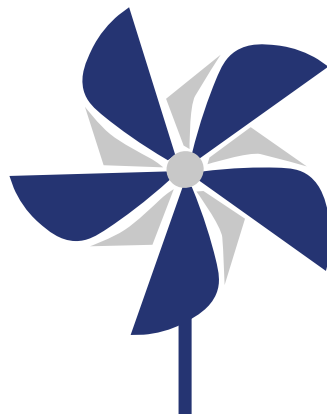

The Midlands District created a wonderful sightseeing video that brought the Columbia area to you. The Special Program, CSP and Advancement Areas chairs also did a fabulous job announcing the club winners. Additionally, we were able to complete some very important business matters. The Convention ended in our traditional way by awarding the Rose Mary Rivers, General Cup and Junior Cup awards, and by announcing the 2019 & 2020 Woman of Distinction and the 2019 & 2020 Volunteer of the Year. - Annual Raffle Registration (if applicable)
- Annual Raffle Financial Report (if applicable)

For the majority of our clubs, the Fiscal/Club Year end is at the end of April or May; re, club due dates would be September 15th or October 15, 2021.

The 123rd GFWC-SC Annual Convention Minutes April 24, 2021

The 123rd Annual Convention for the General Federation of Women's Clubs of South Carolina was held April 24, 2021, in Columbia, South Carolina via Zoom and with the Executive Committee at the Hilton Garden Inn. President Kristin Fields called the meeting to order at 10:09 am. The Inspiration and Memorial Service were presented by Linda Wagster, GFWC-SC Chaplain. The National Anthem was presented via a video presentation. Elizabeth Herring, Palmetto Woman's Club, conducted the Pledge of Allegiance via video. The Pledge to South Carolina was given by Kaye Gerrald, Chapin Woman's Club, by video. The Collect for Clubwomen and the National Pledge to Junior Clubwomen was presented in a video presentation by Midlands District Clubs. Recognition of Past Presidents and Introductions were given by Sylvia Ayers, Past President GFWC-SC. Courtney Evans, GFWC-SC presented the Preliminary Credentials Report (69 Voting, 15 Non-Voting, Total Attending 83). Bobbie Sox, Parliamentary Advisor, went over the Presentation of the Convention Rules and Procedures and they were adopted as presented. Kathie Walker Special Assistant to the President, Presented the Convention Program with corrections noted and the program was adopted as corrected. Juliet Casper Past President and Advisor of GFWC-SC conducted the Installation of 2020-2022 Officers. Kathie Walker and Carrie Zimmerman held the Wheel of Spins and award cash prizes to several lucky club members registered for convention. Pamme Eades, Midlands District President, presented door prizes.

At 10:52 am, the Credentials Report was given by Courtney Evans, Credentials Chair, which (71 Voting, 15 Non-Voting, Total Attending 86). At 10:55 am, admittance to the convention via Zoom was closed and in accordance with GFWC-SC By-Laws, elections were held at 11:00 a.m. GFWC-SC Secretary Kaye Jones read the Rules of Elections. President Kristin Fields presided over the elections. GFWC-SC Elections Committee Members Coastal District: Karen Lassiter, Woman's Club of Charleston, alternate Martha Brown Midlands District: Jackie Boland, Woman's Club of the Midlands, alternate Janet Prince Upstate District: Laura Palmer, Renaissance Woman's Club; alternate Karen Pack. Kaye Jones, GFWC-SC Secretary, read the letter of endorsement from the St. Andrews Woman's Club to nominate Laurie O'Kelly as a candidate for GFWC Southern Region Vice-President. This endorsement was unanimously approved. Upon completion of the elections, the Zoom portal was opened again to let any members in. The meeting resumed with the Reports from the officers. Kendall Spillman Coastal District, Pamme Eades Midlands District, and Dr. Misty Konow Upstate District presented their reports via Zoom. The meeting continued with reports from the following officers from the Hilton Garden via Zoom, Director of Junior Clubs Shelli Pue, and Treasurer Carrie Zimmerman. At 11:50 the convention broke from regular business and heard our Speaker Sharon Rikard from Doors of Freedom. Kathie Walker and Carrie Zimmerman again held the Wheel of Spins and award cash prizes to several lucky club members registered for convention. Pamme Eades, Midlands District President, presented door prizes. The convention broke for lunch at 12:21 pm. During the break, the convention was shown a video spotlighting the Midlands area presented by several members in the District. Convention reconvened at 12:38 pm. After the electricity at the hotel went out and came back on, the convention resumed with the rest of the Officers Reports Secretary Kaye Jones, Second Vice President Suzanne Carswell, First Vice President Norma England, and President Kristin Fields. Carrie Zimmerman provided the Treasurers Report.

Remarkable Paul Hayne Circle Ledger Survives for 125 Years

For members of the Paul Hayne Circle, the 19th Century and the 21st have connected in a beautiful and meaningful way. Former president Sandra Mattox was contacted by the owner of an antiques shop. As he unpacked a box of donated magazines, he discovered an old ledger. Intrigued, he dove into the contents to discern that it was the founding and early history of the Paul Hamilton Hayne Circle in Walhalla, organized on January 19, 1895. The ledger described, in lovely penmanship, the meetings of the club from that date through November 1900.

His web search located the Hayne Circle and its president and the treasured ledger was returned. Astonished, Sandra brought it to the last meeting of her administration and turned it over to incoming president Janet Smalley, who proposed that the Circle hear its stories during the next two years. And that is exactly what happened.

Though all members knew that Miss Ida McCullough was the first president, the ledger revealed that the founding meeting was held at Reverend J.D. McCullough's home, her father's house. Circle members laughed when learning that meetings were set on the same day and time as now: Wednesdays at 4:00 PM, though the Circle met weekly during its early years. The founding mission remains as today: a literary society seeking the self-improvement of its members. The constitution and bylaws were clear, with dues 5 cents for each meeting. Early fundraisers included readings, dramatic presentations, and strawberry cake sales. These funds and dues were then used to purchase books to establish a lending library for members. Eventually, this library morphed into one available to all residents. Imagine that. The women of the Paul Hayne Circle created the first lending library in Walhalla. That focus continues today, as the Circle has perennially supported The Oconee Friends of the Library and the Literary Legacy at Walhalla High School.

Attendance and punctuality were expected, and ladies failing expectations were admonished in the minutes. Notes also revealed that the organization was suspected by some "gentlemen" as being a "political group." With educational programs presented by members on great books, art, civilizations, and philosophers, perhaps there was a bit that reflected and influenced political thought.

Importantly, the ledger tells of the Circle's keen interest in joining the GFWC-SC by attending a meeting of the state group. Two members were elected to attend, but a sudden storm and washed out road prevented their attendance. Happily, the club was later federated in June 1898.

"That the ledger survived is amazing," remarked Janet Smalley. "That it found its way back to the Circle is beyond that. We are blessed." Under the leadership of current president Martha Murtiashaw, who serves on the SC Library Board, the ledger has been digitized and can be accessed through the state library system website.
