THE ROAD TO MEMPHIS HAS BEGUN!

Winners will receive a sponsorship to offset costs of the IBC in Memphis Jan 16-20, 2024 and perform at our January 7, 2024 Blues Sunday show. We will be fund raising until they depart. Consider leaving a donation at the show or on line at the secure link.

This is a judged contest with knowledgeable judges from the Charlotte area.

They will be looking for the following

Blues Content: The sound and feel of the music should be true to any of blues sub-categories: traditional blues, country blues, soul blues, blues rock and/or contemporary blues. Judges will be listening for inspired and original song selections or new takes on blues standards. Creative reach is encouraged.

Originality: Original work is encouraged. Cover tunes are allowed but playing the recorded rendition lick by lick is discouraged, will not be looked upon favorably by the judges, and will be reflected in scoring.

Acts must indicate if their songs are their own original material (this can be done at the start of the set or before each song as appropriate) and/or identify the covers that they are playing and acknowledge the originator.

Vocals: The act's vocal skills to include concepts of tone, musicality, meaning, and expression. **Instrumental Talent:** Ability level on all instruments featured within the act.

Stage Presence: The ability to command the attention of the audience by the impressiveness of one's manner and appearance on stage. Judges will consider how an act connects with and engages the audience in the music. Proper use of microphones and amplification will be considered.

Audience reaction matters. Come out and support all our local Blues musicians. Clap, Cheer, Stomp your Feet, Dance.

"The Queen City Blues Kings"

The Queen City Blues Kings is a local blues band based out of Charlotte, NC and composed of a group of seasoned musicians influenced and versed in genres such as classic rock, honky-tonk, soul R&B, rockabilly and more. All shared a love of Blues. This four-piece group delivers a host of tasty guitar leads over a locked in and rolling rhythm section with gritty vocals and a side of moaning blues harp. QCBK will take a trip with original blues tunes in styles up and down the Mississippi, through Texas and out to the West Coast. So put on your high heel sneakers and throw that wig hat on your head. The joint will be jumping.

"The Knights of Soul"

The Knights of Soul (KOS) are, without a doubt, the best kept secret on the East Coast. Originally assembled as a Blues Band in 1993, the KOS took home first place at the Piedmont Blues Preservation Society's competition for unsigned bands and went to Memphis, Tennessee to compete against unsigned bands from around the country. A stellar appearance at the Memphis competition drew national attention for the band and has played on various stages for over 20 years. After the pandemic, the band started a new era and expanded their repertoire to include the perfect combination of Blues, Funk, Jazz, and Classic R&B. On stage, this union of styles creates the ultimate show setting for any festival, club, or private functions.

The band continues the class act they traditionally offer. The members of the KOS are respected musicians and vocalists relying on their talent and not from programmed or sequenced music. Here, you will find the real deal - a band who loves music!

"Red Dress Amy"

Born in Charlotte, and raised on blues and rock n' roll, Red Dress Amy brings a ton of energy to any stage they set foot on. The trio combines blues influences such as Philip Sayce and Cream, with rock performers such as The Black Keys and Black Pistol Fire to cultivate their own sound. The three piece is composed of Kevin Hamilton and a pair of Daltons. Dalton Johnson on drums and backing vocals together with Dalton Rowland on bass guitar provide a robust rhythm section needed to pair up with Hamilton's raspy vocal delivery and guitar tones. This sound is apparent with their newly released single "No Stranger" which has continued to showcase their live performances and ability to deliver their sound in front of an audience. With this in mind, RDA plans to release its second album this fall. "Mirage", the album name, was recorded live at The Evening Muse in Charlotte earlier in 2023 and contains a combination of current released material, while also including new previously unreleased tracks to further imprint the live sound that the band prefers.

"Mama and the Ruckus"

The Ruckus is led by Mama who writes songs about the trauma and pain that every person inevitably experiences in their lives. She sings these songs as a cry for hope, healing, and inspiration to others and you hear that in every single note that the band plays and that she sings. This intergenerational Roots project is based out of Asheville, NC and often features her daughter, McKinney, a dynamic singer/songwriter and musician with a powerful presence. There is another family connection between guitar player, Patrick French and his father, Rob on harmonica. Featuring original music that they hope will ignite healing, spread joy, and shine up your soul. With soaring guitars, wailing vocals, screaming harmonicas, and funky bass, keys, and drums, the Ruckus has a unique sound that will touch your heart and move your soul (and your feet too).

"Mojo Stomp"

Mojo Stomp formed in 2021, with Chad Butler on guitar and vocals, Jeremy Surratt on bass, and Scott Stewart on drums. Jeremy and Scott met years earlier when they were practicing in bands next door to each other. In the late 90's the three first played music together in the band *Orange*. Combining together added a varied rhythm section to Chad's bluesy guitar and voice. The band mostly prefers writing music together by improvising together to see what pans out, with Chad usually adding any lyrics later.

Chad was deeply influenced by blues quitarists like John Lee Hooker, Junior Kimbrough, and Lightning Hopkins. Scott grew up playing both rock and jazz and always loved the blues influence of Jimi Hendrix and SRV. Jeremy also had roots in both jazz and rock, and was influenced by the bass playing of Nathan East, Lee Sklar, and Geddy Lee.

Mojo Stomp went to Chris Mara in Nashville to record 'When the Dust Settles' in late 2022, released April 2023. Most of the music was captured playing live to tape. The entire album was recorded and mixed in a couple of days



capturing the raw energy of playing live. Our songs have been featured on internet radio shows in several countries and streamed from all the major music sites. The group looks forward to sharing more music and continuing to play live wherever people gather and can't wait to meet you at the next show!

Though he has played for years in 4-5 piece bands, now branching out to record long awaited original pieces as a duo is what's taken hold since they joined forces.

Born from the vibrant music scenes of Charlotte and Atlanta, the Southern Groove Machine is a dynamic musical force. 
