Pastoris Message

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world. (Introduction to Pentecost Sunday from Sundays and Seasons.)

On May 19, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday with four students who will affirm their baptisms in the Rite of Confirmation. For these young people, it is the beginning of a new phase of relationship with Christ and the Church.

Looking ahead, on June 2, we begin our new worship format with one service at 8:30 am. A blend of the 8 and 9 am formats, for most, it will look very similar to our usual summer worship. You will notice less formality too.

In the fall, with the return of the choir, you will notice their contributions to worship along with the introduction of Children's Church (a special educational program for children during the readings and sermon time). Overall, the goal is for us to remain faithful in our worship yet changing to meet the evolving needs of the congregation.

Nevertheless, it is change, and we will need time for us to acclimate. An evaluation committee will be formed to solicit your feedback. So, I invite you all to engage with worship and provide feedback as we evaluate the changes in the coming months.

In this season of Pentecost, let us all be empowered by the Holy Spirit as we learn to worship God and serve our neighbor in new and faithful ways.

Generosity Minute Why should I give to God's Church?

- **Giving is an act of worship.** Whenever we decide to honor God through our giving, we acknowledge His ownership of our resources. <u>Proverbs 3:9</u> says "Honor the LORD with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops". This helps boost our confidence in Him, knowing that He is in control of everything.
- Giving encourages our trust in God. Our giving not only acknowledges the lordship of God over our resources. It also increases our faith in Him. The condition of the heart is in such a way that it is always in despair. Giving helps us to break free of fear concerning our resources and to solely look to God for provision. Malachi 3:10– "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this says the Lord Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."
- Giving frees us from the love of money. 1 Timothy 6:17 says "Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment". The Bible constantly warns us about the love of money. One effective way of releasing ourselves from the bondage and lust of the love of money is by giving. As good stewards of God, we are to take control of money not vice versa.
- Giving advances the Kingdom of God. This should be the heartbeat of giving for every Christian.
 Our giving is a form of partnership with God with respect to the gospel. When we sponsor the gospel
 of Christ, we are fulfilling the will of God concerning His kingdom. Financial resources are important

 proclaim the gospel in different locations, set up buildings, help the needy, poor, orphans and widows.
 This really makes God happy.
- Giving opens doors of blessing and opportunities to express God's love. As said by Paul the Apostle in Acts 20:35, "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive'". Giving not only proves our love for the Lord. It is also a sure way to have God's blessings flowing in and through our lives. God promises to honor His Word and there are a number of scriptures which show that the Lord will take care of us. One such is Philippians 4:19.
