

Message from the Venerable Master - Masonic Labor

In Masonic circles we constantly here the word Labor. What is Labor? One definition says that having difficulty in doing something despite working hard is labor. Here it is September eve, farmers will be laboring for the winter months ahead, children will be laboring with their school assignments, and we as Masons with continue with our Masonic Labor.

We have all seen it written that Masonic Labor is a labor of love. Those who expect wages of silver and gold will be disappointed. Our wages are earned by our dealings with each other. Sympathy begats sympathy, kindness begats kindness and helpfulness begats helpfulness.

The XXIX Degree of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite portrays the Symbolism of Labor. It is one of the most beautiful features of the Masonic Institution that it teaches not only the necessity, but the nobility, of labor. Among the earliest of the implements in whose emblematic use it instructs its neophytes is the Trestle Board, the acknowledged symbol of the Divine Law, in accordance with whose decree 199 labor was originally instituted as the common lot of all; and therefore, the important lesson that is closely connected with this symbol is, that to labor well and truly, to labor honestly and persistently, is the object and the chief end of all humanity.

To work out well the task that is set before us is our highest duty, and should constitute our greatest happiness. All men, then, must have their trestle boards; for the principles that guide us in the discharge of our duty--the schemes that we devise--the plans that we propose--are but the trestle board, whose designs we follow, for good or for evil, in our labor of life. Earth works with every coming spring, and within its prolific bosom designs the bursting seed, the tender plant, and the finished tree, upon its trestle board.

Old ocean works forever--restless and murmuring--but still bravely working; and storms and tempests, the purifiers of stagnant nature, are inscribed upon its trestle board.

And God himself, the Grand Architect, the Master Builder of the world, has labored from eternity; and working by his omnipotent will, he inscribes his plans upon illimitable space, for the universe is his trestle board.

Be diligent in the pursuit of building your own spiritual temple. The plan laid on the trestle board reflective of the Supreme Architect is irrelevant without the fine work of its craftsmen. To capture the full beauty of your creator's design, one must meticulously and faithfully apply each lesson to their life. Only then, can a Mason relish in the true glory of our fraternity and

brotherhood.

Kabbalah Corner

On the Hebrew word "light" from Genesis 1:14

(Elohim) in the name החות (YHVH), realizing they are one, indivisible. This is the mystery written: Let there be מארת (me'orot), lights, in the expanse of heaven to shine upon earth (Genesis 1:14–15), that the two names be one, with absolutely no division—that מארת (me'orot), lights, spelled deficiently, merge in the name of heaven:⁶³⁶ one together and indivisible, black light with white light, indivisible, and all is one. [12b] This is the white cloud of day and the cloud of fire in the night, as they have said: 'Quality of day and quality of night' to be arrayed by each other to shine, as is said: to shine upon earth.

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633. Let the earth sprout vegetation The verse continues: —seed-bearing plants, fruit trees of every kind on earth bearing fruit with the seed in it.

634. fourth commandment Linked with the fourth day of Creation, on which God said Let there be lights in the expanse of heaven (Genesis 1:14).

האלהים (YHVH) is האלהים (ha-Elohim), God Rabbi Shim'on is alluding to the first line of the Shema, discussed above, which contains both these names and concludes with the word one. In rabbinic literature the two names represent the divine qualities of compassion and justice, respectively. See Sifrei, Deuteronomy 26; Bereshit Rabbah 12:15; 33:3; and 13:3, where הוחי אלהים (YHVH Elohim) is called "a complete name."

In Kabbalah the two names often designate *Tif'eret* and *Shekhinah*, who are essentially one and should not be separated. See *Zohar* 1:4a, 20a, 48b, 91a; 2:161a, 229a; 3:138b (*IR*); *ZH* 70d (*ShS*).

636. מארת (me'orot)...deficiently... In Genesis 1:14, the word מארת (me'orot) is written without vavs, the vowel letters. This deficient spelling is interpreted as alluding to Shekhinah, the moon, who is incomplete without Her partner, Tif'eret, sun or heaven.

See Proverbs 3:33; JT Ta'anit 4:4, 68b; Pesiqta de-Rav Kahana 5:1; Soferim 17:4; Rashi and Minḥat Shai on Genesis 1:14; Zohar 1:1a, 19b, 33b.

On the diminution of the moon, see BT Hullin 60b: "Rabbi Shim'on son of Pazzi pointed out a contradiction. 'It is written: God made the two great lights (Genesis 1:16), and it is written: the greater light... and the lesser light (ibid.). The moon said before the blessed Holy One, "Master of the Universe! Can two kings possibly wear one crown?" He answered, "Go, diminish yourself!"..."



There are several resources available online and in print that can aid a student of the Bible in delving deeper into the actual Hebrew text of scripture. Even without a background in Hebrew, an interlinear Bible can help with a better understanding of what is being said. For example, while an English Bible may simply say "God said," with an interlinear Bible, one can see whether it is El, Elohim, or YHVH speaking. Here is a popular print Bible available on Amazon that preserves the right-to left reading of the Hebrew with a modern ESV translation on the right

margin.


