

# COYOTE CREEK APPROVED PLANT LIST

## Sorted by Plant Type\*

All landscaping must be approved by the Design Review Committee before installation. Refer to the Landscape section of the current Design Guidelines for details regarding the approval process, standards and restrictions.

### Categories of Landscaping:

**1. Enclosed**—all areas surrounded by and/or hidden from view by walls or fencing (ex. backyards, side yards or courtyards)

**2. Primary**—all open or non-enclosed areas adjacent to homes and/or structures within the build area (i.e. the front, sides and rear of the structure as well as the outside of perimeter walls), as well as the edges of driveways.

**3. Restored**—all areas both inside and outside of the designated build area that have been disturbed by construction (ex. leach fields, access roads, temporary earth movement, etc.)

### Application:

This plant list governs all **Primary** and **Restored** areas within Coyote Creek. Only those plants listed are permitted in these areas. Homeowners are encouraged to use only the plants on this list within all **Enclosed** areas. However use of plants not on the list may be requested and will be allowed if approved by the Design Review Committee.

### Restrictions:

- 1) No palms of any kind are permitted in any area within Coyote Creek.
- 2) No skyline trees (defined as any tree exceeding 35' in height at maturity) are permitted in any area within Coyote Creek.
- 3) Any tree on the approved list that grows to a height exceeding 35' must be trimmed to a level at or below that limit height.
- 4) All palms, skyline trees and/or unapproved plants are subject to removal at Homeowner's expense upon notification by the Homeowner's Association.
  
- 5) No lawns (live grass or synthetic) are permitted in the **Primary** or **Restored** areas.

**\* Please validate Botanical name and species/genus when making selections to ensure compliance as Common names may be misleading.**

## **Key to Headings and Symbols**

### **Allergenicity (AL):**

- a - strongly allergenic
- b - moderately allergenic
- c - weakly allergenic
- n - none

### **Bloom Season:**

Periods during the year when blooms, if any, are present.

### **Botanical Name:**

The formal scientific name of a plant conforming to the International Code of Botanical Nomenclature (ICBN)

### **Common Name:**

The names of plants often vary from region to region. Many plants have several common names, and many common names refer to several distinct plants.

**Check the Botanical Name to ensure compliance.**

### **Flower Color:**

The color of blooms, and if any, includes annotations for fall color and berries.

### **Growing Season (GS):**

**Wi** - winter - apply water September through March; less frequently in off season.

**Su** - summer - apply water March through September; less frequently in off season.

### **Hardiness (HARDY):**

**h** – Hardy. Suffers no damage at 20 degrees F or below

**sh** – Semi-hardy. Some dieback in a hard frost (mid- 20's F)

**t** – Tender. Severely damaged or killed in a hard frost (at or below 32 degrees F)

**Note: The timing and duration of the freeze as well as the temperature the following day and night will affect the severity of damage to the plant.**

### **Height (H):**

Mature plant height measured in feet.

### **Invasive (INV):**

**Yes** - May spread and intrude into natural areas.

**No** - Does not spread

### **Origin:**

**CD** - Chihuahuan Desert - includes north central

**SD** - Sonoran Desert - includes arid and semi-arid areas of NW Mexico, SE California and most of Arizona south of the Mogollon Rim.

**Note:** Others countries of origin spelled-out or self-explanatory

### **Plant Type (PT):**

**A** - accent plant

**P** - perennial

**An** - annual

**S** - Shrub

**C** - cactus

**Sc** - succulent

**Gc** - groundcover

**T** - Tree

**Gr** - ornamental grass

**V** - vine

### **Spreads in Cultivated Areas (SCA):**

**Yes** - May spread by seed or sucker in urban or cultivated area and in disturbed soil.

**No** - Not likely to spread

### **Toxicity (Toxic):**

**Yes** - May be harmful if eaten

**No** - Not known to be harmful

### **Water Use (WU):**

**1** - Very low; irrigate every 3-4 weeks during the growing season after establishment.

**2** - Low; irrigate every 2-3 weeks during the growing season after establishment.

**3** - Moderate; irrigate weekly during the growing season after establishment.

**Note:** Most plants require regular irrigation during the first 2 - 3 year establishment period. Average annual rainfall for Tucson is 11" 12"; in low rainfall years the plants on the list may need additional irrigation to maintain good appearance and plant health.\*

### **Width (W):**

Mature canopy size measured in feet.
