Hello & Welcome to the April 2023 and 50th edition of Your *New Herald* which includes a review of our successful Spring Showcase Concert; our first performance in this, our 30th Birthday Year and in front of a 3 figure audience too. In breaking news we also preview a unique piece of music specially composed for our band's 30th Birthday by former Principal Conductor (2012-2018) and current Trombonist Kathryn 'Kat' Burke titled 'Crumpsall Triumphal'. We look ahead to upcoming engagements scheduled for this term starting locally in May with a Coronation 'Big Lunch' Street Party, Kearsley Road on Sunday 7th May as the Nation celebrates the Coronation of King Charles III in just a few



days' time. We follow this up by playing at the Spring Fair/Coffee Morning on Saturday 13th May to be held at Methodist Church Crumpsall; full details included in *Calendar Dates*, below.



The very first edition of Your New Herald appeared on 23rd Jan 2019 and looked back to the start of our 2018 /19 campaign featuring our 25th Anniversary Concert on 24th November 2018 and here we are today as edition 50 'rolls off the press', celebrating our 30th year. Pictured left, as featured in that debut issue, are Principal Conductors Past, Present & Future: Derek Farnell (1993-2012), Kathryn Burke (2012-2018) and Conductor in waiting, Rosie Kingham (2019) cutting the cake at our 25th Anniversary Concert.

Then and Now - Lee Couser - From Crumpsall to the Coronation:



Lee joined our band at the start of our 2nd season on 7th September 1994 and after being an understudy to the band's original Drum Major, Louise Freeman, Lee made the role his own in 1995 until the Marching element of our band ceased in September 1999. Lee, always looked up to and became inspired by David Hartley who was Crumpsall Scout & Guide Band's National Champion Drum Major three years running at the Royal Albert Hall (1990 – 92) and always wanted to follow in David's footsteps from a time when the mace was taller than he





was. Lee is pictured above right, with his Mum Janet at our Spring Concert and I took the opportuity to show him the certificate he was presented with at our Awards Evening in July 1997 (signed by Bandmaster Derek Farnell) that we'd found and preserved when sorting out the band room at our former HQ ahead of the move here and which now adorns our 30 Year Wall in the current band room (cert pictured top left). He was chuffed that his old mace is up

on the wall above the doors in the band room too. Below the certicficate, Lee fronts the band as we were about to start our display for the 1997 Awards Evening. Many of the Marching Band also played in the Concert Band during the second half of the evening.

If you zoom in on the picture above there are some familiar faces in the line up still playing today, including Julie Thompson and Kate Burke on Bell Lyre to the left and right of Drum Major Lee Couser and a certain trumpeter (yours truly) on the back row to the back right of the bass drummer, Dave Lynch. Right at the back, stood by the Ladies WC watching events unfold before her, is a 4, nearly 5 year old future Junior Comet and now Trumpet player, Victoria Fullen.

Lee was at our Spring Concert because he was on an impromptu visit home to see his younger sister Rebecca (Becky) who had just had a baby son.

Congratulations to Becky (pictured above right on side drum to the right of the bass drummer at the '97 awards evening) Lee, Janet & all the family. After leaving school / college, Lee joined the RAF Regiment and the day following our Concert he was off back down to London to coordinate and drill 200 service pesonnel taking part in the King's Coronation on 6th May. A far cry from parading around the streets of Crumpsall but such experience clearly stood him in good stead to go on and forge the career serving Queen and now King & Country the way he has. Our Rehearsal Support Team Expands - Welcome to Team CCB and thanks for your support:






