### **WISHING YOU ALL A BLESSED HOLY EASTER**

In the Catholic Church the traditional greeting on Easter morning is "**Christ is risen**" to which the response is "**He is risen indeed. Alleluia!**" This ancient phrase echoes the greeting of the angel to Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph as they arrived at the sepulchre to anoint the body of Jesus: "*He is not here; for he has risen, as he said*" (Matt 28:6). In the Eastern Orthodox the greeting is "Christ is Risen!" To which is respond is "Truly He is Risen!" (Khristós anésti! – Alithós anésti!)

#### **REGINA CAELI**

Traditionally, The Easter prayer *Regina Caeli* ("Queen of Heaven") is sung during the Easter Season from Holy Saturday until Pentecost, instead of the prayer of the Angelus. Its origins are unknown but we know that it dates back to the 13th century. It reminds us of the Angel Gabriel announcing to Our Lady that her son Jesus is Risen from the death.

Regina Caeli laetare, Alleluia! quia quem meruisti portare, Alleluia! resurexit sicut dixit, Alleluia! ora pro nobis Deum, Alleluia!

Joy fill your heart, O Queen most high, Alleluia! Your Son who in the tomb did lie, Alleluia! Has risen as he did prophesy, Alleluia!

Pray for us, Mother, when we die; Alleluia!
