This year saw Dog A.I.D. working alongside Natural Instinct on their Crufts stand and promoting each other through social medias and communications.





I joined the Dog A.I.D. Trainer community in June 2021 just 6 months after retiring from my role as a Health and Safety professional with the world's leading logistics company.



We have recently had some fun, interactive and amazing interviews and talks given by our clients and their Assistance Dogs! Did you see any of



TRIBUTE TO LUCY WATTS MBE

On behalf of Dog Assistance in Disability (Dog A.I.D.), we are so sorry that Lucy Watts sadly passed away. Lucy had such an amazing bond and strong partnership with Molly, her Assistance Dog trained with Dog A.I.D., and was an inspiring Health and Disability Activist, who lived her short life to the full. The MBE was awarded in recognition of her extraordinary work and campaigning, and she was also honoured with other awards and an Honorary Master's Degree from the Open University.

Molly was bought in 2013 as an eight-week-old puppy to be Lucy's pet, and then was trained by her with support from a Dog A.I.D. volunteer trainer. Lucy wrote: "Molly came into my life at a time when I had nothing: no life, no purpose, no enjoyment, nothing. She came in and suddenly I had a reason to push myself really hard with physio and everything to sit up in my wheelchair more, which enabled me to walk and train her, take her to puppy classes, and to get out every day."

Molly also helped Lucy not to feel invisible anymore and she felt like part of society again, which she had not felt since she became disabled at the age of 14. Lucy wrote that by training Molly with Dog A.I.D., "not only was she my pet but she became my Assistance Dog, my helper, my carer. When she qualified in September 2016, it was like the world opened up".

Lucy and her beloved 'Molly Dog' raised so much awareness of the life-changing impact of Assistance Dogs. 'Molly, dog with a blog' was followed by thousands of people on social media, and Lucy's campaigning has made such a difference for Disabled people across the UK.

In paying tribute to Lucy on behalf of Dog A.I.D., Lynn Stacey, Trustee who has also trained her own Assistance Dog and supported others to do so, said:

"Lucy will be so sadly missed by her family, friends, and the Dog A.I.D. and wider Assistance Dog communities. Her partnership with 'Molly Dog' was remarkable and inspired so many people, she was a champion for Assistance Dogs and was such an effective health and disability campaigner, who lived life to the full and made such a difference to so many other lives."
