Exercise 1

Give short answers to the following questions:

- 1. Queenie Bloggs' tribal affiliation is Ngāti Raukawa. What is a better way to write "The Māori writer Queenie Bloggs says..."?
- 2. What special rights do journalists have, compared to members of the general public, to cover hui on a marae?
- 3. Are official spokespeople for a hapū always older?
- 4. What are "taurahere"?
- 5. Where is Auckland's biggest taurahere group from?
- 6. If you needed to travel to all the marae between Manakau and Te Horo on the Kāpiti Coast, what website would help you find how many there were, how to locate them, and each one's iwi affiliation?
- 7. Using the website in question 6, give the number and addresses of marae in this area, and the iwi affiliation of each.
- 8. Find a Maori-to-English dictionary online and explain what is meant if a rugby player says he couldn't play because he had broken his "paemanu".
- 9. Using the same dictionary, explain what is meant if a friend at a hui said she was "hōhā" with a speaker.
- 10. Who is generally credited as having invented "Ka Mate", the All Blacks' usual haka?

Exercise 2

Māori is one of New Zealand's three official languages, the other two being English and Sign. How good is your te reo? Can you sing the national anthem in Māori? Are you confident pronouncing Māori names and place names? If you live in a town or city that has an English name, do you know its Māori name? Would you recognise it if a Māori person used it?
