



REMEMBER - GOOD FRIDAY IS A DAY OF FAST & ABSTINANCE

Fasting means that the amount of food we eat is considerably reduced. This means one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence means that we give up a particular kind of food or drink or form of amusement. Those over eighteen are bound by the law of fasting until the beginning of their sixtieth year, while all over fourteen are bound by the law of abstinence. Common sense should prevail: those who are physically or mentally ill, pregnant, nursing, or who perform a job in which their safety would be compromised (eg. Operating heavy machinery) are excused from fasting.

Respect the Silentium Magnum (Deep Silence) in the Church at all time during the Holy Triduum (Maundy Thursday-Easter Vigil)
