BEYOND RESURRECTION

We made it through the somber season of Lent and now find ourselves amid Eastertide, the fifty days between Easter and Pentecost. It is an extended season of joy and celebration as we relish Christ's victory through the resurrection and subsequent post-resurrection appearances. We will then observe three important events of the Christian Year: Ascension Day (May 12), Pentecost (May 19), and finally, Trinity Sunday (May 26).

The Feast of Ascension, or Ascension Day, concludes the Easter story. It takes place forty days after Easter and ten days before Pentecost. If you do the math, you will see that it is typically a Thursday but is often celebrated on Sunday. The significance of the ascension is twofold: It is a celebration of the bodily ascension of the risen Christ into heaven, and it signifies the beginning of our mission to spread the Good News.

After the Ascension, we will experience Pentecost, where I hope the sanctuary will be a sea of **RED**. Pentecost is a season that focuses on the Holy Spirit's work within the people of God, the Church. It is celebrated fifty days after Easter and recognizes the Holy Spirit's indwelling presence and the Church's beginning. It is an event defined by unity and prayer and tells the gospel story through the power of the Spirit.

After Pentecost, we enter into the long season of Ordinary Time that will carry us back to where we began: Advent. We kick off this season with Trinity Sunday, a feast celebrating the symbolic nature of the Trinity: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Admittedly, this is no easy topic, much less for a twenty-minute sermon, but it is essential to our faith.

While Christmas and Easter are the two most well-known days of the Christian Year, I hope you see the value of observing the entirety of the Christian Calendar and the richness it brings to our corporate worship and individual study. It is for us a means to "fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith" (Hebrews 12:2, NIV). I look forward to worshiping with each of you as we seek to know Him more through the events of the church year.
