

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

February 11, 2024

The leper said to Jesus, "If you wish, You can make me clean." Jesus said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean." Mark 1:38

A leper gives us a blueprint on how to approach Jesus!

As we approach **Ash Wednesday** and the season of **Lent**, we see how Jesus responded to a man who was both physically and spiritually unclean. **This leper illustrates for us how we ought to approach our Lord as sinners**, in need of forgiveness, and of being made clean.

- 1. The Leper approached Jesus in humility.
- "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble" James 4:6. As Christians we should never approach Jesus pridefully or haughtily. The leper was "kneeing" and "begged" Jesus to make him clean.
- **2.** The Leper came to Jesus in faith. He believed that Jesus could heal him! "You can make me clean" Mark 1:38. We should always come to Jesus with the mindset, that nothing is impossible for Him to do. (cf. Matthew 19:26).
- 3. The Leper was seeking to be helped. The Scriptures said, "A leper came to Jesus" Mark 1:38. Before a person can receive help, they must want and seek the help.
- **4.** The Leper personally experienced Jesus. He didn't come with a crowd. He came alone. You must come to a place where you encounter the Lord Jesus Christ for yourself!
- **5.** The Leper knew that he couldn't clean himself. He knew that he was powerless to get himself out of his situation.
- 6. The Leper wanted to be cleansed only if it was Jesus' will. The Leper said, "If you wish". Jesus said to him, "I do will". We should conclude all of our prayer requests, with these words, "If it's Your will Lord" (cf. Luke 22:42).

Years ago, while I was on a pilgrimage overseas, I entered my hotel room tired and weary from my journey. To my surprise, when I flipped the light switches on, nothing worked except the phone. I called downstairs. "Front desk, can I help you?", asked the receptionist. I explained to her that my

room was completely dark, and nothing was working. She asked for my room number, so I gave it to her. She asked, "Sir, do you have your card key in the Master slot"? "What is a Master slot?", I asked. She explained that the Master card slot was mounted on the left-hand side of the wall just as I entered the hotel room. She told me, "Nothing in your room will work sir, until you place your card key into the Master Card key slot." I inserted my card into the



Master slot and immediately everything worked. The room was bright and beautiful, which I hadn't noticed before, because it had been dark. Everything (electronically) was tied to that master card slot! I even told some others on the pilgrimage about it. When I removed my card from the Master card control, everything stopped working. The leper in today's Gospel knelt and placed his trust in the Master's Hand and he was immediately healed and made whole spiritually and physically. He was so amazed that he "began to publicize the whole matter" Mark 1:45. Our life should be connected to the Master. Do you have your key (your life) in the Hands of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ?


