Dear Juniors,

But in the meantime, since we're right in the middle of some of the coldest months of the year, and as I write this I'm in the cool, rainy, blustery Northwest (where I don't think I've seen the sun for the last week and a half!) - Bring the outside in. Add green plants or a vase of fresh flowers to your decor; they supply oxygen, color and energy.
- Get active. Go for a walk (outside or on your treadmill), do jumping jacks, or pop in an exercise video. Exercising during the day may increase your levels of serotonin, a chemical in the brain that lifts your mood, says Lexie Pfetzing, coauthor of 60 Second Blues Busters
- Let in some light. Our biological clocks are set up to respond to sunlight patterns. Arrange your home to allow in more sunlight, such as opening the blinds or curtains.
- · Give yourself a present. Buy little gifts (bubble bath, pretty stationery) and wrap them. When you're feeling down, open one.
- · Indulge in dessert! Dark chocolate and bananas are rich in antioxidants and magnesium, which are believed to relieve stress. (Banana split, anyone?)
- Take a winter break. Embrace the cold weather by participating in a fun winter activity such as siding or ice-skating, or plan a long weekend getaway to a warmer climate.

I don't know about you, but I feel better already! I can see spring and GFWC-SC Convention just around the corner, so I'm off to find a Hershey's miniature dark chocolate bar (go easy with the dessert and don't forget to Take Care of YOU!)

The GFWC Special Projects, Public Policy and Advocacy Program recommends clubs "network with other groups advocating for similar issues and/or public policies." Consider networking with Columbia College in its efforts to improve the standard of living for South Carolina Women through its Alliance for Women. Support can be as simple as writing letters to representatives. By adding our voices to theirs, we may get more attention for our issues.

The following Alliance initiatives were introduced in the $116^{\rm th}$ General Assembly. The Alliance for Women would like to see them reintroduced in the $117^{\rm th}$ General Assembly. You can read

about them in the archives of the 116th (www.mysc.gov). They support GFWC President's Special Project, Domestic Violence Program, GFWC Resolution 015-550 Sexual Assault, p 115; GFWC Resolution 013-400 Prevention, Detection, Control, and Cure of Diseases, p. 56.





- 1. [State] S1009: Add criminal domestic violence of a high and aggravated nature to the list of grounds for divorce. (Referred to Committee on Judiciary)
- 2. [State] H 4300: Require the state to add both the Domestic Violence Hotline number and the national Sexual Assault Hotline number to the back of driver's licenses and personal identification cards. (Referred to Committee on Education and Public Works)
- 3. [State] H 4318 Require a convicted domestic violence offender to pay for the victim's medical costs if medical care is required as a result of the assault. (Referred to Committee on Judiciary)

Below is a new initiative. It supports GFWC Resolution 013-440 Reproductive Health Care, p. 58; GFWC Resolution 013-180 Health Care, p. 48; GFWC Resolution 013-170 Gynecologic Cancer, p. 39; GFWC Resolution 013-400 Prevention, Detection, Control, and Cure of Diseases, p. 56; and GFWC Home Life; Women's Health Program, Healthy Lifestyle.

1. [State TBD] Legislation to ensure insurance coverage for the new FDA-approved Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccine.

Walhalla Woman's Club Wear Red Dresses to Support Heart Awareness

To raise awareness about Women's Heart Health, "Ladies in Red" was the theme of the February 8 meeting of the Walhalla Woman's Club held at the home of Janet Smalley. The meal and program complimented the national campaign to inform women that heart disease has become the "silent killer" of women in the U.S.

The goal of the campaign is to assist women in making healthier lifestyle choices and to help them learn the warning signs of heart distress, which differ from those experienced by men. Women's symptoms include shortness of breath, often without chest pain of any kind; flu-like symptoms, to include nausea, clamminess or cold sweats; unexplained fatigue, weakness or dizziness; pain in the chest, upper back, shoulders, neck or jaw; and feelings of anxiety, loss of appetite or discomfort. Club members were provided a complete packet of information by one of the co-hosts, Lynn Morgan, who is a nurse. She was assisted in the meeting by Karen Lawrence, a pharmacist.

The ladies of the club enjoyed a healthy and virtually fat free supper of Toasted Almond Chicken Salad with Walnut and Raspberry Greens, and Hot Apple Crumble for dessert. These recipes were selected from the American Heart Association website which has dozens of great, healthy family recipes. The Walhalla Woman's Club encourages all families to learn more about heart disease and to accept the challenge of becoming "Heart Healthy."

Rededication of World War II Monument Jan W. Hadwin, Chairman

On November 10, 2006 The Woman's Club of Columbia rededicated their restored World War II monument fashioned of Winnsboro granite in a three tier style on Saluda Avenue in Five Points.

In 1946 the monument, a dream of Mrs. Benzie Rice of The Woman's Club of Columbia's Civic Department, took her proposal to the board of directors and they voted 100% to proceed. The monument was in memory of the young men from Richland County that gave the supreme sacrifice in World War II. She contacted the City of Columbia for approval of the site on Saluda Avenue and was granted permission. The actual dedication was on April 27, 1947. Gov. Strom Thurmond was the keynote speaker the monument was unveiled by two Gold Star sons, Richard "Ricky" LaRoque son of the late Major Richard LaRoque and Wilson "Buddy"Lynch son of the late Capt. Wilson Lynch.

With the revitalization of Five Points 2005-2007 the monument had to be relocated.

After many meetings and phone calls to City of Columbia officials they finally agreed to relocate across Blossom St. on Saluda Avenue from the present location. The monument was completely restored



by master monument artisan, Ron Clamp of Stone Crafters of Pelion-pro-bono. The Celebrate Freedom Foundation and the City of Columbia assisted with many aspects of the rededication by helping secure military personnel, footing for the monument, paved walkway, shrubs & tree. A five-piece brass quintet of the 282nd US Army Band attached to Fort Jackson rendered the National Anthem and Fox Company, 4th; LAR, US Marine Corp Reserve did the presentation of colors. The Woman's Club had a flag pole erected and landscape lighting so the flag would be illuminated 24/7. Two granite benches face the monument where visitors can sit in quiet reflection. The Woman's Club of Columbia provided bus service from The Woman's Club of Columbia's parking lot on Blossom Street for the 100 World War II veterans in attendance.

The Woman's Club of Columbia thanks the members of Palmetto Woman's Club in assisting the veterans off the buses and in getting them seated. Several husbands volunteered to help where needed which was appreciated.

The Woman's Club of Columbia invites all GFWC-SC members to visit the monument when you are in Columbia.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GFWC-SC BYLAWS

Article VII – OFFICERS, EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, EXECUTIVE BOARD, BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND BOARDS OF TRUSTEES

EXISTING BYLAW:

Section 3. The Executive Board of GFWC-SC shall consist of the State Officers, including the District Presidents. Additional members of the Executive Board shall include: the Corresponding Secretary, the Director-Elect of Junior Clubs, Department Chairman, Special Appointment Chairman, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the GFWC-SC Scholarship Fund, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Progress Foundation, Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, Chairman of the Credentials Committee, Chairman of the Finance Committee, Chairman of the Headquarters Committee, and Chairman of the Resolutions Committee.

Section 4: The Board of Directors of GFWC-SC shall consist of the State Officers, Past State Presidents who are residents of South Carolina, Department Chairman, Special Appointment Chairman, the Chairmen of the Boards of Trustees, Chairmen of Standing and Special Committees; also the Presidents of Clubs, either direct or affiliated, or their appointees.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Change Section 3 & Section 4, to a new Section 3:

Section 3. The Board of Directors of GFWC-SC shall consist of the Executive Committee, the District Presidents, the Corresponding Secretary, the Director-Elect of Junior Clubs, the Past State Presidents who are residents of South Carolina, Department Chairmen, Special Appointment Chairmen, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the GFWC-SC Scholarship Fund, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Progress Foundation, Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, Chairman of the Credentials Committee, Chairman of the Finance Committee, Chairman of the Headquarters Committee, Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, and the Presidents of Clubs, either direct or affiliated, or their appointees.

IF ADOPTED: The term Executive Board shall be removed from the title of this article and elsewhere in the bylaws shall be replaced with Board of Directors.

RATIONALE: This will bring the rules and practices of GFWC-SC in line with the rules and practices of GFWC-SC International.

ARTICLE XI - NOMINATIONS, ELECTIONS, AND VACANCIES

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 1. Paragraph 3. The Nominating Committee shall consist of one representative ... **PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Section 1. Paragraph 3.** The Elections Committee shall consist of one representative...

IF ADOPTED: All references in the Bylaws of the GFWC-SC position of the "Nominating Committee" would be changed to read "Elections Committee."

RATIONALE: Recommended by GFWC to more accurately reflect the duties of this Committee.

ARTICLE XIII - STANDING COMMITTEES

EXISTING BYLAW: None.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Section 5. Change Section 5 to Section 5 (A) and add Section 5 (B). to read

Section 5 (A): The existing Section 5.

Section 5 (B): An unlimited number of emeritus members may serve on the Headquarters Committee, for the purpose of assisting this Committee. They shall be recommended by the Headquarters Committee and confirmed at the next annual convention.

An emeritus member (1) must be an active member in good standing; (2) shall have served on the Headquarters Committee for at least six (6) years (need not be consecutive); (3) shall have no voting rights on the committee; and (4) shall be exempt from attending meetings of the Committee.

RATIONALE: Emeritus members are those who are retired from an active position on the committee. This allows these members, who meet
