

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER (B) April 14, 2024

Jesus said to [His disciples], "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead. You are witnesses of these things." Luke 24:46, 48

Just like a funeral, we are witnesses for the ONE who died!

All three readings mention the importance of the death of Christ. In Acts, the Apostle Peter tells the people, "The Author of life you put to death, but God raised Him from the dead. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away" Acts 3:15, 19. In the Second Reading, St. John states that in Jesus' death, "He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world" 1 John 2:2. Expiation, means to erase away the record, to

Explation, means to **erase** away the record, to make it as if it never occurred. We cannot explate our sins! In Luke's Gospel, "He [Jesus] opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead. You are witnesses of these things" Luke 24:46, 48.

I would like to use the analogy of a funeral; to illustrate the importance of following Jesus who died for our sins. When you go to a funeral at a church (or mortuary), everybody goes there for the one who died. Even when you are dressing for a funeral; you get dressed with the one who died on your mind. Sometimes the family members or the pallbearers will wear similar clothing for the one who died. When you are coming to a funeral, people in the car with you often talk about the one who died. When you arrive at the church, you will see and hear people in the parking lot talking about the one who died. When you come into the church, you may see people who you haven't seen in years. You may also see people you don't like, or folk who don't like you. You try not to let that bother you because you are both there for the one who died. You are not going to let anyone stop you from celebrating the one who died. You will sit in the pew, and tell strangers, sitting beside you, how close you were to the one who died. Why? Because you have a history with the one who died. The one who died put clothes on your back. The one who died raised you. The one who died got


you your first job. The choir may sing a song that was enjoyed by the one who died. When the minister gets up to preach, he says words about the one who died. At the end of the funeral, the casket is rolled out and the [active] pallbearers lift the one who died into the hearse. Jesus said, "If I be lifted up from the earth, I will draw all men unto me" John 12:32. If the one who died didn't mean that much to you, after the funeral, you will go home. However, if the one who died meant something to you; then you will go all the way to the cemetery. You and your family will line up behind the hearse that is carrying the one who died. Once you are in line, the funeral director walks to the cars and tells the drivers, "Cut your lights on". Why? So other folk not in the funeral procession would know that you are following the one who died. Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" Matthew 5:16. When you follow the one who died, you have an escort of officers. They will make a way for you. When you are following Jesus, the One who died, you will also have an escort service. "Surely Goodness and Mercy shall follow me all the days of my life" Psalms 23:6. Through this Easter Season, and far beyond, our purpose in life, is to follow the One who died, <>< Dcn. Jenkins Jesus, the Christ.


