You will not be alone unless you choose to be. We usually have two people a week. So pick your buddy and sign up together or the Horticultural chairs can help find a great partner for you.



Dennis was the artist who created the lifelike "Trail Marker" tree in our mini-park. The 6-foot bronze sculpture was dedicated in 2018 in Antioch. The story goes he was inspired as a young person when he saw his first trail marker tree. The trees were used by Native Americans to designate trails and other points of interest. Dennis was quite the supporter of our club, both verbally and financially, and he will be greatly missed.
