This venue has been visited in the past and each time it has been a great hit. Bob and Barbara Gardner have been host in years past. I do hope we revisit in a few years.



















Cobra: From Idea to Built (Final)

The title to the Cadillac arrived in the mail and I contacted Allied Recycling in Walpole. They came and picked it up and paid me \$300 for the scrap value. Most importantly, they signed my emissions exemption scrap vehicle form, which is what I really needed!

The Buffalo dealer went to North Carolina and picked up the completed car and dropped it off in my driveway. It sounded amazing coming out of the trailer. I got to drive it to the end of the street and back. It rattled the windows in the garage!

Next task was to get a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) assigned. Superformance ships the cars into the US with no engine or transmission so no VIN is assigned since they are not completed "cars".

In order to get a Massachusetts-assigned VIN number the car has to be hauled (not driven) to an RMV salvage title station for the State Police to inspect. The closest salvage title site was in Bridgewater. I don't own a car trailer so I would have to rent one and hope for good weather since the Cobra has no top and the trailers are open. I had many false starts trying to arrange an RMV appointment, an available trailer, and good weather at the same time. Finally, I was able to borrow an open trailer from Jim Gable's son which meant I could have it here waiting for the right weather. The State Trooper I dealt with was very flexible and I finally got it down to Bridgewater for the inspection. The Trooper was terrific. He inspected the car and as-



signed the Massachusetts VIN number, affixing a sticker with the number on it under the dash.

Now that I had the VIN, I could register the car. The RMV is very specific about what goes on the RMV-1 registration form. This car was "built" (actually became a "car") when the engine and transmission were installed in the rolling chassis in 2019 but it is a replica of a 1965 Cobra. All this has to be in the right fields on the form. For this transaction, registration documents cannot be taken to a regular Registry, they have to be taken to RMV headquarters in Quincy. After dealing with several people there (including of course paying the sales tax!), I had the plates in hand!

The last step was now to get an inspection sticker. The Cobra has no emissions control of any kind. It is electronically fuel injected. It has no OBD-2 port. It has no air bags, anti-lock brakes, stability control or any other assists. As a new car it would pass the safety inspection easily but not the emissions inspection for a 2019 car. This is where the Cadillac came in.

In order to get an inspection sticker, the Cobra would need an emissions inspection.

The sticker process starts with a regular inspection. My contact at the Motorist Assistance Center in Norwood was very helpful. He sent me to Chris's Towing in Walpole. He used to work there and would make sure they knew what to do. I took the car to Chris's and they seemed ready. The car, of course, passed the safety inspection (once they figured out how to turn on the lights, etc.). They put on a black "R" rejection sticker, indicating an emissions failure. I called my contact at the Motorist Assistance Center and made an appointment for him to inspect the car and all my paperwork, especially the signed form regarding the Cadillac's scrapping. I made the appointment but he said I had to go back to Chris's since the technician had entered the reason for the emissions failure incorrectly and had to do the inspection again. I went back to Chris's (dodging a rain shower) and the technician did the inspection again. I was now ready for my appointment at the Motorist Assistance Center.

I finally met my contact at the Motorist Assistance Center in Norwood. They train inspectors at that site so there is a big classroom setup there. He checked the car over, checked the VIN, the registration paperwork, and the Cadillac scrap form. He then went into the RMV computer system and entered my emissions exemption. The car's emission controls are evaluated as if it were *actually* a 1965 vehicle, which means it has no emission control requirement at all.

From the Motorist Assistance Center in Norwood I went back to Chris's to have the car reinspected in order to remove the emissions rejection sticker. In short order I had the real prize in this effort: an official inspection approval sticker affixed to the windshield!

So, was it all worth it? You bet! The Cobra has exceeded my expectations. It took a little getting used to: the power, the pedals being close together and offset to the outside, the shifter angle, how loud it is, and getting in and out! I pretty easily adjusted to them all though.....and the bottom line: it is a <u>blast</u> to drive!

I hope to see you on the road.



Getting the Blues

One of the reasons why I chose to buy my 2009 C6 was because of tech ... Bluetooth tech. In my research, I learned that the 2009 was the first year that Bluetooth was offered with the 3LT.

Sort of ... which I regrettably found out later.

Many of you know that I'm a musician. Music is huge for me. On the 4-hour train ride down to New Jersey to pick up my shiny Velocity Yellow, LS3, 2009 C6, I put together an epic Corvette playlist of music on my phone that would likely get me a speeding ticket or possibly arrested; songs like Sammy Hagar's "I Can't Drive 55!"

When the deal was done and I became the owner of "Sunna" I sat in the drivers seat and "paired" my phone with her. Sounds like a mating ritual. Once paired, I looked for the "Aux" Bluetooth selection to begin the epic soundtrack of my 4-hour journey home ... but could not find it.

I combed through the owner's manual (first time ever in my life), and only found the Bluetooth settings for phone calls. I kept looking because it couldn't have Bluetooth just for phone calls.

OMG, it wouldn't, right?

WRONG! Bluetooth was only for the phone!!

OK. Breathe! I'm prepared. I'm a tech. In my back pack, I carry tools and audio/video/computer cables (don't judge me). I have an 1/8" stereo audio jack cable to connect my phone to the car's 1/8" Aux jack. So I look for the Aux-in jack; it's not on the stereo, not in the glove; not in the console, not in the rear, and not on the brake calipers. I got desperate!

NO JACK!

The 3LT has the NAV. The 2LT base stereo has an Aux-in jack. The NAV ... does not! No Audio Bluetooth and no jack! In some GM engineer's small non-marketing brain, they decided it was best to remove a feature when they add a luxury feature.

So, I told you that story of woe, to tell you this ... you can add Bluetooth Audio to any car for about \$20! Hear that, GM?! I spent that 4-hour ride home with lowly FM but with the killer Bose Stereo and then discovered this easy \$20 solution once I got home.

Pictured is the Nulaxy Bluetooth Car Adapter on Amazon. There are many others but this is the one I bought and recommend. If you see some that look like they sit flush without the gooseneck, they won't work if your cigarette lighter is recessed like the C6.

To add Bluetooth to ANY car, all you need is an FM radio. Once the Nulaxy is paired with your phone (real easy), tune your FM radio to a preset station and the Bluetooth plays the audio over that FM station. There is no audio quality loss. When a call comes in, it automatically pauses the music and switches to the phone call on the FM station. Same with GPS navigation voice prompts.

This was the best \$20 I ever spent!

Well, maybe the best \$20 on a car!
