryn Burke** whilst **Amy** passed the books and accounts to Clarinettist, **Margaret Gadian**. **Amy and Derek** remained firm supporters of the band and **Derek** of course returned to active participation on French Horn, post pandemic, in September 2021. **Amy herself loved to receive and read our monthly** 

newsletter as a way of keeping up to date with the band, especially during lockdown.

Further selected memories from some of our band are as follows:

Alan Bernstein remembers – Amy celebrated her 70<sup>th</sup> birthday with a party at Cheetham Hill Cricket Club. A Clarinet quartet from the band played a set and Amy was particularly tickled by one number we played "Once in Love with Amy"

Julie Thompson Remembers - When we went to Bremerhaven (Aug 2011) I remember Amy organising and making lunch for our band and the German band, when we had to spend all day at the venue having

a dress rehearsal for the joint concert we were to put on in the evening. I remember our German colleagues being quite perplexed by the tinned salmon on the sandwiches, I don't think they'd ever had salmon from a tin before!

Hilary Hill Remembers – I think of Amy down in the large basement of our then HQ at St Matthew's Parish Hall, with all the music laid out week after week as she catalogued parts for each piece in our library.

Barbara Shaw Remembers – the last act for many with the Scout & Guide Band (23/7/1993) before our band formed a day later – Amy and Derek organised a trip out into the countryside to their favourite Tea Rooms (Millcroft Tea Rooms, Norden, Rochdale) on a sunny Friday evening. Parents, supporters and bandmembers all joined in a massive game of rounders on a field full of cow pats and we had refreshments in the old tea rooms. The occasion was great and is still talked about to this day. (Ed: this ended one chapter in Amy's Support for banding as another, ours, was about to begin)

He recognises himself in pictures, knows he has played musical instruments (currently thinks he's a saxophonist), knows Brenda and what their relationship is and also recognises his Grandson Alex. Although frustrated at not being able to go home, Doug is in the right place at present and Brenda is extremely grateful for all our thoughts and best wishes to both Doug

and herself. I feel sure you will join me in continuing to send positivity their way in the crucial days and weeks to come. We are all hoping Doug makes as full a recovery as is possible and keeps fighting the fight to this end. Love & best wishes, CCB.
