St. Blaise February 3
 You may be familiar with the annual “blessing of throats” that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life. History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise’s command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived. Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer: *Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.*

When unable to receive Holy Communion, pray the prayer below:

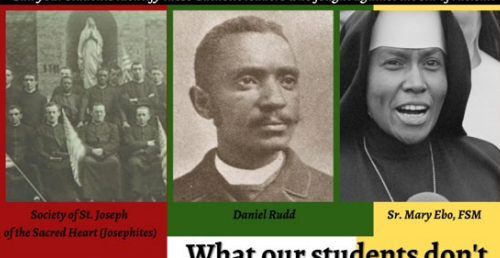
A Prayer for Spiritual Communion

Stewardship Reflection

That we may open our hearts to receive more fully all of God’s simple and abundant blessings. “Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties.” - 1 Corinthians 7:32 How much anxiety do we bring upon ourselves by constantly worrying about not having enough or attaining more things? God won’t necessarily give you everything you want, but He will provide everything you need. Try this – use the word “pray” instead of the word “worry” in the future. Then spend your time praying instead of worrying.

HE SAW THE BEST IN ME!

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches with authority, and casts out evil spirits. Why would He do it?

Because He saw the best in the congregation. The political or religious status of the audience did not matter. He looked past their faults and saw what they needed. They needed Him, the Word of God. The Gospel teaches us that we have the authority, through Baptism and obligation through the cross of Jesus Christ, to see the best in each other. The best in all of us is the image and likeness of God.

If we follow closely, the Gospel shows us that seeing the best in others comes from the authority of God Himself. That authority allows us to be channels for the compassion and love of Jesus Christ. Mark shows Jesus' abrupt entry into His public ministry. There was only one temple, but synagogues were widely scattered and devoted to prayer and the study of scripture. It was a sacred place where pious Jews gathered to worship on the Sabbath. It was the custom for the Synagogue leaders to invite learned men to speak and teach. Seeing the best in Capernaum Jesus He went immediately with His companions to the Synagogue and taught with authority on the Sabbath.




























Jesus saw the needs of the congregation in their best light. He showed them His best, as He is the Word of God. It was up to the congregation to see the best in Him. He did not teach like a local rabbi. He taught them as the Messiah, the Son of God, the fulfillment of the law. Jesus taught with personal authority of the Holy Spirit, that descended on Him at His baptism. Jesus is the Son of God and His authority comes from God. As Jesus said, "*He who has seen me has seen the Father*". Mark describes the impact of such authoritative teaching as Amazement. This term is a literary device of Mark to describe the state of mind of those who listened to the teachings of Jesus the Christ. We also have the authority of God the Father to see the presence of His image in others and invoke their amazement of His presence in them.

Seeing the best in others allows us to be channels for the compassion and love of Jesus Christ. Jesus saw the best in the man with unclean spirits, or demons who perhaps tried to embarrass Him. Jesus did not want His character to be revealed at this time in His ministry, but the demons recognized him as the Messiah, and called him the Holy One of God. We can hear that even the devil knows who God is and who bears His image. Jesus looked past the worst part of the man in the Synagogue and saw in him the image and likeness of God. With the same authority that He taught the scriptures, and with the love and compassion He would show from Calvary, He commanded and expelled the spirits from the man. He did not condemn the man for his demonic possession. He freed him in the presence of others (Mk 3:11-12).

The amazement of those present shows what happens when we look past the faults of others and see their needs. This is a challenge for us. We are so quick to make judgement and exercise our prejudices. But when we do see God's image and likeness in our brothers and sisters, God is glorified, and His kingdom is expanded. He saw the best in the people of Capernaum and in us. That is why we must see the best, the image of God, in others. Sometimes our differences create minor irritations. Other times they lead to major conflicts. If we choose to, our differences can also open our hearts and expand our horizons. It's all up to us.

In *Open Wide Our Hearts, A Pastoral Letter Against Racism*, of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (2018) they declared: "*Racism arises when—either consciously or unconsciously—a person holds that his or her own race or ethnicity is superior, and therefore judges' persons of other races or ethnicities as inferior and unworthy of equal regard.*" The document declared this conduct is sinful. It concluded with a call to conversion and that we strive to see the best in each other. The best in each of us; is the image of God, the creator, the love of Jesus Christ, and the peace of the Holy Spirit. God sees the best in us, we must see the best in others.

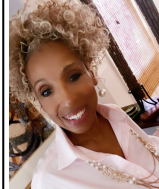
