- Service for those who don't seek it—needs assessment and outreach
- Dental care for all—and for those who don't seek it (education and outreach)
- Home health care for anyone who wants it
- · Long-term care for anyone who needs it/wants it
- Behavioral Health care for anyone who wants it
- · Homeless outreach with behavioral health care
- Nutritional assistance/education (for disabled, children, everyone)
- Free flu shots, free school vaccines
- Free programs to test and treat sight, hearing, and learning problems
- Local care in all specialities for cancer and cardiac diseases
- · Planning support and care for people with difficulties do these for themselves
- A local electrical burn-care facility
- Navigation services—case management, life coaches, transportation
- Advocates for people who don't understand the medical system, counseling
- · Ambulances used for ambulance duties
- Emergency phone lists answered by real people
