

Monticello—the top-of-the-mountain home of Thomas Jefferson from 1770 until his death in 1826, was beautifully and uniquely designed by Jefferson himself. An example of the Classical Revival type of architecture, the mansion is distinguished by many evidences of Jefferson's ingenuity.


There, near Charlottesville, Virginia, at the age of 33, Jefferson lived at the time he phrased The Declaration of Independence. It was also his home when he later directed the purchase of the Louisiana Territory in 1803; promoted the Lewis and Clark expedition, and favored the Embargo Act of 1807.

The Thomas Jefferson Memorial Association in 1923 bought and later restored Monticello. Today it is preserved as a national memorial and patriotic shrine.

USS MONTICELLO is the eighth of eight super Landing Ships Dock, of the THOMASTON (LSD 28-Class) built and being built by The Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation for the United States Navy. It is the third time in Naval history a ship has been named MONTICELLO and, by coincidence, Jefferson was the third President of the United States.

The first ship to carry the name USS steamer MONTICELLO served with the Union Fleet during the Civil War from 1861-65. The USS MONTICELLO (AP-61) was the second vessel so named, the former Italian Passenger Liner SS Conte Grande. As the Monticello, she was a troop transport ship.




## THE COMMISSIONING CEREMONY

The commissioning ceremony of a new Navy ship is the official birthday of her naval career. The ceremony involves the acceptance of the ship by the Secretary of the Navy, or his designated representative, as being built to his satisfaction and ready to be commissioned. The ship, having thus become a part of the U. S. Navy, is turned over to the designated representative of the Secretary of the Navy and by his order, is placed in commission. After this order is given, the National Anthem is played as the Commission Pennant and Union Jack are run up simultaneously to the masthead when the Ensign is broken. The Commanding Officer then assumes command of the ship, promulgates the ship's organization and orders, and sets the first watch. A crew of naval officers and men assume responsibility for her safekeeping and for the accomplishment of her naval mission in peace and war, during her commissioned life.


## THE MISSION OF AN LSD

The primary mission of an LSD is to transport combat loaded boats, craft, vehicles and tanks to be landed on early assault waves on enemy beaches. In addition to 350 troop billets, the ship also possesses facilities for accommodating several troop-cargo carrying assault helicopters. She has a capacity for emergency hull damage repairs to landing craft and ships to LSM size, as well as large patrol sea planes. Its armament, electronics, and speed make it the top performer in the Amphibious Forces. Its versatility and efficiency embracing a multitude of amphibious tasks make this class ship very much in demand by the Fleet, the Army, the Marine Corps and the Sea Transportation Service.
