

Sterbridge April 19th 1859

Dear Aunt Mary & Amanda I set down to
answer your Letter I was glad to here from
your Clara she is very sick we have very hopes
of her getting any better she fails very fast
she had not ^{eat} any for 4 or 5 weeks she is
very poor she does not eat much of any thing
the Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away
and blessed be the Name of the Lord Deers
ant Mary you have got to be a very old Lady
you and I must soon go there for let us be
also ready for in such an our as we that not the
Sun of man cometh I feel very lonsome George
has gone back to York State dont your Letters
to Valatie N.Y it seems hard to part with
a blooming youth but the Lords will be done
and not mine the rest over is well as Common
Harret I is over to Abraham I & Marcy's been there
ever since Clara has been sick it is very stormy
to day the snow fell last Tuesday 3 feet deep
Clarra and Abby send love to you and all Remember
Clarras diting Love I send my love and best
Respects to you and all the rest Give my love
to mother and Johns family
