Introducing THE BOOK OF REVELATION Revelation 1:1-6 – Nov. 15, 2020

1. Many people are interested in the future. They read:

Horoscopes, Tarot cards, palm readers, feed on science fiction, call psychic hot lines, delve into the occult, seek mediums, call up the spirits of the dead etc.

But I think most recently, the moving of the US embassy on May 14, 2018 and then the onset of CoVid19, along with and the signing of the Abrahamic Accord on August 13, 2020 by **United Arab Emirates**, joining Jordan 1994, and Egypt 1979.

Coupled with the US Congress proposing a number of bills discussing the invocation of a digital dollar this year along with the creation of the Digital Dollar Foundation.

I'm quoting from the Forbes article posted on 7/1/20: **US Moves Closer to Digital Dollar** reports:

"On June 30th, the Senate Banking Committee held a hearing on the future of the digital dollar. The pressures to create a digital USD are mounting as China recently began testing its own digital currency - the DCEP, which will be included in popular applications like WeChat and AliPay. Of particular concern is widespread adoption of a digital yuan in emerging markets and in international trade."

2. As much as we would like to know the future, there is only One who knows and declares the future and that is God.

<u>Is. 45:21</u> Tell ye, and bring *them* near; yea, let them take counsel together: who hath declared this from ancient time? *who* hath told it from that time? *have* not I the LORD? and *there is* no God else beside me; a just God and a Saviour; *there is* none beside me.

3. Only in the Bible can truth be found about the future. The Old Testament prophets such as Isaiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Joel and Zechariah provide glimpses of the future.

Jesus opened up some more when He gave the Olivet Discourse.

4. But the book of Revelations gives the most detailed look into the future of all the books in the Bible.

Revelation unveils the future history of the world, all the way to history's climax in the return of Jesus Christ and the glorious setting up of His glorious earthly kingdom and eternal kingdom.

IN THE INTRODUCTION JOHN LISTS SEVEN CHARACTERISTICS OF THIS BOOK. LET'S TAKE THIS HOUR TO EXAMINE THEM.

(1) IT IS A REVELATION

The Revelation v. 1a

The book of Revelation confuses many. As a result, many allegorize it. They often see this book as an indecipherable mystery.

But God is not hiding the truth from us. He is revealing it to His children.

It is the last chapter in God's story of redemption. The Book of Revelation tells us how it all ends.

As the book of Genesis tells us the beginning of all things so the book of Revelation tells us the end of all things.

1. Revelation (*apokalupsis*) appears 18x in the NT.

It means "to become visible."

2. In <u>Luke 2:32</u> the term "Revelation" is translated as **"light."**

"A light to lighten (for Revelation to) the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel."

A light *to reveal* to the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel.

3. In Rom. 8:19 the term "Revelation" is translated, "manifestation."

"For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the **manifestation** (*the Revelation*) of the sons of God.

Or "The earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the sons of God to become visible."

4. In the book of <u>1Cor. 1:7</u> the term "Revelation" is translated as "**coming**."

"So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the **coming** (revelation) of our Lord Jesus Christ

0r,

"So that ye come behind in no gift; **waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ** <u>to</u> <u>become visible."</u>

THE BOOK OF REVELATION CONTAINS TRUTHS THAT HAD BEEN CONCEALED, BUT NOW IT HAS BEEN REVEALED, OR MADE VISIBLE.

- 1. Though it does not directly quote the OT, 278 of its 404 verses refer or allude to the OT.
- 2. The Apocalypse reveals a great many divine truths.
 - a. It warns the church of the danger of sin and instructs it about the need for holiness.
 - b. Warns us to hold fast and overcome Satan
 - c. Reveals worship and majesty
 - d. Reveals the end of human history
 - e. It speaks about the Antichrist, Armageddon, the Millennial reign, the White throne judgment, eternal bliss, the judgment of Satan and the end of sin.

(2) ITS CENTRAL THEME IS "JESUS CHRIST."

"The Revelation of Jesus Christ" – v. 1b

1. It is a revelation **FROM** Jesus Christ – Rev. 22:16

"I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star."

- 2. It is also a revelation **ABOUT** Jesus Christ
 - a. This passage is about the first coming:

<u>Gal. 1:12</u> "For I neither received it of man, neither was I taught *it*, but by the **revelation** of Jesus Christ."

b. This passage is about the second coming 2 Th. 1:7

"And to you who are troubled rest with us, when the Lord Jesus shall be **revealed from heaven** with his mighty angels."

- c. Rev. 2-3 He is revealed as "Lord of the Church."
- d. Rev. 4-22 "He is revealed as the true Ruler of this world where we have a detailed look at His second coming."
- e. Rev. 1:5a He is revealed as the faithful witness

"And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness"

f. Rev. 1:5b He is revealed as the first begotten (born) of the dead

"the first begotten of the dead,"

g. Rev. 1:5c – He is revealed as

"the prince of the kings of the earth"

- h. Rev. 1:8a He is revealed as the "Alpha and Omega"
- i. Rev. 1:8b He is revealed as that "which is, and which was, and which is to come"
- j. Rev. 1:8c "the Almighty"
- k. Rev. 1:17 the first and the last
- l. Rev. 1:18 the living One
- m. Rev. 2:1 he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand
- n. Rev. 2:12 he which hath the sharp sword with two edges
- o. Rev. 2:18 The Son of God
- p. Rev. 2:18b who hath his eyes like unto a flame of fire, and his feet *are* like fine brass
- q. Rev. 3:1 he that hath the seven Spirits of God, and the seven stars
- r. Rev. 3:7 he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth

(2) ITS CENTRAL THEME IS "JESUS CHRIST." V. 1B

(3) ITS DIVINE SOURCE

The book of revelation is the Father's gift to the Son for His perfect, humble, faithful, holy service the Father promised to exalt the Son. – Phil 2:5-11

Its Divine Source

"which God gave unto him" Rev. 1:1c

(4) ITS HUMAN RECIPIENTS

"to shew unto his servants" – Rev. 1:1d

(5) ITS PROPHETIC CHARACTER

"things which must shortly come to pass" - Rev. 1:1e

(7) ITS SUPERNATURAL DELIVERY

"sent and signified *it* by his angel" – Rev. 1:1f

(8) ITS HUMAN AUTHOR

"unto his servant John. Who bare record of the word of God, and of the testimony of Jesus Christ, and of all things that he saw."– Rev. 1:1g-2

(9) ITS PROMISED BLESSING – Rev. 1:3

"**Blessed** *is* he that readeth, and they that **hear** the words of this prophecy, and **keep** those things which are written therein:"

- a. Blessings Rev. 1:3 **Reads**, **Hears** and **Keeps**
- b. Rev. 14:13 Blessed are those that die in the Lord
- c. Rev. 16:15 Blessed is he who **watches and keeps** his garments
- d. Rev. 19:9 Blessed are they which are called to the Marriage Supper of the Lamb
- e. Rev. 20:6 Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection:
- f. Rev. 22:7 Blessed is he that **keepeth** the sayings of the prophecy of this book.

The Greek word for "keep" is *tereo*. It means to watch over, protect, or guard."

(11) ITS BENEDICTION - Rev. 1:4-5a

- a. To the seven churches in Asia (modern Turkey)
- b. Seven Spirits depicts the fullness of the Holy Spirit (Is. 11:2; Zech 4:1-10)
- c. Three titles of Jesus (Faithful, First-begotten and Prince of the kings of Earth)
- d. With Its Exalted Doxology Rev. 1:5b-6

<u>Rev. 1:6</u> And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him *be* glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.
