# !In Memory of Sharon (Townsend) Tschikota-Class 1965



It is with great sadness that the Alumni announces the passing of Sharon Tschikota on September 2, 2017 in Winnipeg. Many will remember Sharon as a wonderful, warm nursing colleague. Sharon had many roles: a teacher/ lecturer in the WGH/HSC SON and in the University of Manitoba/Health

Sciences Centre Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing Program; Class Advisor to WGH Class of 1973; a leader – as first year Coordinator in the HSC nursing education programs and with the Manitoba Association of Registered Nurses where she served first as a Voting member of the Eastman Region, then, as Representative on the Board and then, as the elected President of, first the Eastman Region of MARN, and then of MARN. She was a dedicated nurse who encouraged life-long nursing education and served as a mentor to many. Sharon also served as Education Convener on the Executive of the Alumni Assoc. Sharon will be missed and fondly remembered by all Alumni members who knew her.

◆ WGH/HSC ICU 50th Anniversary Celebration
On May 26, 2017 current and former staff gathered in the Annie Bond Room to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the

opening of the Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The ICU at the Winnipeg General Hospital (now HSC Winnipeg) officially opened on September 23,1966. It was considered one of the most advanced and modern Intensive Care Units in the world at that time. Fast forward 50 years, and

HSC Archives/Museum you'll find that view hasn't changed much. In addition to the Medical Intensive Care Unit / Coronary Care Unit, there are now several specialized intensive care units at

HSC, including Surgical Intensive Care, Intermediate Intensive Care, Pediatric Intensive Care, and Neonatal Intensive Care. All are committed to providing the best possible treatment for critically ill patients.

Guests enjoyed reminiscing and sharing stories about their unique experiences working in critical care.

Speakers included Darlene Foster, Class of 1958, HN in the first ICU, a five bed unit on GE2, who played a pivotal role in the planning of the ICU and worked with Dr. Rueben Cherniak; Dr. Luis Oppenheimer, Provincial Director of Patient Access, WRHA and a Professor in the Department of Surgery; Dr. Jodi Walker-Tweed, Critical Care Program Director, WRHA and Director of Patient Services, Critical Care; Kathy Hamelin, Vice-President, Nursing Alumni Association of WGH/HSC; Harvey Cramp, former Director

of Respiratory for HSC.

\* The Archives/Museum Collection Endowment Fund, balance as of September 1, 2017 was \$356,484.59. This Fund, created by the Alumni to support the Archives/Museum in perpetuity, is managed by the Health Sciences Centre Foundation. Thank you to all who have donated to this Fund through the ASK campaign or planned giving – whether via monthly or estate donations. For the last 5 years each Class celebrating a 5th year reunion was asked to support this Endowed Fund. This "ASK" campaign, now ended, generated just under \$20,000.00 for the Fund. In 2017 the HSC Archives/Museum received a grant of \$10,000.00 from the Archives/Museum Collection Endowed Fund in support of two special projects as determined collaboratively by the Alumni Association and the HSC Archives/Museum. This is the second grant the Endowed Fund has generated for projects within the archives. The first grant supported the ICU project which was completed in the spring of 2017.

#### The 2017-2018 projects are:

(A) "Remembering the Nursing Sisters" who were graduates of Winnipeg General Hospital and Children's Hospital Schools of Nursing who served during World War I." This project includes indepth research about the nursing sisters, creation of online content including pictures, diaries, etc. and artifacts. An online exhibit (like the ICU exhibit) that tells their story based on the research completed will also be created. This four month project will begin in January 2018. A Manitoba Heritage Grant was also received to support this project.

(B) Women's Hospital Legacy Display hiring a researcher/curator to complete comprehensive research about the history of the Women's Hospital and identify content from HSC Archives/ Museum, and possibly other sources, that could be digitized and included in an online thematic exhibit. Exhibit themes will be developed from input from a committee at Women's Hospital. This project is expected to begin in 2018. Additional funding is being sought to support the project. A Summary of the AGM Report by Karen Ashbury
The work of the HSC Archives/Museum falls into a number of
categories. These include standard archival work, answering
reference questions, various outreach activities and grant
writing initiatives.

In the 2016-2017 fiscal year, we received 153 acquisitions and answered 63 reference questions. Two of the reference questions related to World War I nurses who were graduates of WGH. Photos from our collection of Alfreda Attrill were published in Legion Magazine, and photos of Ada J. Ross were incorporated in a larger scale exhibit at the Legislative Assembly of Alberta called "Alberta and the Great War." This year's outreach initiatives included ten articles for HSC Focus about various historic events, and many "Heritage Window" exhibits which showcased various artifacts from the Archives/Museum. These included an exhibit about the Nurses' Swimming Pool and the story behind the donation of a WGH nursing doll.

We received a grant from the Young Canada Works Summer Student Program; this enabled us to hire Preeti Kaur, a Masters student going into her 2<sup>nd</sup> year of Archival Studies at U of M. The outcome of a Federal grant through the Documentary Heritage Communities Program is still pending. Two large exhibits undertaken this year included the *50th anniversary of the Ultrasound Department* and a celebration of the *50th Anniversary of the HSC ICUs*. The ICU project included the development of a panel display and an online interactive exhibit hosted by WordPress. Both exhibits drew on material in HSC Archives/Museum that showcased the history of critical care at HSC (see links to this). I would like to thank the WGH / HSC Alumni Association for their generous donation from the Endowment Fund, which helped facilitate this project.

Our Winnipeg Foundation Community Grant #20142047 for museum curatorial work in the HSC Archives Museum was complete as of Jan 21, 2016. A Museum Artifacts Collection Procedure Manual was developed and museum items received between 2010 – 2012 were catalogued.

# WGH/HSC Nurses' Alumni Education Committee Report: May 1, 2016 - April 30, 2017

The Education Committee met twice during the 2016-2017 year, in keeping with the decision to review Jane A. Malcolm (JAM) applications once per year in the fall and the Viola Leadlay (VL) applications twice yearly in spring and fall.

JAM Bursary and the VL Continuing Education Funds: The funds for the JAM bursary continue to be managed by the Winnipeg Foundation and the VL Continuing Education Fund continues to be managed by the HSC Foundation. During this period the Nurses' Alumni Association awarded a total amount of \$22,378.00 which included:

• \$20,609.00 awarded through the JAM Bursary Fund 1 Baccalaureate applicant and 2 Doctoral applicants

Recipients: Shelley André; Lanette Siragusa; Kristen Valeri • \$1769.00 awarded from the VL Continuing Education Fund. Recipients: Julie Halipchuck; Stephanie Thorarinson; Debbie Namaka; Rhonda Thorkelsson

The Education Committee has received many cards and notes of appreciation from recipients of both the JAM bursaries and the VL Continuing Education Fund.

## **Other Business:**

The values of the awards for the JAM Fund remain unchanged from last year: (Baccalaureate Degree - up to \$12,000; Master's Degree - up to \$20,000; Doctoral degree - up to \$25,000). The 2016 spending rate for JAM was 4.4% and has increased to 4.6% for 2017. As of Dec. 31, 2016, the market value for the JAM fund was \$820,689.37. The total capital received into the fund since inception is \$276,402.31. The WF always welcomes donations to the endowed fund. The current total in the VL Endowed fund \$153,051.17. A year-end report from the HSCF will be forwarded to the alumni. The availability of the Alumni's educational funds has been widely communicated throughout Manitoba. The terms of reference for the Education Committee were revised Nov. 2016. The VL and JAM application forms were reviewed and revised

April 2017. I would like to express my appreciation to the members of Education Committee, Marilyn Bruce, Cindy Boughen, Cindy Soulsby, Susan Finlay and Maureen MacDonald, for their continued support, commitment to the Alumni Assoc. and their ongoing interest in promoting professional development among our alumni. As of <u>December 31, 2016</u>, assets totaled **\$58,748**, total revenue was \$22,881, total expenses were \$20,326, and total GIC's were \$28,004.

Jane A. Malcolm Bursary Fund balance was \$841,264.71. As of November 15, 2017 revenue was \$25,716.72 and expenses were \$24,398.007. Revenue from memberships was \$925. General donations totaled \$675. The total value of our GICs at the end of 2017 is \$25,252.

We are dependent upon members to pay their annual dues and on donations from Alumni. As we age and have more Life Members we have less income. Memberships and donations are essential to our survival.
