#### THE HONORABLE JUDGE PAMELA ADDISON BARKER

**The Honorable Judge Pamela Addison Barker** of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, Eastern Division, is a 1975 graduate of James F. Rhodes High School. Judge Barker graduated from Kenyon College in 1979, with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science, with Honors, *magna cum laude* and Phil Beta Kappa. She obtained her law degree from the Ohio State University College of Law in 1982, and then returned to the Cleveland area where she practiced law for 28 years. During eleven of those years, she also worked as a part-time Mayor's Court Magistrate and Juvenile Diversion Magistrate for the City of Brecksville. In September of 2011, Judge Barker won her election to retain her seat on that bench, and in 2014 she was re-elected for a six year term. As one of 34 judges on the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, Judge Barker presided over felony criminal cases and civil matters with no dollar limit.

In September of 2017, Senator Rob Portman, joined by Senator Sherrod Brown, Recommended that President Trump nominate Judge Barker for an open seat on the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, Eastern Division. President Trump formally nominated her on April 23, 2018 and after a hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee, Judge Barker was confirmed by the Senate by a 91 to 5 vote in June of 2019. She has been serving in that capacity since then.



Judge Barker was inducted into the James F. Rhodes Hall of Fame in 2014. According to Judge Barker, it was such an honor for her. Judge Barker often states that she is a "proud product of the Cleveland public school system" and has a print of Rhodes High School proudly displayed in her office. Judge Barker and her husband of 36 years, Jeffery L. Barker, currently reside in Bay Village. They have two sons, Brandon and Jared, who live and work in the Cleveland area.

## **Congratulations to Rhodes Wrestling**

#### **2020 Senate League Champions!**

The Rhodes wrestling program has officially made a comeback. The programs earned a hard-fought victory to claim the 2020 Senate League Championship title, winning for the first time since 2017.

Head coach Anthony Carbone and assistant coach Julian Jackson-Ross have turned the program in the right direction. By the end of the 2019 season, there were only three wrestlers. This year, they developed into a full team of 16.

One unique element to this years team is the addition of a female wrestler, sophomore Angely Rivera. "Wrestling was the first time that I have felt like I was something. I joined because I love to fight, but I was noticed for my strength. The coaches didn't even see me as a girl. They matched me up with guys and tested me," said Rivera.

Rivera finished third at the Senate Championship. She was the only female in the League to place on a podium.

Sophomore Jumerious Hope, Senior Daniel Clark, and Sophomore Lavar Johnson all placed first in their weight classes at the Senate Championship. Edward Block, Tyler Bohanon, Derrick Hanning, Daniel Torres, Tristan Tompkins, and Messiah Loflis all placed second. Sender Morales and Joseph Lewis placed fourth.

Ram wrestlers will compete in the individual sectional tournament on Saturday, February 29 at St. Edwards High School. The tournament is the qualifier for advancing to the State Champion-ship.



### 2020 Hall of Fame Inductees

The Honorable Judge Anita Laster Mays—1982 The writer Peter Fedynsky—1969 JFR President and former Librarian: Cynthia Anzalone-Fox—1982 Posthumously: Band Director and Music Teacher Michael Zand

**Anita Laster Mays** graduated from James Ford Rhodes High School in 1982. She continued her education at the Ohio State University, where she majored in Accounting and Management Information Systems. After graduating in 1986, she began working as a management trainee at State Savings Bank. Two years later, she moved back to Cleveland to attend Cleveland Marshall College of Law, while working full-time as a Financial Systems Analyst at Metro Health Medical Center and part-time as a mediator for the City of Cleveland.

In 1992, her goal of becoming a lawyer was achieved. Following two years of private practice, she became an Assistant Cleveland Prosecutor and soon joined the Municipal Court's Domestic Violence Coordinating Council and the DUI Committee to enhance her legal abilities. In 1996 she joined the Clerk of Courts Office as Director of Operations for the Criminal Division, a position that placed her in charge of day-to-day operations over eight departments with a total of 105 employees. She won a seat on the Cleveland Municipal Court in 2003 by over 2,000 votes and was unopposed for re-election. Mays served as judge of the Greater Cleveland Drug Court for 6 years. Anita Laster Mays served Cleveland Municipal Court from January 1, 2004 to January

31, 2015. She was elected to 2014 and is currently serving in



the 8th District Court of Appeals in that office since 2015.

**Peter Fedynsky** graduated from James Ford Rhodes in 1969. He then attended Bowling Green State University as a German major and earned his Bachelor's Degree in Education in 1973. Peter later attended Harvard University, Kennedy School of Government—Ukrainian National Security Program in 1998.

Peter is fluent in English and Ukrainian and can also read and converse in both Russian and German. He was known on Ukrainian Radio as the "Voice of America" from 1978—1988 and it is still aired throughout the Ukraine. Peter also worked in various other radio and television projects both locally and internationally.

Peter has translated and interpreted many works with his most popular translation being the works of 19th century poet, Taras Shevchenko's poetry collection. His is the first ever complete translation of his entire collection, known as the "Kobzar." Peter retired In 2013.



**Michael Zand** left this world at the age of 81. He lived in Independence, Ohio and was the beloved husband of 52 years to Irene. He was the loving father of Robert and David and grandfather of Oliver, Lucy and Leo. Mr. Zand was a US Navy Veteran.

He served as an instrumental music teacher and band director and retired from James Ford Rhodes High School after 31 years serving the Cleveland Public Schools. Mr Zand loved playing his marimba with community bands and sought out music on family travels. He was a proud and active Beta Theta Pi brother and an avid builder and flyer of rubber-powered model airplanes. Mr. Zand started teaching a Rhodes in September 1967 and retired in June, 1994. He is remembered
