Greetings from the shelter!

We have all seen that evasive cat that lives under a garden shed, in an unoccupied out building or even seen daily walking across the yard. Here at the shelter, we receive dozens of phone calls asking for advice regarding feral cats that are living under decks, in outbuildings or seen hanging around the caller's yard daily.

It is estimated that there are 60 to 70 million feral cats living throughout the United States. While it is hard to truly determine the exact number in Douglas County; based on human population, rural and urban demographics, and other factors, there may be as many as 4,000 to 6,000 feral cats residing here. By definition, feral cats are those that have been born and raised in the wild, or who has been abandoned or lost and turned to wild ways in order to survive. While some feral cats tolerate humans near them, most are too fearful and wild to be approached.

Many of these callers have no problem with the cat being there, but are very concerned about the cat's health and welfare especially when winter approaches. Here are a few ways that you can help these cats and also lead to long term reduction of ferals in our community.

- Create a winterized shelter for them, they can be simple and inexpensive to
 construct. There are many different plans available on the internet, Google "Feral
 Cat Houses" or you can call the shelter and we can provide instructions as well.
- Provide food throughout the year to help them through the long winter months. It is recommended to use either timed feeders or feeding on scheduled times during day time hours so as not to entice other unwanted wildlife onto the property.
- If a feral cat has kittens, there is a good chance of socializing them if you spend some time each day with them once they are moving about. Typically, the kittens can be taken from the mom at 6-7 weeks, at that time they can be surrendered to an animal shelter or rescue organization to be prepared for adoption. Once at the shelter, their socialization will continue and they will be tested for diseases, vaccinated, dewormed, treated for external parasite and spayed or neutered. Doing so, will ensure that they will have safe, life-long homes and will not have to endure the dangers and difficulties of growing up as feral cats.
- Lastly, the most important thing you can do for a feral cat in your community: Utilize
 a live trap to capture the cat and have him/her spayed or neutered. This not only
 reduces the chances of unwanted kittens contributing to the overpopulation
 problem, but can increase the cat's life expectancy. Doing so reduces deaths due to
 birthing, territorial fighting in males with subsequent injuries and diseases found in

intact cats. There are low-cost options avail able through the mobile spay/neuter clinics that LAHS shelter hosts every couple of months. Many individuals have taken advantage of this service and it has made a measureable difference. If every household in Douglas County altered either one male or female feral cat, it would easily prevent the birth of thousands of new kittens. Wow, what an impact that would have!







Rabbit Owners...Contagious Disease Alert!

The MN State Board of Animal Health reported that two indoor rabbits died suddenly in September from a highly contagious rabbit disease detected for the first time in Minnesota. The U of MN Veterinary Diagnostic Lab (VDL) preformed a necropsy to investigate the cause of death. Samples sent to the USDA's National Veterinary Services Lab, confirmed Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus 2 (RHDV2). The owner reported the rabbits were indoor pets and had no contact with other rabbits. RHDV2 is a highly contagious

owner reported the rabbits were indoor pets and had no contact with other rabbits. RHDV2 is a highly contagious virus affecting domestic and wild rabbits. There is no known risk to humans.

Sudden mortality in otherwise healthy rabbits is characteristic of RHDV2. Infected rabbits may be lethargic and reluctant to move, and typically die between 1 to 7 days after becoming infected. 70 to 90 percent of infected rabbits will not survive. Deceased rabbits may have bloody discharge from the nostrils and/or mouth or have no external signs. Unusually high mortality in wild rabbits should be reported to the Dept. of Natural Resources.

RHDV2 is highly contagious and spreads through contact with infected rabbits or indirectly through blood, urine, and feces. The virus can also be present on contaminated clothing, footwear and surfaces such as cages, feed, water, and bedding. Insects, scavengers, and predators can also spread the virus by contact with infected rabbits. RHDV2 is very persistent and it is resistant to extreme temperatures and can survive freezing.

The Board of Animal Health has announced that there is vaccine that is being made available in MN. For more information, you can visit their website to view the press releases at https://www.bah.state.mn.us/news_release/. Rabbit owners should contact their veterinarian for recommendations and vaccine availability.
