THE TRUTH IS...

"If therefore your eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light...No man can serve two masters." (Mat. 6:24, 26)

There is an old story about how we see things. Suppose that a dozen people are all standing on one side of a wall and each person stands at one of various sized openings in the wall. Viewing the scene on the other side of the wall through the opening assigned to each one, the individual will then see all there is within a certain radius. One person may say, "I see the whole world; in it are trees and fields." Another looking through a larger opening has a more extended view says; "I see trees and fields and houses; I see the whole world." The next one looking though a still larger opening exclaims: "Oh! You are all wrong! I alone see the whole world; I see trees, fields, houses, rivers and animals", etc.

This story applies to how we see our relationship with Spirit. One of our co-founders of Unity, Charles Fillmore said, "Man came out of God, is of the same mind elements, exists within the mind of God always. Yet by thinking that he is separate from omnipresent Spirit he has set up a mental state of apartness from his source and he dwells in ignorance of that which is nearer to him than hands and feet."

The fact is each of us views our world similarly. We see it according to the size of the aperture through which we are looking. The aperture is our consciousness and how we interpret what we see is based on our beliefs. The main reason we see ourselves as separate from Spirit is that we are looking at or focusing on the difficulties in our lives as having a reality and belief that they can hurt us. Also, this sets us up to live without the guidance from Spirit that would help us to experience life with less suffering from evil or sin on our part or from others.

Many religious doctrines use the reason human beings experience evil and sin is because of what is termed "the fall of humankind" from God's grace. And as such, the fall means there is something inherently wrong with us. The result is that humankind is now sinful and there is a resulting disfavor with God. This means we must now prove ourselves worthy of God's favor over and over in some way and this idea of inherent wrongness is part of more than just Christian philosophy. Oh and by the way, there is no real hope of overcoming this inherent wrongness about us.


The New Testament word for sin ("amartia" in Greek) means literally to miss the mark. In the Old Testament, the corresponding Hebrew word is "het". It is the same word that an archer would use if he missed the target. This benign meaning of sin is important to realize. Sin—missing the mark; that is, we are simply falling short of the target of living divine perfection or wholeness. Sin is our failure to express the attributes of Being—life, love, intelligence, wisdom, and other God qualities in any given moment.

To me, it is significant that we understand the benign character of the word sin. It is true we do not always live up to our potential as a child of God. However from a spiritual standpoint, it is much like when a child learning to crawl and walk falls down or can't get in rhythm. If we would see ourselves in unconditional love then, it brings us to see that our falling short is a more a matter of being out of rhythm than inherent wrongness of our being. By doing so we can more readily forgive ourselves and others if we fall short of our potential in any given circumstance.



I would encourage everyone to stop focusing on the seeming differences, issues and lesser things, and seek but for one thing—the consciousness of the indwelling God in you and in your life. When we do there is a lessening of the sense of separation from God. Just as there is less separation between the spokes of a wheel the nearer that they get to the hub. You will find the nearer you get to the Center, which is our Father/Mother God, the less separation will you see from the world. Are you seeing evil, are you trying to serve two masters, two powers, good and evil? Try focusing all your perceptions to the center of your being. Therefore, let thine eye be single. Perhaps our teacher knew what was needed.
