Let me back up. My question, "Why Lutheran?", was in response to an invitation to attend a new member class at Good Shepherd where I had been visiting. But, I was not a "joiner" at that time in my life. I rather enjoyed being "unaffiliated" after having been in and out of churches, mostly Willow Creek, for the last 8 years. I could go on with my story, but I don't want to lose the significance of the simple question and answer that led to my decision to join a church. I think there may be other people

And maybe some of those folks would wonder, as I did, why they would want to join a Lutheran church when they were never Lutheran. There are, and were, lots of other churches out there without unfamiliar denominational names. And some are so big that no one may ever notice that you haven't joined!

So, why would I want to be a Lutheran? "It's the grace", she said.

"This is where I most fully hear the grace of Christ preached," explained my pastor at Good Shepherd. "There is no sin he won't forgive and even forget, no brokenness he can't heal, no distance he won't come for us, no injustice he won't make right, no suffering he wouldn't endure even unto death on a cross." "For me", she said, "it's the grace". I signed up for the new member class that same day.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. John, Chapter 1.

Blessed be the witnesses at Bethlehem Lutheran in Elgin. It's probably a lot easier to be an evangelist than we make it. It only took 3 words to convince me. "It's the grace."

The received pledge totals for 2018 amount to \$148,108.00. However, even after factoring in the other various sources of income our estimated budget remains **approximately \$6,000 short to avoid a deficit budget.**

The annual congregational meeting will be held on January 28, 2018. There will be a vote on the amendments to the church’s constitution (copies emailed as a pdf file with a printed copy available at the welcome center for those who don’t have email) There will also be a presentation by the strategic committee of the church’s Strategic Plan.

Report of the Pastor: 2,000 invitations for Christmas were mailed to area families and other appropriate places. This was funded through a grant from the Endowment Fund. Thirty Christmas invitations were sent home with CDC families. Posada flyers were distributed to CDC families and local restaurants. There has been one new member inquiry.

The CDC/Fire Code issue remains in limbo as the city fire marshal and the state fire marshal continue to work on agreement.

One of our youth, Bennett Jones, appeared before the council to present his proposal for his Eagle Scout project.

Anyone wishing additional details will find them in the copies of the December minutes available in the folder on the wall near the secretary's office.

CAMPBELL SOUP LABELS FOR EDUCATION PROGRAM ENDING

The Campbell Soup Company has announced that effective **August 1, 2017**, its long-running Labels for Education Program is ending due to declining participation.



“For the past 42 years, Campbell has proudly offered Labels for Education, which has contributed more than \$110 million in school supplies to tens of thousands of schools across the U.S.,” the company wrote in an email. “During the last year, we’ve been assessing the impact of these programs and through this, we’ve seen that participation for Labels for Education has declined considerably. Sadly it is at the point where we have no choice but to make the very difficult decision to wind down the program.” For now the U.S. program will continue as usual and schools without an account can still sign up. The current bonus offer calendar remains in effect until July 31, 2016.

Therefore, soup labels can no longer be accepted in the Bethphage Mission Box by the welcome center.

BETHPHAGE MISSION BOX

Have you noticed the Bethphage Mission box on the stand by the welcome center? That smiling girl on the front is my daughter, Bonnie. She resided at Bethphage for 12 years until her death at age 19. This personal relationship with Bethphage Mission is the reason my grandmother, then my mother, and now I myself have overseen the donations of stamps, as well as Labels and Box Tops for Education, and kept this instruction article in the

church newsletter. Bethlehem Lutheran Church has collected and donated these items for over 40 years.

Here is some general information about what Bethphage (now part of Mosaic, Inc.) can accept.

1. Box Tops for Education found on many Brand name items: Betty Crocker, Bisquick, General Mills, Old El Paso, Pillsbury, Land ‘o’ Lakes, Yoplait, Nature Valley, Avery (office/computer supplies), Ziplox, Kleenex, Scott paper products, Hefty, and many more
2. UPC (bar code) labels: Campbell’s, Pepperidge Farm, Spaghetti O’s, Swanson, Prego, Franco American, BIC, Pop Secret, Wolfgangpuck, Glad, Pace, Dannon, and more
3. Bottle Caps: V8 Vegetable Juice, V8 V-Fusion Juice, and V8 Splash Juice Drinks, Prego Pasta Sauces, Campbell’s Ready to Serve Soups (plastic)

When clipping box tops or UPC labels, please be sure to include the **ENTIRE BOX TOP** or **ENTIRE UPC LABEL**. Partial UPC/bar codes cannot be accepted. Bottle caps are relatively new addition to the Box Tops/Labels for Education program. All items can be dropped in the Bethphage box either individually or in envelopes or baggies. There is no need to trim anything. The Craft Circle will gladly do that for you.
