Nancy K. Perry Children's Shelter

The Nancy K. Perry Children's Shelter mission is to provide nurturing, home-like, residential care to children of Lexington County who are victims of sexual or physical abuse, abandonment, neglect, exploitation or caregiver emergency. The Shelter is in its 34th year serving children of Lexington County, age birth to 18. It is a 501 c (3) organization which is supported by Lexington County, State Government, civic groups, religious organizations, and individuals. It operates twenty-four hours a day, year-round to care for and blend diverse children ages birth to eighteen years of age, in a family-like setting.

Palmetto Place Emergency Children's Shelter

Palmetto Place is a temporary shelter for abused, abandoned and neglected children of the Midlands area. It was founded in 1977 by the Junior Woman's Club of Columbia as a partial answer to the growing need for temporary placement for children who had been abused, abandoned, or neglected in some way. Palmetto Place has provided shelter for nearly 7,000 children in its 28-year history. Children from birth to 17 years of age are referred to Palmetto Place by law enforcement agencies and the Department of Social Services. During the 30-day case investigation and review process, the children are provided a secure and loving environment. At the end of their time at Palmetto Place, foster care or other appropriate placement is determined by family court.

Spartanburg Children Shelter

More than 25 years ago, the community of Spartanburg responded to the needs of abused, abandoned and neglected children by establishing the Spartanburg Children Shelter. The Shelter has been a temporary home to thousands of children. These special children arrive at the door any hour of the day or night during the week of any month. They are real children with real stories of abuse and neglect, but they always find a safe and happy place to live at the Shelter. In addition, in response to the needs of the Community, Faucette House was established for teen girls age 14-18 to aid in transitioning these young women into caring for themselves and starting their own lives as they become adults and become productive members of society. 



PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GFWC-SC BYLAWS

ARTICLE I-MEMBERSHIP

EXISTING BYLAW: None

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Section 12. Withdrawal. (A) Any club desiring to withdraw from the Federation shall submit a written resignation to the State President and the State Treasurer containing the minutes of the meeting at which the vote to withdraw took place. (B) If at least 5 or more members choose to remain a federated club, and they are willing to be the basic responsible officers of the club, they shall retain all the rights and privileges to the name and property of the club including funds, and they shall remain the federated club.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: Section 12. Withdrawal. (A) Any club desiring to withdraw from the Federation shall submit a written resignation to the State President and the State Treasurer containing the minutes of the meeting at which the vote to withdraw took place. (B) If a least 5 or more members choose to remain a federated club, and they are willing to be the basic officers of the club, they shall retain all the rights and privileges to the name and property of the club including funds, and they shall remain the federated club.

RATIONALE: To establish the process for club withdrawal from Federation membership.

ARTICLE II-DISTRICTS

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 2 (First Sentence) District Conferences shall be held annually in the fall.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: District Conferences shall be held annually in the summer or fall.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: District Conferences shall be held annually in the summer or fall.

RATIONALE: To comply with current practice for holding District Conferences.

ARTICLE III-JUNIOR CLUBS

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 3 (Last Sentence) She shall be endorsed by the Junior Nominating Committee and shall be voted on at a Junior meeting prior to Convention.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: She shall be endorsed by the Junior Nominating Committee and shall be voted on at a Junior meeting prior to Convention held in even numbered years.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: She shall be endorsed by the Junior Nominating Committee and shall be voted on at a Junior meeting prior to Convention held in even numbered years.

RATIONALE: For clarification as to the election of the Junior Director-elect.

ARTICLE XI-NOMINATIONS, ELECTIONS, AND VACANCIES

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 1. Nominations. (First Paragraph, First Sentence) All officers shall be elected biennially.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: All officers shall be elected biennially in even numbered years.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: All officers shall be elected biennially in even numbered years.

RATIONALE: For clarification as to the election of State Officers.

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 1. Nominations. (First Paragraph, Last Sentence) The Corresponding Secretary shall be appointed by the President, and shall be installed at the same time as other officers.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: The Corresponding Secretary shall be appointed by the President-elect, and shall be installed at the same time as other officers.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: The Corresponding Secretary shall be appointed by the President-elect, and shall be installed at the same time as other officers.

RATIONALE: For clarification as to how this position is filled.

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 1. Nominations. (Third Paragraph, Second Sentence) This representative and one alternate shall be elected in the odd number of calendar years at their respective District Conferences prior to Convention.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: This representative and one alternate shall be elected in the odd number of calendar years at their respective District Conferences prior to Convention and serve for one term.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: This representative and one alternate shall be elected in the odd number of calendar years at their respective District Conferences prior to Convention and serve for one term.

RATIONALE: For clarification as to length of term.

ARTICLE XV-REPRESENTATION

EXISTING BYLAW: Section 1. The voting body of the State Convention shall consist of the officers of the State Federation, Past Presidents of the State Federation, provided they are still residents of South Carolina, the members of the six Departments, Junior Department Chairmen, the Chairmen of Standing Committees and regularly accredited delegates from each club with affiliated or direct membership. All votes must be cast in person.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: The voting body of the State Convention shall consist of the State Officers, Past State Presidents who are residents of South Carolina, Department Chairmen, Special Appointment Chairmen, the Chairmen of the Boards of Trustees, Chairmen of Standing and Special Committees, and regularly accredited delegates from each club with affiliated or direct membership. All votes must be cast in person.

IF ADOPTED WILL READ: The voting body of the State Convention shall consist of the State Officers, Past State Presidents who are residents of South Carolina, Department Chairmen, Special Appointment Chairmen, the Chairmen of the Boards of Trustees, Chairmen of Standing and Special Committees, and regularly accredited delegates from each club with affiliated or direct membership. All votes must be cast in person.

RATIONALE: To conform language with Article VII, Section 4 and to conform with current practice.

STANDING RULES UP-DATES

The following Standing Rules were passed at Executive Board meetings during the 2002-2004 Administration. A completed copy of the Standing Rules will be provided for the Club Presidents Packet at the beginning of the 2006-2008 Administration.

- 1. The Annual Convention Restricted Fund will collect registration fees paid by attendees and pay (a) budgeted expenses of the convention, and (b) unbudgeted extraordinary expenses approved by the Convention Committee. Carryover funds will be limited to one year.
- 2. The Annual Convention Registration Cancellation Policy limits refunds to cancellation made seven days prior to the start of convention. Resale of tickets may be undertaken by clubs or individuals, but it is not the responsibility of the Registration Committee.
- 3. The 1511 Laurel Society is designated as a fund-raiser and all monies collected by the Society shall be deposited in the Headquarters checking account to defray the cost of restoration and repairs to Headquarters.
- 4. The GFWC-SC President shall have a minimum allowance of \$2000 each year of her administration with the primary allotment from the Endowment Fund, and any deficit paid from the General Fund.
