

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT (B)

March 10, 2024

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "So must the Son Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life." John 3:14-15

Do you believe (cling to, trust in, and rely on) Jesus? That's our job!

In today's Second reading and the Gospel, we have the Plan of Salvation all laid out before us. St. Paul explained to the church in Ephesus, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8). In other words, it's by God's favor that we are saved and delivered from condemnation and made partakers of Christ's salvation through our faith. This Salvation is not of our own doing, but it is the gift of God. Our Salvation was not a result of what any one of us could do, so no one can pride themself in it or take credit for it.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus tells Nicodemus (who came to Jesus at night), "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. Whoever believes in Him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God" John 3:16-18. Jesus told this Pharisee leader and teacher that God so greatly loved the world that He gave up His only Son so that whoever believes in (trusts and relies on) Him shall not perish (come to destruction, be lost), but have eternal (everlasting) life. Jesus continued to explain that he who believes (trusts in, relies on) Him incurs no rejection or damnation. He who does not believe (rely on, trust in Him) has already been convicted. He is condemned for refusing to let his trust rest in Christ's name. (Cf. John 3:16-18 Amplified Bible) Some years ago I and about six other customers were waiting for shopping carts at the entrance of a grocery store. Someone must have gone inside and told the manager because he came outside and stood with his hands on his hips looking toward

the parking lot. Minutes later an attendant came pushing shopping carts back to the store. The parking lot was huge, so obviously it took him some time to bring the carts in. The manager, looking so disgusted at the subordinate, said to him, "Jonathan, you only have one job, and that's to bring the shopping carts in from the parking lot, back to the store; and you can't do



that right." Jonathan never said a word, he just pushed those carts back into the store for the waiting customers. I got my shopping cart and looked behind me and Jonathan was headed back to the parking lot for more shopping carts. After that day I never saw Jonathan again at that location. I don't know if the store fired him or he quit, but that image has stayed in my mind. When I stand and face Almighty God in judgment (cf. 2 Corinthians 5:10-11) I don't know what He will tell me. I don't want Him to say, "Jenkins, you had only one job on earth, and that was to believe in My Son Jesus Christ so you could have eternal life, and you couldn't do that right." What I want Him to say to me is, "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter into My Kingdom that I have prepared for you! (Cf. Matthew 25:23, John 14:2-3). <>> Dcn. Jenkins
