Above all, share the love of God that we find in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, so that a legacy of salvation can continue for generations. In the days to come, the family of faith will need each other more than ever. With the aid of Jesus Christ our Lord and the presence of the Holy Spirit, we will navigate the challenges ahead and continue our faithful service as a church family. On this, our 142<sup>nd</sup> anniversary, I pray that God will continue to bless our congregation as a fellowship and family of blood-washed believers.

## CHURCH HISTORY

In September of 1882 a servant of God, Rev. Henry Outlaw, was inspired of the Holy Spirit to conduct evangelist services in an old weathered building known as "The Old Red Barn". In March 1802, the church saw its first group of baptized believers. The name of the Old Red Barn was changed to the First Baptist Church of Lambert's Point by a vote of fourteen churches. Rev. Madison was pastor at that time. In 1894 the church pioneers erected the first structure that would be the First Baptist Church of Lambert's Point. Between 1894 and 1800, First Baptist was blessed to have its pastors and Reverends C.E. Lomax, J.B. Buckner and John Boone.



In 1899, the Rev. Dr. David D. Jennings became pastor. The next 38 years the congregation. under his leadership, grew numerically and spiritually. Church building at 45th street and Parker Avenue was built (1912) as well as the annex in the rear of the church (1922). The church suffered a great loss with the passing of Rev. Jennings in 1933. In 1939 the church was blessed by Rev. Dr. J. Jasper Freeman becoming the pastor and an educational center was purchased across the street. The church also creeted and paid for a church parsonage located at 1344 West 46th street. In 1949 Dr. Freeman accepted a call to Queen Street Baptist Church.

Rev. M.C. Sutherland was called as pastor in 1950. Under his leadership,a regulated kindergarten was established as one of the few in the city of Norfolk. Rev. Sutherland left to become the pastor of Bethany Baptist Church in 1955. The Rev. H. Hudson Bobbitt became our pastor in 1955. Under his leadership, the church broadcast Sunday evening services over the WRAP radio station. Rev. Bobbitt left in 1963 to become the pastor of Leadenhall Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland.

After the departure of Rev. Bobbitt, the church officers and members purchased the property of Burrows Memorial Baptist Church at 38th Street and Bluestone Avenue. In November of 1963, Rev. Dr. O.B. Burson came to lead the congregation. In September of 1964, Dr. Burson marched the congregation from the church on 45th Street to the new church on 38th and Bluestone Avenue. He and the church family remodeled the sanctuary. Dr. Burson established well rounded programs to meet all age groups in the church. In 1969, Rev. Burson left FBCLP to be come the pastor of Holy Trinity Baptist Church in Brooklyn, New York. Later on in 1969, Rev. Dr. M.L. Williams became our pastor. Under his leadership, the Board of Christian Education was organized and the church acquired four parcels of land that extended from Bluestone Avenue to Bowden's Ferry Road. Rev. Dr. Marvin Williams retired in December 1989 after 20 years of service.

In December of 1990, Rev. Anthony C Paige was chosen to be the pastor and installed in 1991. Many changes took placed under Rev. Paige's leadership. The church marched into a new Worship Center and atrium that connects the old and new structure on September 21, 2003. Over 40 new ministries became active in the church. Some of these include the free adult health clinic that was started at the church: the renovation of the kitchen and fellowship hall; a free week of all-day summer camp for children; commissioning of Missionaries and also the church was awarded a \$7.3 million grant by the U.S. Dept of Housing and Urban Development, jointly with a California non-profit management company, to build a housing facility for the elderly. For the first time in the history of church, women were licensed and ordained into the ministry and the church elected female deacons. Rev. Paige was very active in the community. He served on the Norfolk City Planning Commission and on the Board of Visitors at ODU. Rev. Paige served on the State Board of Correction. Rev. Anthony Paige retired in November 2021 from FBCLP after 30 years of faithful service. In February 2024, the church elected Rev. Primas O. Paige Sr. to be the 13th Pastor of First Baptist Church of Lambert's Point. We, the congregation look forward to working alongside Pastor Primas to fulfill the vision God has for his people.
