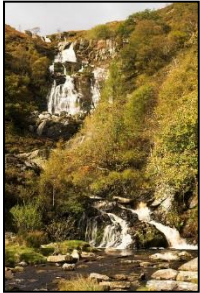


LAKE VYRNWY

The Vyrnwy Reservoir

The original village of Llanwddyn was flooded and rebuilt further downstream to make way for the man-made reservoir, which holds 13 000 million gallons of water. It is a catchment area gathering and supplying clean drinking water.

The periphery of the lake is around 12 miles.

"The Giant Hand of Vyrnwy"

Was carved into what used to be Wales' tallest tree, which was felled in March 2011, after it sustained damage from the storms.



The Vyrnwy Dam

Started in 1881, completed in 1888, overflowed for the first time in 1889, the Dam is a Grade I listed building, providing up to 57 million gallons of water to Liverpool

The Straining Tower

controls the draw-off level and filters the water for Liverpool.



Built in the 19th century, the Hotel owns the sporting rights to the estate and the fishing rights to the lake.
