## Spring Programme - Our pads are beginning to swell with your selected favourites plus others...:




Maren is driving our 2 hour rehearsals really well as we begin to crystalise our efforts around the likely pieces that will be included in the programme for our opening concert of the year, on 1st April. A surprise piece for many, that saw the light of day at our rehearsal last week (22nd Feb), was Sousa's March penned in 1888 High School Cadets. Why is this back in the pads for the first time since 1997? Quite simply, we began life 30 years ago as a Marching Band and indulging our history, this piece was one of the first we played on the march at practice in 1993 and on the streets in 1994. It was also played in early Concert Band repertoires too, in the 1990's. Without spoiling the whole programme for our supporters,

members will have an inkling of what we will be playing at the Spring Concert from recent rehearsals and the finalised set list will be emailed to all members at least a couple of weeks before the event.

# Missing Music - Thanks to those who have responded so far......just a few stragglers to go:

The response in recent weeks to Sue's appeal to return missing parts has been largely successful and thanks to all for searching through your personal pads. However, whilst not a naming and shaming exercise, there are still some key parts missing and Sue can't get the pads back on the library shelves before they are complete once again. This is causing Sue undue stress as it's delaying her in cataloguing unsorted pieces. Please therefore, anyone with outstanding parts to the pieces we handed in at the start of the year, return them ASAP. Thanks, Your Committee

#### Library Corner - Another 45 pieces make the shelves and some more curios are unearthed:



Sue continues to undertake sterling work in our Library in not only identifying, collating and repackaging individual parts from pads (as detailed above) but making a dent in the huge collection of music our band has largely inherited, down the years. Last week (22<sup>nd</sup> Feb), Sue added a further 45 completely catalogued pieces to our



library shelves. Sue informed me at our Exec Committee meeting last night (27<sup>th</sup>), that there are a further **7** pieces that will be added imminently. **That will take us up to 840 fully catalogued pieces**.

Sue is conscious that there is still so much to catalogue and we undertook a stocktake of boxes that are still outstanding. These total 21 boxes at present. Once the missing parts are all back in from already catalogued pieces, Sue intends to redouble her efforts to make serious inroads into those boxes. She knows she is not alone in this daunting task and support is available to help where needed. Thanks to Sue for all her continued hard work as our Librarian.

In sorting a score and all parts for Rossini's William Tell Overture recently, identified some fascinating adverts for instruments on the music from Hawkes & Son which became Boosey & Hawkes Ltd in 1930. Therefore it's probably safe to assume that these adverts first appeared around a century ago.

# **Welcome** – To returning French Horn Player, Geof Blomerley - 8<sup>th</sup> February 2023:



#### **Growing a Legacy - Training Band Sub-Committee Update:**

On Tuesday 21st February the above sub-committee held its inaugural meeting at MCC with the following broad remit:

With direction and support from the band's main Executive Committee, in the spirit of creating a lasting legacy from our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, a Sub Committee is to be established to investigate the feasibility of creating a Training / Development Band as a feeder to the Main Concert Band and to provide opportunities through music for all involved. The sub-committee to feedback to the main Executive with recommendations for approval.

For the inaugural meeting, the Sub-Committee were joined by Alan and Jane Cottrill who imparted valuable advice and guidance from their experience of setting up and running the Werneth Youth Concert Band for ten years up to December 2019. This was very much appreciated and they also provided us with a copy of the safeguarding policy they adopted. Jane and Alan have kindly agreed to offer ongoing advice and guidance should we have any queries ahead of establishing a Training Band dynamic.

Key recommendations were made by sub-committee members Rob, Joe Greenway and Stuart Fieldhouse (apologies received from Ruthanna) and Rob represented the main points to the Executive Committee for approval on 27<sup>th</sup> February:

- Working Title The Training band
- Membership Dynamic Ages 8 to 80(+)
- Structure two groups Beginners and Intermediates (including musicians returning after a break from playing)
- Entry criteria No minimum standard of ability for entry
- Recruitment Various publicity options (including recommendations from members of the main band)
- Instruments Joe and Stuart agreed to build on our current instrument inventory as Quartermasters of our stock.
- Staffing, Music, Uniform to be further discussed
- Proposed venue and timings MCC, Wednesday evenings, meet 5.45pm, rehearsing 6pm 7pm.
- Proposed start subject to being ready, Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> June 2023 to allow a few sessions ahead of the summer break

All the above was well received by the Executive Committee and the Sub-Committee will now move forward in developing the above points in more detail from practical, logistical and constitutional perspectives. Grateful thanks to Alan and Jane for their input and to fellow sub committee colleagues, Joe, Stuart and Ruthanna. We would really appreciate any other members of the band getting involved in planning this exciting aspect of our organisation and please let me know if you are able to help. We have already received encouragement as several former players and relative beginners have expressed an interest in joining. Further updates to follow. RF

Local Artist, Mary Burke, who, amongst other commitments, teaches enthusiastic, budding artists at the College of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Age, C3A (Fridays at our former HQ) was initially approached to understand if she would be able to paint the band as part of our 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary legacy portfolio? Mary was provided with some newsletters and researched pictures on our website agreeing to host some of our committee at her home studio. and Mary was the ideal local partner to work with. Decision made, the initial phase for Mary was to visit us on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> February and make her observations, initially on camera, as we rehearsed. Mary has developed some initial sketches from those pictures and we will continue to work closely with her and keep you informed of progress and timescales as the finished piece takes shape in the coming weeks and months.
