From Pastor Scott

Dear beloveds,

We are now in the middle of summer. Drought conditions have lately been replaced by thunderstorms. Many of you have or are about to take vacations. At Swamp, we are taking a break from Sunday School and Bible study.

And although we take breaks during the summer, God still calls us to seek him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. Indeed, summer is an opportunity to use some of the free time we gain to listen for God.

Confirmation Camp has just ended (June 18-24) and five youth from Swamp participated. Our

study curriculum this year was Listening. Listening with Jesus, listening to God, listening to others. Confirmation had the opportunity to learn about listening via bible study, communication techniques, and prayer activities.

At the core of listening with and to God is prayer. Prayer is an opportunity to snap out of our busyness, social media rabbit holes, and culture-imposed identities to get closer to God. Praying is the most real thing we do, and if summer is when we are most awake, then let it teach us how to pray.

One of the key themes shared with the confirmation campers was the need to make space to listen for God in prayer. They learned techniques such as praying with the scriptures, silent prayer, meditation, breathing, solitude, labyrinths, prayer beads and much more.

As Seth Barnes de-

scribes, in scripture "God implores us over and over to seek him. Why not take a risk and begin searching for the still, small voice of God that may be speaking to you, even today?" 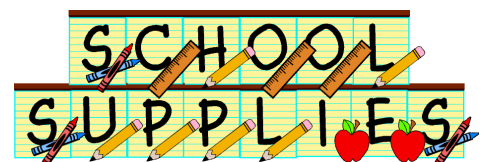

GENEROSITY MINUTE

Generosity Is Paradoxical

Those who give, receive back in turn. By spending ourselves for others' well-being, we enhance our own standing. In letting go of some of what we own, we better secure our own lives. By giving ourselves away, we ourselves move toward flourishing. This is not only a philosophical or religious teaching; it is a sociological fact. The generosity paradox can also be stated in the negative.

By grasping onto what we currently have, we lose out on better goods that we might have gained. In holding onto what we possess, we diminish its long-term value to us. By always protecting ourselves against future uncertainties and misfortunes, we are affected in ways that make us more anxious about uncertainties and vulnerable to future misfortunes. In short, by failing to care for others, we do not properly take care of ourselves. It is no coincidence that the word "miser" is etymologically related to the word "miserable."

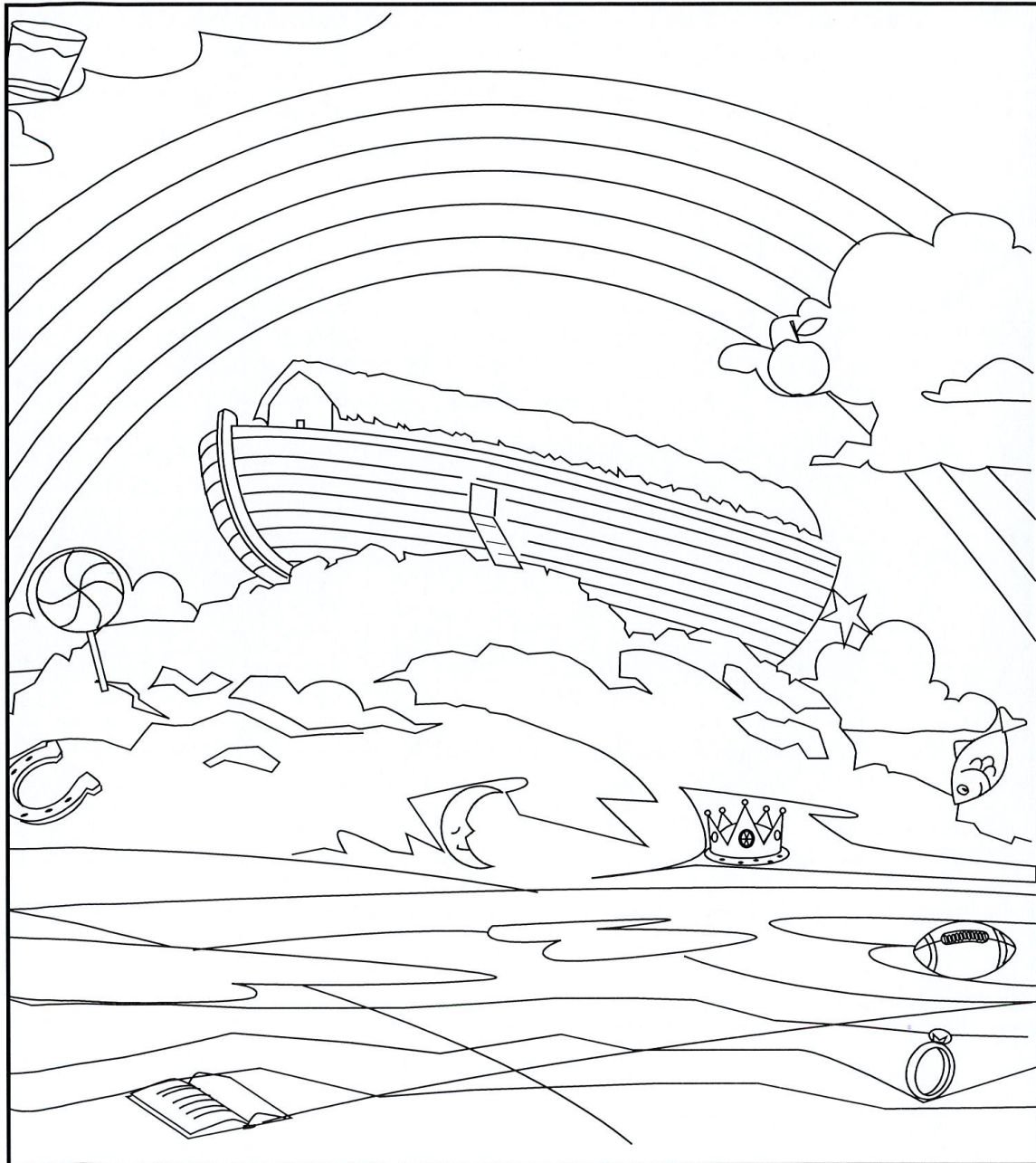
