Jack Belcher from the Class of 1951 is a large supporter of the University Hospital and Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital as well as The Cleveland Clinic. Jack is a Trustee of our Alumni Association.

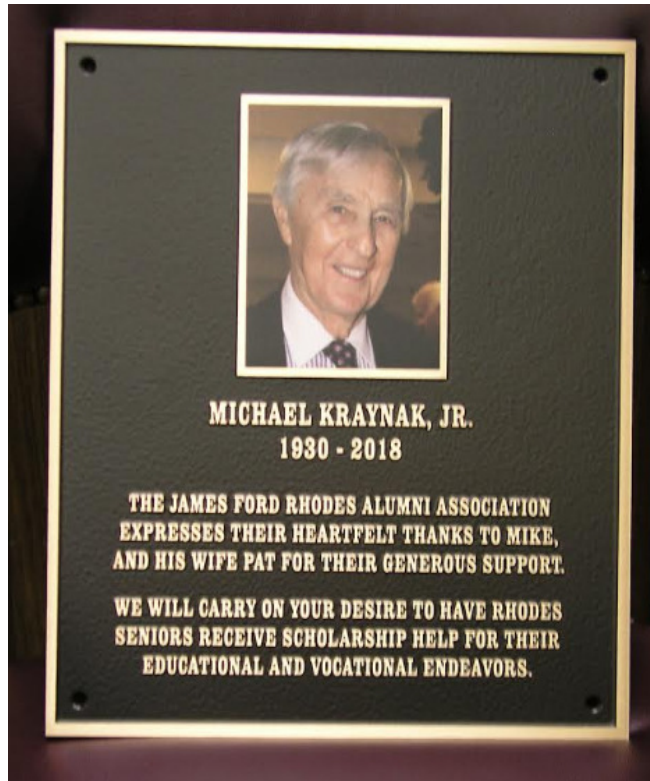
Coach Tyrone Owens who taught American Government and American History at James Ford Rhodes, He became Head Coach of the girls track team. In 1996 Tyrone started the Rhodes Alumni Association.

Nicole Antoinette Smith from the Class of 1988 where she was the Class President, Captain of the girls track team, girls basketball team and the girls volleyball team. She went on to work at several Fortune 500 companies and was also the author of 8 books. She was the first female student in the Cleveland Public Schools to receive a Division I athletic scholarship for basketball.

Coach Phillip Gary of Cleveland, Ohio was a teacher at Rhodes High School and began coaching football in 2003 and became assistant baseball coach two years later. Coach Gary was a Special Education Math teacher at Rhodes High School as well. Gary passed away from cancer on December 14, 2016. Posthumously: Coach Phillip Gary of Cleveland, Ohio.

Michael Zand—Instrumental Music Director for 31 years....

Michael Zand, age 81 of Independence passed away recently. Michael was a US Navy Veteran. He served as an **instrumental music teacher with the Cleveland Public Schools**, meeting his wife, Irene while at A.B. Hart Junior High School. Michael and retiring from **Rhodes High School** after 31 years. Michael loved playing his marimba with community bands and sought out music on family travels. He was a proud and active Beta Theta Pi brother and an avid builder and flyer of rubber-powered model airplanes.



Stephen Hawking's Peaceful Death

The name Stephen Hawking is no stranger to the science community, from his well known theories on black holes to the discovery of black hole radiation, dubbed "Hawking radiation". He lived a long 76 years up until March 14, 2018. His death was a shock to many. For most people they had lost their idol, a man who was highly intelligent and had a disability that affected his everyday life; for others, they were in amazement he was still alive prior to his death due to the ailment he had. Stephen Hawking's death was caused by Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), which he was diagnosed with at the age of 21. Most people diagnosed with ALS die within 2 to 5 years after the original diagnosis, but Stephen Hawking was a special case, living a whopping 55 years after his diagnosis with ALS. Hawking's family confirmed his death was peaceful and a funeral was held on March 31, 2018. Stephen Hawking was cremated rather than buried, and his ashes were sent to Westminster Abbey to be interred next to Sir Isaac Newton's grave. To the man nicknamed Einstein, may Stephen Hawking rest in peace.

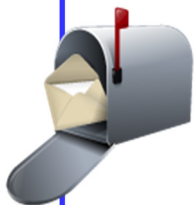

Walter Goldbach—passed away at age 88

RIP

Walter Goldbach was the artist who drew something when he was a 17 year old senior at Rhodes High School in Cleveland that would follow him, a city and its baseball team for the rest of his life. The year was 1946.

He didn't draw it to offend anyone. He drew it for his hometown team, the Cleveland Indians. He drew it with the passion and love he had for his hometown team.

His love affair with the team started in 1946 when the Indians owner Bill Veeck approached Goldbach's family business, J.F. Novak Co., off West 25th St. in Cleveland. He wanted the logo changed. They had a logo of an Indian chief in full headdress. He wanted a character drawing. Veeck asked for five or six different options. They selected Goldbach's idea. "They gave me free reign," he said.

Goldbach said he was happy that they still used his logo after 70 years. The original logo was changed a little bit. Originally, it had an orange face. They did away with that and made it red. They also took away the pony tail and straightened out the feather. He was worried they would alter the logo again. There is some pressure to make it more politically correct. Goldbach was always a little leery about them changing it because of the die hard fans who would get upset about it. "When somebody wants to buy a hat, they're going to want Chief Wahoo. That's part of history. History stays with you, no matter what."

Walter lived long enough to see his rendering, drawn with the enthusiasm and innocence of a high school student, become embroiled in the adult world of protests, racism and lawsuits

Former MLB Commissioner, Bud Selig always took a hands-off approach to the Chief Wahoo question, saying a decision to do something about the logo rested with the team. Rob Manfred, his successor, has been much more aggressive in trying to ban the logo.

My hope is that this year—70 years since the Cleveland Indians won the World Series—we will win it again and I will be thinking of this man and his love for his hometown team which was the **ONLY** reason behind the drawing of the famous—**Chief Wahoo!**

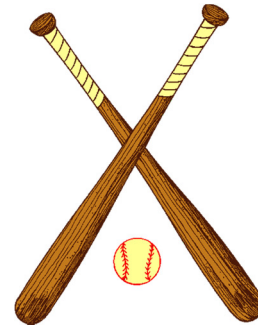
