REQUEST TO PARISHIONERS

One should come to confession during the Great Fast and before approaching to receive the anointing with Unction on Holy and Great Wednesday, but if you live within forty miles of Brookwood, please do NOT leave your confession to Great Week. People living in the provinces will be gathering then and we have a shortage of priests. If you do live locally and have neglected to come to confession before the last day in Lent, then, out of consideration and love for others, leave taking your paschal Communion to later in the forty-day paschal period.
