

Message from the Personal Representative to the SGIG, Hattiesburg Valley, Lane Dossett, 33°



Bro. Maynard Edwards, 33°, with the House of the Temple, released a video this month about four practices all Masons should engage in on a daily basis. <u>Here is a link to his video.</u> One of his points was that, at the end of each day, we should reflect on what we did well and what we can improve on.

New Year's "Resolutions." This is both a dirty word many avoid, while others cling to it for hope for a better future. The juxtaposition of how people see the word "resolution" is very similar to the word "obligation," as used by Masons. Many understand the word obligation positively, perhaps in the way the Fourth Degree discusses Duty. They understand it as a promise, both to their Brethren and from their Brethren. There are others that see the word obligation as being tantamount to burden, and therefore negatively.

As Scottish Rite Masons, we study the tenants of many belief systems. In Christianity, we find a similar discussion offered in the Bible regarding Christ's "yoke," which he described as easy. (Matt. 11:29) Many view it as hard and burdensome.

Returning to Bro. Maynard's point, as we finish the year, we should each examine what we did well this year and what we seek to improve. We may call those things we wish to improve a resolution, but we should not be limited by that language. I would offer as Masons we might consider making New Year's obligations or New Year's yokes.

Our measures of success may come in normal ways (e.g., weight loss), but perhaps abnormal ways. Success may be world changing or minor and individual. Regardless, many suggest goals should be ascertainable and measurable.


As I look back over this year, I count it as a success in the most unusual of manners. But, I will remember it, and it has forever changed me, and I consider it a successful year. I met great men and forged new relationships in ways that I never expected. I buried a blood Brother, and I made new Fraternal Brothers. I worked on the Great Work with a few close Brothers. I think I made advancement, and hope I brought a couple with me one or two steps forward. There are Brothers that I wish I could have made a more positive influence on that I simply failed.

On the 28th Degree, Knight of the Sun, Albert Pike states on page 835 of the annotated version of M&D:

It is the *will* that is free: though sometimes that will may be ineffectual. The power *to do* must not be confounded with the power *to will*. The former may be *limited*: the latter is *sovereign*. The *external effects* may be prevented: *the resolution* itself cannot. {Of this sovereign power of the will we are conscious. We feel in ourselves, before it becomes determinate, the force which can determine itself in one way or another. At the same time when I will this or that, I am equally conscious that I *can* will the contrary. I am conscious that I am the master of my resolution: that I may check it, continue it, retake it. When the act has ceased, the consciousness of *the power* which produced if has *not*. That consciousness and the power remain, superior to all the manifestations of the power. Wherefore free will is the essential and ever-subsisting attribute of the will itself.}

There was a period years ago that I felt extremely dissatisfied with my Masonic path, and I did not feel there was anything of substance that was benefiting my life. To an extent, like Pike, I felt the symbols, virtues, and morals were shallow, not practiced by the average Mason and rather lacking. I am thankful that I stuck with it, just as he did. If you feel the same, next year is an opportunity for change. Just this past evening I have enjoyed a great hour long conversation with a Mason in another state that I met this year on symbols and applications regarding the Tree of Life I had never heard of before.

What will 2024 bring to us and our Fraternity? Can we predict it? At the end of the day, we are called to action, and how we view it makes all the difference. Instead of viewing what we must accomplish as a burden, let us count it as a blessing and opportunity.

SEC. 7. Any qualified person residing within the territorial jurisdiction of this Supreme Council may be **proposed** at any Stated Meeting of a Body under its jurisdiction by proposition in writing, signed by one member and seconded by another, also in writing. Such proposition may be made without the knowledge of the person proposed. A Body may, by its bylaws, require candidates to apply for Degrees by petition in writing.


